The respondent is mentally ill, because: "Mental illness" means an organic, mental, or emotional impairment that has substantial adverse effects on a person's ability to exercise conscious control of their actions or ability to perceive reality or to reason or understand; intellectual disability, developmental disability, epilepsy, drug addiction, and alcoholism do not per se constitute mental illness, although persons suffering from these conditions may also be suffering from mental illness. AS 47.30.915. 2. As a result of being mentally ill, the respondent is: Likely to cause serious harm to the respondent's self, because: Likely to cause serious harm to others because: "Likely to cause serious harm" means a person who (A) poses a substantial risk of bodily harm to that person's self, as manifested by recent behavior causing, attempting, or threatening that harm; (B) poses a substantial risk of harm to others as manifested by recent behavior causing, attempting, or threatening harm, and is likely in the near future to cause physical injury, physical abuse, or substantial property damage to another person; or (C) manifests a current intent to carry out plans of serious harm to that person's self or another. AS 47.30.915. \square Gravely disabled under \square AS 47.30.915(11)(A), \square AS 47.30.915(11)(B), and the respondent's mental condition could improve with treatment, because: "Gravely disabled" means a condition in which a person as a result of mental illness (A) is in danger of physical harm arising from such complete neglect of basic needs for food, clothing, shelter, or personal safety as to render serious accident,

illness, or death highly probable if care by another is not taken; or (B) is so incapacitated that the person is incapable of

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surviving safely in freedom. AS 47.30.915.
