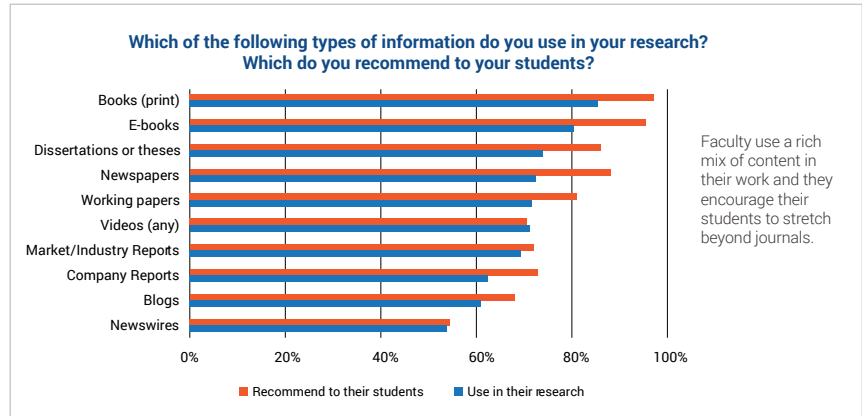

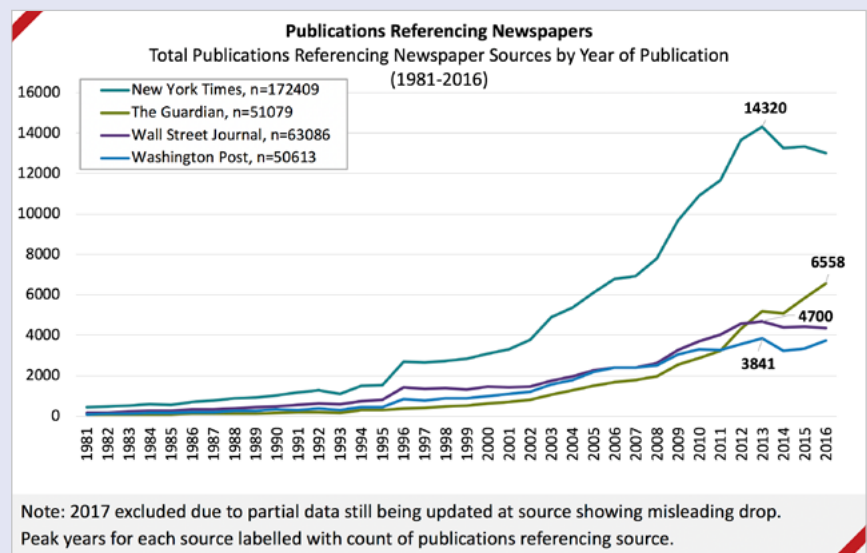

Newspapers are on the rise in scholarly research

A 2018 Oxford Internet Institute/ProQuest study found that the use of newspapers in scholarly research is steadily increasing, and reached an all-time high in 2013. For each newspaper analyzed, uses were much higher across disciplines than anticipated—including the social sciences, health and medicine, business and the hard sciences.
