MDMR Administrative Penalties

Failure to Report Spotted Seatrout Landings

Investigation

- Sales receipts provided by Alabama Marine Resources Division revealed thousands of pounds of Spotted Seatrout sold in Alabama that were never reported on Mississippi Trip Tickets during the spring commercial season
- The sales receipts indicated Mississippi licensed commercial fisherman were selling their own catch directly to Alabama dealers

Update

- Marine Patrol interviewed the fisherman to investigate non-compliance.
- Interviews resulted in an additional 28,663 pounds of Spotted Seatrout submitted to the Mississippi Trip Ticket Program
- Currently 1,290 pounds of Spotted Seatrout still non-reported

- Billy Stork sold 2,079 lbs of Spotted Seatrout to PJ's Seafood in Coden, Alabama between February 1, 2018 and April 27, 2018.
- As of May 15, 2018, Billy Stork had reported 260 lbs of Spotted Seatrout on Mississippi Trip Tickets.
- Upon learning of the investigation Billy Stork late reported 1,819 lbs.

Administrative Penalty

- Fine in the amount of \$1,819.00 within 45 days, if necessary
- Legal counsel may establish a six-month payment plan

- **Location:** The Back Bay of Biloxi at 578 Bayview Avenue in Biloxi, Harrison County, MS.
- **Use District:** (I) Industrial Use District
- **Agent:** Seymour Engineering
- **Project Purpose/Need:** Reconfigure the existing Sherman Canaan Commercial Harbor to:
 - Provide a more stable docking facility
 - Reduce collision and maintenance costs
 - Mitigate impacts from storms
 - Provide a safer work environment for mariners to service their vessels, and
 - Develop the area into a working waterfront shoreline

Project Description

- **Six variances to the Guidelines for Regulated Activities**
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.A.2.**
 - “To minimize the necessity of dredging, docks and piers shall be of sufficient length to reach navigational depths adequate for the proposed use of the dock or pier.”
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.C.1.**
 - “Marinas and boatslips shall be located in areas where minimal initial and maintenance dredging will be required.”
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.C.3.**
 - “Marinas . . . shall not be located in areas containing submerged or regularly flooded emergent vegetation.”
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.D.3.**
 - “Vertical face structures shall be aligned no further waterward than mean high tide, and constructed so that reflective wave energy does not destroy adjacent wetlands habitat.”
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.O.1.**
 - “Permanent filling of coastal wetlands because of adverse and cumulative environmental impacts is discouraged.”
 - **Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part III.O.2.**
 - “Areas containing submerged vegetation or regularly flooded emergent vegetation shall not be filled.”

- **Each variance request was justified under Ch. VIII, Sect. 2, Part I.E.2.c.iii. and iv.**
 - **No feasible alternative sites or construction techniques are available**
 - **There is significant public benefit in the activity**
 - **A public hearing will be held**
 - **The activity requires a waterfront location**

Public and Agency Notification

- Notification of this project appeared in *The Sun Herald* on September 23, September 30, and October 7, 2018.
 - No public comments were received
- A public hearing was held on Tuesday, October 9, 2018 at 5:30 p.m. in the Auditorium of the Bolton State Building located at 1141 Bayview Avenue in Biloxi, Mississippi.
 - No public comments were received
- MS DEQ: No comments
- MS DAH: No objections
- MS SOS: The project will require a tidelands lease
- MS DWFP: The Loggerhead turtle (*Caretta caretta*) and the Kemps Ridley turtle (*Lepidochelys kempii*) have been documented within 2 miles of the project area. They recommended an SAV survey and preemptive trawling be conducted and concluded if best management practices are utilized then the project likely poses no threat to listed species or their habitats.

Recommendation

- **The staff of the Department of Marine Resources has conducted a thorough evaluation of the project and has made findings on the decision factors in accordance with Chapter VIII, Section 2, Part I.E.2. of the Mississippi Coastal Program (MCP). These findings have been provided to the Commissioners. Based on the results of these findings, it has been determined that the project is consistent with the MCP because it will have a significant public benefit. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission approve the requested variances and issue a Permit.**

Public Affairs – October 2018

The MS Department of Marine Resources was mentioned 32 times in local, state and national media since the August CMR meeting. Popular news items included previous director, Bill Walker, and the airmen who went missing on the Tchoutacabouffa River.

So far in FY19, Marine Patrol has taught six boat and water safety classes and certified 106 students. Marine Patrol also participated in National Estuaries Day at the Grand Bay NERR, the National Night Out Expo in Hancock County and Career on Wheels at Pass Road Elementary in Gulfport.

Our agency also participated in various events in the community. Kevin Landry and Tammy Reese in Oyster Aquaculture took part in Science Career Day at Pass Road Elementary and Marty Jones in Fisheries took part in College and Career Day at West Harrison High School.

The FDA issued an “In Compliance” rating to the MDMR Seafood Technology Bureau’s inspection of the seafood processing industry. This is the tenth year in a row that this positive rating has been achieved by the bureau and serves as a testament to their dedication and hard work to ensure safe seafood products for the public.

NOAA’s Phytoplankton Monitoring Network was here October 11 and 12 in our Fisheries Lab updating staff on the latest information regarding Phytoplankton Monitoring, which is crucial to our detection and preparedness for Harmful Algal Blooms.

Finfish Scientist Wade Hardy participated in the U.S. Coast Guard Area Committee Meeting on October 10 at the Grand Bay NERR, hosted by the Mobile Sector. Pollution preparedness, oil spill research and post-hurricane response are several of the important topics for our agency.

The Seafood Technology Bureau taught the Basic Sanitation Control course with 17 students representing our seafood industry and partners.

Lastly, Fisheries did a great job with the Jimmy Sanders Memorial Lionfish Challenge, which recently concluded with Todd Cospelich as the all-around winner. The Challenge honored DMR’s Jimmy Sanders, who initiated the event and passed away prematurely this year. Jimmy was devoted to eradicating invasive Lionfish which would eventually endanger the offshore reefs he worked to deploy, enhance and maintain.

The Mississippi Commercial Fisheries United, Inc. ("MSCFU") hereby submits public comment on the matter of a Notice of Intent approved by the Mississippi Commission on Marine Resources ("Commission") and filed with the Mississippi Secretary of State on August 30, 2018 regarding Title 22, Part 20, Chapter 21, Section 105, and add Section 105, that would allow the Commission to revoke regulatory program requirements, such as but not limited to endorsements, tags, permits, or similar provisions for violations related to that program.

The Mississippi Commercial Fisheries United supports the revocation of fishing endorsements, tags, or permits for bad actors in all sectors of Mississippi's saltwater fisheries; however, we recommend that the Commission consider adopting additional language to the proposed regulation to ensure that only violations directly related to the regulatory program that revocations are sought are included and clearly articulated. MSCFU argues that the current language of the proposed regulation is vague and gives the Commission broad discretionary powers that could be used for political purposes.



Section 110

Beginning January 1, 2019 individuals commercially harvesting Spotted Seatrout (*Cynoscion nebulosus*) for sale must possess a Spotted Seatrout endorsement (\$10.00) in addition to a current applicable harvester's license. To qualify for this endorsement an application must be completed. The fisher must present proof that five thousand dollars (\$5000.00) of seafood product was sold in any twelve (12) consecutive months. Proof would be copies of sales records and a copy of the applicable harvester's license for the appropriate time period, or the fisher must present proof that ten (10) percent of their net income came from commercial fishing activities in a previous tax year. Proof would be a form provided by the DMR completed by a licensed tax preparer possessing a PTIN (Preparer Tax Identification Number), notarized, and submitted to the department. For the 2019 fishing season the fisher must present documentation that a minimum of twenty (20) percent of their taxable income came from commercial fishing activities in a previous tax year between 2013-2018. Documentation shall be a copy of the appropriate filed IRS tax form showing the applicant's taxable income for one of those years. A Marine Fisheries Trip Ticket officer will then run a sales summary for the year chosen using trip tickets to determine if the eligibility requirement has been met. This endorsement will be valid for a ~~three~~ one-year period at which time a new application with qualifying documents must for the previous tax year shall be submitted for a new endorsement. ~~The income requirement and seafood sale provision of this section shall cease to be in effect April 30, 2020 unless further Commission action is taken to extend the requirement.~~ The endorsement will be valid from January 1st - December 31st each year. In the event of a hardship approved by the Commission, the Department may consider qualifying documents for the two years prior to the onset of the hardship

Background

- In the past year, CMR has inquired about the viability of using an electronic reporting program to monitor Spotted Seatrout recreational landings in Mississippi waters.
- In the August meeting, CMR passed a motion for staff to provide information regarding this subject at the October meeting.
- This presentation will outline the potential use of electronic reporting in the Spotted Seatrout fishery and provide alternatives for consideration.

Electronic Reporting for Spotted Seatrout

- Red Snapper

- Small population of anglers (~ 2,500 anglers)
- Limited season (< 100 days)
- Single mode (Boat anglers)
- Localized habitat
- Enforceable
- Statistically-sound validation procedure

- Spotted Seatrout

- Large population of anglers (~ 80,000 anglers)
- Open year round
- Multi-mode (Boat and Shore anglers)
- Large amount of diverse habitat
- Difficult to enforce
- Currently no feasible validation procedure in place

Spotted Seatrout Survey Needs

- Survey needs to provide a better estimate of recreational spotted seatrout fishing effort
 - MRIP currently gathers accurate data on catch metrics for the fishery
- Survey needs to provide an effort estimate from all fishing modes (shore, ramp, charter)

Spotted Seatrout Monitoring Options

- A mandatory reporting program for the entire recreational fishery – this option is difficult to enforce and would be very difficult to implement.
- For large angler populations, a survey based approach is the most practical to estimate harvest.
- There are multiple options for survey based approaches

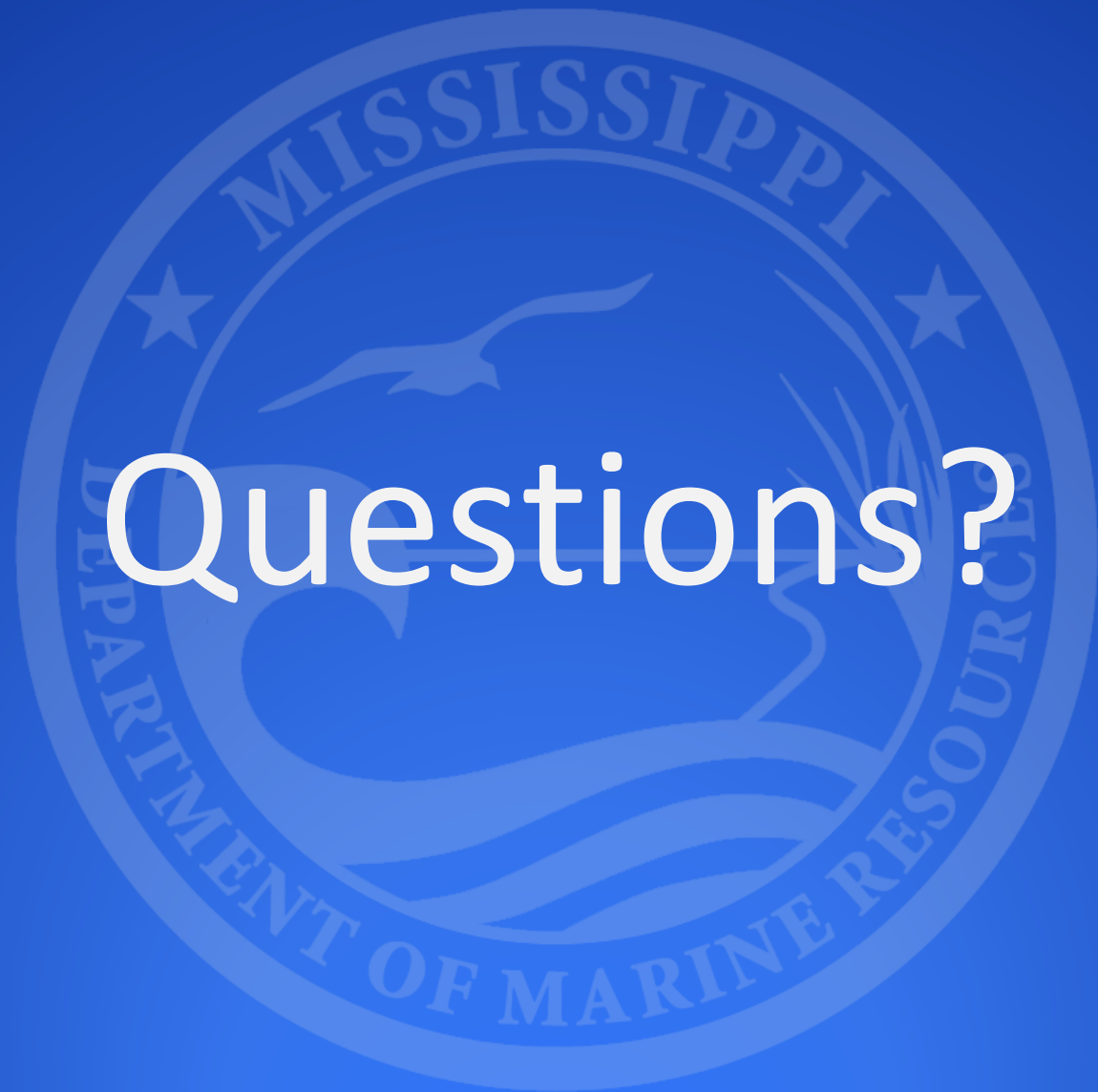
