LYNDON STATE FOREST

Welcome Visitors

Lyndon State Forest was acquired in 1912 and was one of our first State Forests. The parcel was purchased to demonstrate methods for managing blowing sands associated with the barren open space of Lyndon. This involved the planting of various species of softwood trees and sand binding grasses. Many of the larger trees on the parcel were planted in that year. Forests, Parks and Recreation has conducted a number of timber harvests on the forest and most of the forest that is present is the result of natural regeneration from the plantation trees. The goal of the original project was to stop the blowing sand and this project is a success.

Forests, Parks and Recreation has harvested over 1.2 million board feet of sawtimber off this 74 acres. This is enough lumber to frame 125 average (1,500 square foot) homes. All that volume was part of the original planting which took place in 1912.

Trails

The trails at Lyndon State Forest are managed with support from the Kingdom Trails Association, Town of Lyndon and a number of local volunteers. The trails are designed for beginner and intermediate mountain bike riders. The soils on the forest are suitable for early and late season riding. Even though these are designed as bike trails they are available for all users of the public land. Please enjoy your visit.

Trails-


- * Yield. Yield. Yield. To pedestrians and uphill bike traffic.
