1.	Call to Order/Approve Minutes	 Meeting called to order at 1:05 pm Minutes were approved without revision.
2.	President's Report	 Dr. Monday provided the update. 3 items to share with the senate body today, Have a good update on Project Accelerate which contains certain components to move or accelerate our Growth at the University of Kentucky. They were presented at the October Board of Trustees meeting.

- How do we think about ways to think about King's Daughters and the weights on our healthcare system. How do we think about additional healthcare needs for the Commonwealth? How do we think about working with the KCTCS System to strengthen the partnerships of more students?
- Employee Recruitment and Retention
 - How do we think about finishing that RHR Initiative that you know so well.
 - How do we think about future projects around our benefits and other things that we need to do differently or more aggressively, to recruit, to hire, to retain our employees?
- More Responsiveness
 - How do we think about our policies and our procedures to be nimbler, to be able to accelerate, to move faster than we are today?
- Updated the executive committees- Staff Senate Executive Committee, University Senate and will update the Student Government Association later in February. At the same time, they will provide an update on our legislative session.
- All 5 groups Will be presenting at the BOT meeting in two weeks.
- Legislative Session
 - The House budget has been moved to the Senate. There was a difference between the governor's budget and the house budget. We are seeing an inflationary increase of around 4% and that's a great thing, think of it in terms of \$10 million. If you're looking at performance funding, the house is also increasing that by 4% which could leave about \$1 million. On the Capital side we are going to see some more asset preservation, or we have paid feedback for projects like the Whitehall Classroom Building, for projects like Pence Hall. Taking our exiting facilities and improving them, preserving them as well. That's where we are right now on the operating and capital side. I would say, probably in one of the best positions we've been institutionally.
 - There are DEI Bills coming from both the House and the Senate.
 There is also a tenure bill being debated. Our team is monitoring hundreds of other bills. There is a hearing that is still going on one of those DEI bills. There is a lot of conversation and discussion around that.
 - The President continues to tell our story of our belief system that's evidenced in our strategic plan about our DEI efforts, and why that is important. And as we think about taking care of our people, and about advancing our Commonwealth, we will continue to do that, continue to advocate and to continue to tell the story of the University. We're monitoring them closely, and we look forward to giving an update to the shared governance groups later in the month of February.
- Consistent with one of those groups in Project Accelerate, our benefits optimization project is off and running. Premise is not to lose or add

3. Trustee Report	Dave Melanson provided the update. Hope everyone is well. Happy February. Always good to hear from him regarding legislative questions. They are happy to answer questions as needed. The team does a great job representing us and telling our story. BOT hasn't met since the last Senate Meeting; they are meeting in 2 weeks and will have a bigger update in March after the BOT meeting. Question: T. Keys: Clarification on the dates for the BOT Meeting D. Melanson: February 22-23 T. Keys: unsure how we can help and advocate. Don't feel that we are asked to be a part of the process. How can we personally reach out if we feel strongly about the DEI bills and how we love working here the way it is now. How do we relay that information without violating any rules, etc. D. Melanson: We've grappled with this since the beginning. Government relations answer – the only people who can talk on behalf of the University is the President or those who are designated by the president. The team lead by Mark Hardin – they go on a daily basis and meet with our leadership to coordinator our efforts. We know what's being said/shared, etc. Really important to have a singular concise message. As a regular taxpayer in the commonwealth of KY, if you choose you want to send a message to your legislature – but DO NOT say you're from/work at UK. Don't use university resources, don't use UK letterhead, do not use UK phone lines, etc. Don't use anything related to UK when you are reaching out. T. Keys: How can we be supportive of the University's mission and the people who are speaking on behalf of UK. How to be a helpful body/resource. D. Melanson: The government relations committee is very good at reaching out to those who need to be consulted to help with them. Maybe re-engage with the governmental relations team and maybe hear what the legislative goals are, etc.

	 J. Sumner: Board Meeting – has the board talked recently about live streaming the sessions for accessibility. D. Melanson: will reach out and ask. P. Gibson: What about being an employee of UK and campaigning on campus? Don't think there's a rule that bans us from saying we are from UK. But there's someone in our government that says they work for UK. D. Melanson: We need to be careful when speaking that we are not speaking on behalf of the institution. What you can say, he is not sure. Just make it abundantly clear that we are not lobbying on behalf of UK and not speaking on behalf of the institution. P. Gibson: e.g., if you're running for office and you're asked where you work, you can say you work at UK. D. Melanson: we have one spokesperson and 1 lobbyist for UK. Remember you get into some awesome UK events – you and a guest – Gymnastics is rated #3 in the country, baseball, softball, etc.
4. Guest Speakers:	 Federal Work Study Program – David Taylor T. Keys: Does this have anything to do with the new FAFSA Forms? Hear that there is lots of turmoil with the FAFSA Forms. D. Taylor: There are some changes – are not allowed to indicate whether they want to opt in or out. If eligible we try to promote the FWS. Don't think it will be an issue with our office and role. T. Keys: What are the criteria for being eligible? D. Taylor: taxes, etc. those who have a need – low social economic status. Lots of items are factored into the ability to be eligible for FWS. Vice Chair Chafin will share the slides from the presentation after the main body session.

6.	Consent agenda approved unanimously. Pulled reports: Bylaws, Community Outreach, IFRA, PAC Bylaws: K. Hahn Item 1: Mike Adams has created a guide for writing resolutions. We haven't written a resolution this year, but in previous years we have and the process has not always been smooth. Senator Adams has written a very helpful guide. The document was uploaded to the Teams Channel this afternoon and we are going to find a place for it to live. M. Adams: we can be a voice through resolutions from the body. Resolutions are a way to share an opinion/voice of the body. Item 2: The Bylaws committee may bring forth to the senate body some bylaws and SOP Changes. The four that the committee has been working on are: Reducing the voting requirements for the Officers, except for the Chair. Voting for the officers would be 50.1% of the quorum. The voting requirement of the Chair would stay at 50.1% of the whole Senate Body. Changing the voting meeting to elect officers from May to April Changing the term of the chair to 2 years with 2 consecutive term limits. Brought forth last year and didn't pass. Must wait until the beginning of the next fiscal year to be brought again to the body.
