In October 2016, the NCAA Division I Board of Directors and Board of Governors approved distribution of portion of revenue to membership based on academic achievement of student-athletes.

Distribution based on NCAA's Turner/CBS media contract future increases.

Distribution to conferences will begin in 2019-20.

No restrictions on how institutions use revenue.

Conference policies/bylaws relevant to distributions will apply.

Institution has to meet <u>one</u> of the following criteria:

APR

Division I Academic
Progress Rate for
previous year is equal
to or greater than
985. Average of single
year scores for all
teams.

GSR

Graduation Success
Rate for most recently
available year is equal
to or greater than 90
percent based on the
single-year rate of all
student-athletes at the
individual level.

FGR

Difference between
SA and student body
rates for most
recently published
Federal Graduation
Rate is equal to or
greater than 13
percentage points.
