**ORDER REGARDING DILIGENT
INQUIRY AND NOTICE**

The court reviewed the petitioner’s affidavit of diligent inquiry and considered whether the petitioner diligently inquired into the whereabouts of the absent spouse. The court finds that:

The petitioner has not diligently inquired into the whereabouts of the absent spouse. The petitioner must complete these additional steps as part of the diligent inquiry:

The petitioner has diligently inquired into the whereabouts of the absent spouse.

Posting on the Court’s Website.

Clerk. The court clerk must issue a *Notice to Absent Spouse* (form DR-220), distribute a copy of the notice with this order to the petitioner, and post the notice on the court system’s website for four consecutive weeks. The court will issue a certificate and send it to the petitioner when posting is complete.

Petitioner. Before the last week of posting, the petitioner must send the absent spouse a copy of the *Notice to Absent Spouse* (form DR-220) and the *Petition for Dissolution of Marriage* (form DR-200) by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested and postage prepaid **and** by regular first-class mail. The notice must be addressed in care of the absent spouse’s residence or the place where the absent spouse usually receives mail.

Other Posting Required. Petitioner must do the following public notice:

(1) Before the last week of posting, the petitioner must send the absent spouse a copy of the *Notice to Absent Spouse* (form DR-220) and the *Petition for Dissolution of Marriage* (form DR-200) by registered or certified mail with return receipt requested and postage prepaid **and** by regular first-class mail. The notice must be addressed in care of the absent spouse’s residence or the place where the absent spouse usually receives mail.

(2) After completing step (1), the petitioner must complete *Proof of Notice* (form DR-225, available at ak-courts.info/dr225), get it notarized, and file it with the court. The form must include the case number that the court clerk assigned to your petition.
