<sup>1</sup> If the testator has died, the will has become a public record and the original cannot be returned. Once the clerk's office confirms the testator has died, the will becomes a public document and can be inspected by anyone. The clerk will also send a copy of the will to the personal representative (the person who ensures the will is followed after the testator's death).
