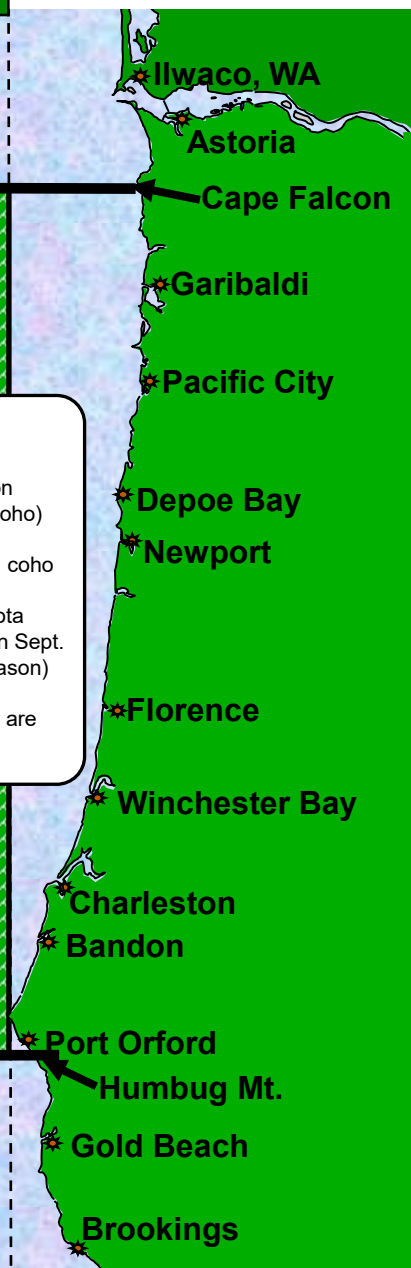


2024 Oregon Ocean Recreational Salmon Seasons

Mar Apr May June July Aug Sept Oct



Leadbetter Pt. to Cape Falcon
 Open for All Salmon
 (Mark-selective coho)
 2 salmon; but no more than 1 Chinook
 Coho Quota = 39,900 fin-clipped coho
 Chinook Guideline = 12,510
 June 22-**Aug. 11, Aug. 19-22, and Sept. 4**
 Sept. 30

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.
 All Salmon Except Coho
 No Quota
 March 15-Oct. 31
 In October the fishery is only open shoreward of the 40-fathom management line

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.
 Open for All Salmon
 (Mark-selective coho)
 Cape Falcon to OR/CA Border
 Quota = 45,000 fin-clipped coho
 June 15 – Aug. 18

Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt.
 Open for All Salmon
 (Non-mark-selective coho)
 Quota = 25,000 **30,700** coho
 Sept. 1-**15** 30 or quota
 (open days of the week in Sept. may be adjusted in-season)
 All days in September are open for Chinook

Humbug Mt. to OR/CA Border
 Chinook open May 16-Aug. 31
 Mark-selective coho open June 15-Aug 4
 No quota for Chinook
 Cape Falcon to OR/CA Quota = 45,000 fin-clipped coho

- All salmon, 2 per day only 1 may be a Chinook. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. Columbia River Control Zone closed to all salmon fishing.
- All salmon except coho, 2 per day. Beginning October 1, only open shoreward of the 40-fathom management line.
- All salmon, 2 per day. All coho must have a healed adipose fin clip. A portion of any remaining coho quota may be rolled forward to the September non-mark selective coho season on an impact neutral basis.
- All salmon, 2 per day. Open for all salmon (no fin-clip restriction on retained coho).

Other Regulations:

- 1) In the Stonewall Bank Yelloweye Rockfish Cons. Area, salmon fishing is limited to trolling on open "all depth halibut" days.
- 2) No more than 2 single point barbless hooks and one line when fishing for salmon or when a salmon is on board.
- 3) Minimum lengths: Chinook – 22" N. of Falcon and 24" S. of Falcon, coho – 16", steelhead – 20"; no size restriction for pink, chum, or sockeye salmon.
- 4) All salmon caught between Humbug Mt. and the OR/CA Border must be landed into the State of Oregon.
