

By working together in creative new ways we have the power to bring greater visibility to these critical issues, to build new knowledge, and to translate that knowledge into the practice and policy efforts that are essential to driving real, lasting, and transformative social change. If you're a social work student—at any level or program—there are many ways you can be a part of solving the Grand Challenges! Here are just a few ideas:

- Visit the website and get familiar with the 13 Grand Challenges.
- Ask around at your school find out which faculty are working on topics that fall under one or more of the challenges. Find out how you can be involved in that work,
- Do your field education/ practicum learning in an area related to the Grand Challenges.
- Seek out other students/new collaborators in groups or activities on campus connected to one or more Grand Challenges topics.
- Reach out to the Grand Challenge network leaders if you have an idea to share. Ask how you can get involved.
- Host an #Up4theChallenge event on your campus or in your class to raise awareness about one or more of the Grand Challenges, or the initiative as a whole.

- Create your own Grand Challenge discussion group or brown bag lunch series.
 Ask a network leader to speak to the group via videoconference (or in-person if feasible).
- Build an interdisciplinary coalition of students from a variety of schools on campus centered on one or more Grand Challenge.
- Explore ways to raise awareness about a particular Grand Challenge in your field placement. Share network publications, websites or other resources.
- Help spread the word about the Grand Challenges! Write an article for your school newspaper. Post information about your or others' Grand Challenge-related work on social media using: #Up4theChallenge.
