#### STORY LINES

##### FOOTBALL FACES KENTUCKY ON MILITARY APPRECIATION DAY

- University of Missouri football returns to Faurot Field on Saturday, Nov. 5, 2022 to face No. 24 Kentucky on Military Appreciation Day. The game kicks off at 11 a.m. CT and airs on SEC Network and the Tiger Radio Network.
- Saturday marks the 13th meeting in a series which dates to 1965. Kentucky leads 8-4 all-time with Mizzou's 20-10 win in Columbia 2020 snapping a five-game UK streak. The Wildcats won a close one in Lexington a year ago, 35-28.

##### LAST TIME OUT: MIZZOU

- Three long first-half drives, another stout performance by the defense, and two second-half field goals by Harrison Mevis sent Mizzou to a 23-10 victory over No. 25 South Carolina.
- The Tigers retained the Mayor's Cup for the fourth-straight year in the Battle for Columbia.
- In the first half, quarterback Brady Cook directed drives of 96, 84 and 72 yards to get the Tigers out to a 17-0 lead. He scored the first touchdown on a three-yard run. On the second drive, he completed a 57-yard pass to Dominic Lovett that led to a one-yard TD plunge by Cody Schrader, and Lovett opened the third drive with a 21-yard catch-and-run and Cook gained 23 yards on a third down that led to a 20-yard field goal by Mevis.
- The Gamecocks closed the score to 17-10 in the third quarter, but Missouri came right back. A 34-yard pass down the right sideline to Lovett put Mevis in position for a 50-yard field goal extending his MU record to 10 FGs of 50 yards or more. Lovett had career highs with 10 receptions for 148 yards.
- The Tigers defense then stopped South Carolina for losses on three straight plays, the third a 9-yard sack by Isaiah McGuire, and after a punt, Cook hit Schrader for a 29-yard gain that set up another Mevis field goal, this one from 32 yards. McGuire got another sack to stop the Gamecocks' next possession, and then Missouri ran clock with a drive on which Schrader carried 10 straight times for 39 yards. Schrader finished the game with 81 yards on 22 carries.
- Dreyden Norwood snuffed South Carolina's last gasp with a pass interception of Rattler near midfield.
- Missouri outgained South Carolina 367 yards to 203, with just 99 of the Gamecocks' yards coming in the second half. MU outrushed USC, 143-32. The Mizzou defense recorded 11 tackles for loss, including four QB sacks, broke up four passes and forced two turnovers.
- Cook completed 17-of-24 passes for 224 yards and rushed 11 times for 53 yards.

##### LAST TIME OUT: KENTUCKY

- Chris Rodriguez Jr. rushed 15 times for 64 yards and a touchdown but No. 3 Tennessee beat No. 19 Kentucky 44-6 at Neyland Stadium.
- Kentucky fell behind early and never caught up against the high-powered Tennessee offense.
- Linebacker D'Eryk Jackson led the Wildcats with a career-high 14 tackles, including four solo stops. Defensive back Jordan Lovett had a career-high eight total tackles, second-most on the team in the game.

##### AROUND THE LEAGUE

- The Tigers' defensive unit ranks third in total defense, allowing 310.1 yards per game. MU's rush defense ranks fourth, giving up 114.9 yards per game.
- Dominic Lovett leads the league in receptions per game (5.6) and receptions (45) while ranking second in yards per game (82.4) and third in receiving yards (659).
- Linebacker Ty'Ron Hopper ranks second in tackles for loss (10.5) and TFL per game (1.3).
- DB Ennis Rakestraw Jr.'s three forced fumbles is tied with three others for the SEC lead.
- Kicker Harrison Mevis' leads the SEC with 15 field goals made and his 16 points scored against Georgia is the highest output by a player in the SEC this year.

**FIELD ACCESS (NON-PHOTO/VIDEO)**

- Pre-game field access for non-photo/video personnel begins 90 minutes out and ends at 15:00 prior to kickoff.
- Non-photo/video personnel can access the field with 5:00 left in the fourth quarter but must get back to the 3rd floor concourse SW corner to access the post-game press conference.

**FIELD ACCESS (PHOTO/VIDEO)**

- Photographers and videographers are required to wear disposable vests. Vests are distributed at Media Will Call located at TAPS (opens two hours out).
- The on-field photo/video work room is located in the SW corner/tunnel of Memorial Stadium / Faurot Field.
- Field access for photo/video personnel with professional camera equipment in hand begins 90 minutes out. One shooter per media outlet allowed on the field. Tripods are prohibited. Storage for equipment is available in the field-level photo/video work room.
- All on-field photographers and videographers must remain outside of the team boxes at all times.
- Pre-game stand-ups are allowed in stadium with prior approval and only in the north concourse. In- and post-game stand-ups on the field and in the stadium are prohibited. Those wishing to do in- and post-game stand-ups should find a location outside of the stadium.

**POST-GAME INTERVIEW PROCEDURES**

- In-game interviews are prohibited. Post-game interviews on the field are prohibited.
- Post-game interviews with Mizzou head coach Eliah Drinkwitz and student-athletes will be held in SEZ defensive meeting room following a brief cooling-off period.
- The SEZ defensive meeting room is available for set-up post-game only. Access to the space prior to 00:00 is prohibited.
- With 2:00 left in the 4th quarter, Mizzou Strat Comm staff will meet in the SW corner on the third floor concourse by the Centene Corporation sign to escort media to the press conference. Those on the field need to get to the 3rd floor SW corner to access the post-game press conference. A staffer will direct the group in when the clock hits 0:00.
- Visiting team post-game media availability is at the direction of the visiting communications staff. The visiting team post-game interview room is in the SE corner tunnel (labeled 020), across from the visiting locker room.

**STORY LINES**

**FIRST SNAPS**

• First Division I snaps in 2022 include: Luther Burden III (WR), LJ Hewitt (DB), Tyler Jones (DB), Armand Membou (OL), Mekhi Miller (WR), Jack Stonehouse (P) and Ja'Marion Wayne (DB).

**MCGUIRE SNAGS SEC HONOR**

• DL Isaiah McGuire was tabbed as the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week following the win at South Carolina.  
 • McGuire tied his career bests with three tackles for a loss and two sacks, finishing the game with five total stops. As a team, the Tigers had 11 TFLs and four sacks, holding the Gamecocks to 104 yards in the first half.

**RANKED ROAD DUB**

• By knocking off No. 25 South Carolina 23-10, Mizzou registered its first win over a ranked opponent since defeating No. 17 LSU, 45-41, in 2020.  
 • The ranked victory on the road is the first since 2018 when they defeated No. 13 Florida, 38-17, in Gainesville.

**DEATH ROW DEFENSE**

• Mizzou's defense under first-year DC Blake Baker has been on the nation's top turn-around stories in 2022.  
 • The Tigers are allowing just 310.6 yards per game, the 19th-best mark nationally.  
 • That is a marked improvement from 2021's bunch that allowed 434.7 yards per game, ranking 106th in FBS.  
 • The 87-place improvement ranks second nationally, trailing only Virginia (+90) which ranked 121st in 2021 and has moved to 31st in 2022.  
 • Mizzou has seen a vast improvement in almost every defensive category from a season ago:

- o Points Allowed: **+83**
  - 2021: 113
  - 2022: 30
- o Rushing Yards Allowed: **+97**
  - 2021: 124
  - 2022: 27
- o Yards Per Carry Allowed: **+80**
  - 2021: 116
  - 2022: 36
- o Passing Yards Allowed: **+2**
  - 2021: 30
  - 2022: 28
- o Yards Per Play Allowed: **+89**
  - 2021: 113
  - 2022: 24
- o Total Defense: **+87**
  - 2021: 106
  - 2022: 19
- o Third Down Defense %: **+95**
  - 2021: 109
  - 2022: 14

• Looking at the numbers above in the major defensive categories, that is an average improvement of 76.1 places nationally from a year ago.  
 • If you take out passing defense (teams didn't pass against Mizzou last year because they didn't need to) from the categories above, Mizzou is an incredible average of 88.5 places better nationally than they were a year ago in those major defensive stat categories.  
 • Mizzou is doing all of this with largely the same core group of players as a season ago, returning eight starters from 2021.

**FEELS AT FAUROT**

• 60,618 were in attendance for Oct. 22's Homecoming win vs. Vandy, the largest crowd at Faurot during head coach Elijah Drinkwitz's tenure.  
 • 58,165 loud and proud Tiger fans filled Faurot Field on October 1. At the time, it was Missouri's largest crowd since 2019 (vs. Ole Miss, Homecoming).

**KA-DEFENSE**

• Vanderbilt's leading receiver, Will Sheppard, who came into the game with eight receiving touchdowns on the season – was targeted 15 times, but covered mostly by Kris Abrams-Draine, he caught just three passes for 28 yards. Abrams-Draine had five tackles and broke up three passes – two of them in the end zone. In all, Mizzou defenders broke up 10 passes and held Vanderbilt to 49 percent passing.  
 • Mizzou's pass defense held Vanderbilt's quarterbacks to a 49 percent completion rate, marking the second time an opposing team has completed less than half its passes against the Tigers this year.

**LOOKIN' AT LUTHER**

• In the 17-14 Homecoming win vs. Vanderbilt, Luther Burden III – the SEC Freshman of the Week – scored both of Mizzou's touchdowns with a 35-yard reception and a 10-yard rush in the first half.  
 • With his two scores, Burden becomes the first true freshman Tiger to score multiple TDs in multiple games since Damarea Crockett in 2016.  
 • He totaled a career-high 66 receiving yards on four receptions and one carry for 10 yards vs. the Commodores.  
 • Burden's five touchdowns - two receiving, two rushing, one punt return - on the year are the most for a true freshman since Larry Rountree scored six times in 2017. He's the only FBS player to accomplish the feat this season.

**DROB GETS IT DONE**

• With 1:23 to play, and 3rd-and-11, Vandy tight end Ben Bresnahan caught a pass from quarterback Mike Wright that at first was ruled a first down at the MU 43-yard line. But after video review, he was ruled short of the first down and on fourth down and less than a yard to go, Darius Robinson stopped running back Ray Davis for no gain. Missouri then ran out the clock to secure the win.  
 • Mizzou's defense held Vanderbilt to just 120 yards in the first half. The Tigers' run defense limited the Commodores to 57 rushing yards, the second-lowest total of the season (8 vs. Louisiana Tech) and marks the third time an opponent has been held under 100 yards on the ground in 2022.

**AIR IT OUT**

• Five Tigers have double digit receptions and have hit the century mark in total yards through eight games: Dominic Lovett (45, 659), Luther Burden III (24, 185), Barrett Banister (17, 192), Mookie Cooper (16, 181) and Tauskie Dove (10, 147)/  
 • Mizzou has had at least six receivers haul in a reception through eight games:  
 at South Carolina - seven different receivers  
 vs. Vanderbilt - eight different receivers  
 at Florida - eight different receivers  
 vs. Georgia - seven different receivers  
 at Auburn - six different receivers  
 vs. ACU - seven different receivers  
 at K State - seven different receivers  
 vs. LA Tech - nine different receivers

**STORY LINES**

**JACK ATTACK**

- Jack Stonehouse took over punt duties vs. ACU. He punted twice on the day, neither of which were returnable, including a 53 yarder and a touchback.
- At Auburn, he punted eight times for an average of 48 yards, booting three over 50 yards, including 60- and 68-yard punts while dropping five inside the 20.
- Stonehouse’s 68-yard punt - tied for No. 14 nationally - is the longest by a Tiger since Corey Fatoney booted a 69-yard punt in the 2018 Liberty Bowl against Oklahoma State.
- On the season, he totals 27 punts for 1,165 yards and an average of 43.1 yards per punt. He’s landed eight inside the 20 and five have gone for 50+ yards.

**IN THE THICC OF IT**

- Harrison Mevis is 15-of-20 on the season, including 4-of-4 from 40-49 and 4-of-5 from 50+. He’s connected on all 20 point-after attempts.
- In the Homecoming win over Vandy, he knocked through a 38-yard field goal to close the first half, tying him with Grant Ressel for fourth on Mizzou’s all-time career field goals list with 52.
- Against then-No. 1 Georgia, he hit 5-of-5 field goals, including two from 40+ and two from 50+. His final make of the game was a 56-yarder – the national leader – that matched his career long from the 2021 Boston College game.
- Also against the Bulldogs, he became the first Mizzou kicker to make four 40+-yard attempts in a single game. He’s the only Tiger to accomplish five made field goals in a game twice, and one of four to do it at all.
- Against ACU, he nailed a 52 yarder in the fourth quarter vs. ACU, the seventh 50-yard field goal of his career. He surpassed Tom Whelihan (1984-87) for sole possession of the top spot on Mizzou’s all-time career 50-yard field goals list.

**LATEST FROM LOVETT**

- Dominic Lovett led the Tigers in receiving in the first five games of the season, the only Tiger to accomplish that feat in the modern era (since 1958).
  - He leads the SEC in receptions per game (5.6) and receptions (45) while ranking second in yards per game (82.4) and third in receiving yards (659).
- Lovett had a career day at South Carolina, hauling in 10 catches for 148 yards, setting career bests in both categories. His 148 yards marks the third time he’s reached triple digits in receiving yards this season. It was the most yards by a Mizzou receiver since Jonathan Johnson racked up 185 yards in the 2018 Liberty Bowl against Oklahoma State.
- At Auburn, Lovett racked up 102 receiving yards on the Auburn defense. He is the first Mizzou player to have consecutive 100-yard receiving performances since Emanuel Hall in the first two games of 2018.
  - Against Abilene Christian, Lovett hauled in his first career receiving touchdown on a 79-yard dot from Brady Cook, MU’s longest play from scrimmage since Drew Lock connected with Johnathon Johnson for an 85-yard score in the 2018 Liberty Bowl against Oklahoma State.
  - Lovett finished with seven receptions for 132 yards. He tacked on his second touchdown of the day on a 13-yard score in the waning moments of the third quarter.

**HOP TO IT**

- Through eight games, Ty/Ron Hopper totals 47 tackles, 10.5 tackles for a loss of 31 yards, including two sacks for 15 yards, and one interception for 15 yards.
- Against LA Tech, he snagged the first interception of his career in his first game in Black and Gold.

**WELCOME WILLIAMS**

- A transfer from Oregon, Kristian Williams earned the first start of his career vs. Abilene Christian. He also got the nod at DT at Auburn and vs. Georgia.
- Williams recorded his first career sack with a loss of two yards on Auburn’s Robby Ashford.

**COOPER’S CATCHING UP**

- Sophomore Mookie Cooper has turned it on in the last five games, totaling 15 receptions for 185 yards. He had just one catch in the first two games.
- His five receptions vs. Georgia is a new career best.
- Against the Bulldogs, he hauled in a 46-yard catch in traffic, extending a drive that led to a Harrison Mevis field goal.

**FIRST-DOWN BANISTER**

- Sixth-year receiver Barrett Banister has played in 51 career games and has hauled in 27+ receptions in three-straight seasons. He has one catch in all six of his games played this season, including six multi-catch games.
- Banister’s three receptions in Game 1 made him the third Tiger in history with a reception in five seasons, joining Lamont Downer (1974-78) and George Shorthose (1980-84).
- He’s the eighth Tigers receiver to have a reception in 40 or more games, joining: Chase Coffman (49), Martin Rucker (46), Johnathon Johnson (45), Jared Perry (45), Tommy Saunders (44), Tyler Badie (41) and Danario Alexander (40).
- Against Abilene Christian, Banister had four catches for 44 yards, surpassing 100 career receptions. He’s the 25th Tiger to hit the milestone. He totals 110 catches and 1,004 yards.
- Four-time SEC Fall Academic Honor Roll member ... 2021 CoSIDA Academic All-District ... 2022 Wuerffel Trophy Semifinalist ... 2022 NFF Campbell Trophy Semifinalist ... 2022 Burlsworth Trophy and AFCA Good Works Team nominee ... earned his bachelor’s degree in sport management in spring 2021 ... will complete a master’s degree in athletic administration and positive coach in fall 2022.

**STORY LINES**

**THE AMERICAN DREAM**

- Cody Schrader is living the Tiger tale. A transfer from Division II Truman State and native of St. Louis, he joined the Missouri program in January, 2022. In 2021, Schrader lead all of Division II with 2,074 rushing yards on 300 carries and 24 touchdowns. He played in 29 career games.
- Schrader earned his first DI start on Sept. 1, making the most of his opportunity with a five-yard touchdown to open up the second quarter.
- He's scored rushing touchdowns in five of Mizzou's eight games this season, totaling 90 carries for 459 yards. Also a threat in the air, he has nine receptions for 94 yards. Against Florida and Vanderbilt, Schrader had five receptions for 45 yards.

**TO THE HOUSE**

- Luther Burden III took a 78-yard punt return to the house following Abilene Christian's first drive of the game. This is the first time Mizzou's initial score was a punt return since the 1939 contest against Oklahoma.
- Burden becomes the seventh Tiger in program history to record a rushing, receiving, and punt-return score in the same season, last accomplished by Marcus Murphy in 2014.
- Burden's return was the first for the Tigers since Richaud Floyd took a 71-yard punt return for six against SEMO in 2019, and the longest since Floyd took an 85-yard punt return to the house against Idaho in 2017.
- Burden racked up 111 yards off of punt returns on Saturday, making him the seventh player in program history with at least 110 punt return yards in a game, and the first since Richaud Floyd in 2017 against Idaho (118).

**THE ROCK**

- Nine Tigers recorded carries against the Bulldogs, marking the first time they accomplished the feat since a win over Iowa State on October 15, 2011.
- Of the nine, five rushed in for scores (Nathaniel Peat, Cody Schrader, Brady Cook, Luther Burden III, BJ Harris). Peat led the squad in total yards with 72 as Schrader was the leader in carries with 17. Peat, Schrader and Cook all totaled 60+ yards on the ground.
- Peat and Schrader had their first touchdowns as Tigers while Burden III and Harris each had their first collegiate scores.
- MU racked up its most total rushing yards in a game (323) since a victory over Tennessee on November 11, 2017 (433 yards).

**LBIII DEBUT**

- The first true freshman starter on offense in the season opener since Evan Boehm (2012), wide receiver Luther Burden III earned his first collegiate score on a five-yard reception after making a pair of LA Tech defenders miss and splitting another pair.
- He punched in a second score early in the third quarter, this time a one-yard rush off a direct snap. He's one of just five Tigers all-time to score twice in their collegiate debut (Jeremy Maclin, 2007; Devin West, 1995; Tracey Mack, 1980; Johnny Roland, 1962).
- On the ground, he had three carries for 26 yards and a score with a long of 17. He hauled in three receptions for 17 yards – including 21 yards after catch – with one touchdown and a long 16.

**TAKE YOUR PICK**

- The Tiger defense snagged three picks in the first half vs. Louisiana Tech, the first time this feat has been accomplished since the 1982 season opener against Colorado State. The most recent game with three total picks for the Tigers is West Virginia in 2019.
- Junior defensive back Jaylon Carlies snagged his fifth career interception on the opening drive of the game.
- In his debut game in Columbia, Joseph Charleston - a transfer from Clemson - returned a 29-yard interception to the house, the first pick of his career. He's one of five SEC defenders to return an interception for a score in the first five weeks of play.

**COOK GETS THE CALL**

- On August 9, head coach Eliah Drinkwitz named Brady Cook the starting quarterback.
- The St. Louis native threw 89 pass attempts before throwing his first career interception, ranking third in Mizzou history, and only six behind Brad Smith (95).
- He earned his first career start in the 2021 Armed Forces Bowl vs. Army West Point, completing 27-of-34 passes for 238 yards and a score. He also rushed for a career-high 53 yards and a touchdown against the Black Knights.
- Also in 2021, he was a perfect 5-of-5 for 29 yards with one passing touchdown against Southeast Missouri State. Cook finished the season 47-of-59 for 350 yards and two scores while rushing for 92 yards and a score.
- As a true freshman in 2020, he played in three games, completing 6-of-7 passes for 72 yards. His first career touchdown came on a 25-yard pass in Mizzou's 41-0 win over Vanderbilt in 2020.

**STORY LINES**

**JOURNEYMAN JACK**

- Graduate quarterback Jack Abraham is one of only 23 players in the nation entering into at least their seventh year of college football, one of 14 in the Power Five, and one of two in the SEC.
- Abraham spent the 2021-22 season at Mississippi State, was injured prior to 2021 and earned a medical redshirt. He was at Southern Miss for the 2018, 2019 and 2020 season and played in 27 games. He played the 2017 season at NW Mississippi C.C., throwing for 2,949 yards and 23 touchdowns in 11 games. His collegiate career started as an early enrollee at Louisiana Tech in Spring 2016, where he redshirted the season.

**NEW KIDS IN THE BLOCK M**

- The Tigers were joined by 49 newcomers in the offseason, including 31 true freshmen and 18 transfers. Division I newcomers (14) include: Marcus Clarke (Miami), Jayden Jernigan (Oklahoma State), Tyrone Hopper (North Carolina), DJ Coleman (Jacksonville State), Ty'Ron Hopper (Florida), Nathaniel Peat (Stanford), Jack Abraham (Mississippi State), Dreyden Norwood (Texas A&M), Joseph Charleston (Clemson), Bence Polgar (Buffalo), Tyler Stephens (Buffalo), Josh Landry (Baylor), Ian Mathews (Auburn) and Kristian Williams (Oregon).
- Cody Schrader is a transfer from Division II Truman State. Demariyon 'Peanut' Houston (Nebraska / Hutchinson C.C.), Micah Manning (Iowa Western C.C.) and MyKai Lee (Coffeyville C.C.) arrived in Columbia from the JUCO ranks.

**STAYING IN THE SHOW ME STATE**

- The 2022 Tigers' roster features 48 student-athletes from the state of Missouri, including nine from the 573, 24 from the St. Louis area and 11 from the Kansas City area.

**MIZZOU GRADUATES**

- Chase 2 Dreams is a mantra for the Mizzou coaching staff and student-athletes. It's simple, *life after football*. The 2022 roster boasts 11 student-athletes who've earned their bachelor's degrees.

**ELIAH DRINKWITZ**

A winner at every stage of his career, Eliah Drinkwitz – considered one of college football’s top offensive minds – was introduced as the University of Missouri’s 33rd head football coach in December 2019. The 2022 campaign will mark his third at the helm of the program and his fourth season as a head coach.

Drinkwitz – 11-12 at MU (third season) and 23-13 overall as a head coach (fourth season) – advanced to bowl games in his first two seasons with the Tigers, joining former head coach Warren Powers (1978, 1979) as the only two MU head coaches to achieve the feat. Additionally, only Powers won more games in his first two seasons at MU (1978-79, 15-9) than Drinkwitz.

Mizzou’s 2021 Armed Forces Bowl vs. Army West Point averaged 2.57 million viewers — up 14% from the 2020 edition of the game (Mississippi State-Tulsa: 2.25M), up 48% from Tulane-Southern Miss in 2019 (1.74M) - and was the most-watched edition of the game since 2018 (Army-Houston: 2.58M). In comparison, the National Basketball Association’s Warriors-Knicks game where Steph Curry broke the 3-point record (Dec. 14, 2021) totaled 2.35 million viewers.

The 2021 season saw Tyler Badie set a new school record for single-season rushing yards (1,604). His 14 touchdowns in 12 games are good for ninth on Mizzou’s single season and top-10 list. He was a CoSIDA Academic All-American, the Southeastern Conference Football Scholar Athlete of the Year (Mizzou’s first-ever), first-team All-SEC and was named to multiple All-America teams.

Under Drinkwitz’s leadership, Mizzou produced its highest-ranked recruiting classes ever: 2021 No. 20, 2022 No. 19 (per Rivals), including the No. 1 wide receiver in the 2022 class. He joined Warren Powers as the only head coaches in Mizzou history to earn a bowl bid in their first season patrolling the sidelines in Columbia. Drinkwitz joins Frank Broyles, Dan Devine and Powers as the only first-year Mizzou head coaches to reach five victories in year one of their Tiger tenures.

Picked to finish sixth in the SEC East Division by many preseason pundits and projected to win only two or three games at most against the All-SEC schedule, the Tigers split their 10-game league slate at 5-5 to finish third in the SEC East, with four of the losses coming at the hands of teams that were ranked at kickoff and three that finished at No. 1 (Alabama), No. 7 (Florida) and No. 8 (Georgia) in the final College Football Playoff ranking, while a fourth loss came in week two at then-No. 21 Tennessee. Mizzou’s five SEC wins are the second-most ever behind its 7-1 mark that it posted en route to winning back-to-back SEC East crowns in 2013 and 2014.

Despite playing with less than 60 scholarship players for more than half of their games in 2020 and having just three games played on their original dates, the Tigers overcame an 0-2 start to win five of their final eight games down the stretch, a run that included:

- A goal-line stand in the closing minute to hold off defending National Champion LSU, 45-41.
- Snapping Kentucky’s five-game series win streak with a 20-10 victory that wasn’t nearly as close as the final score indicated.
- Mizzou’s first win in Columbia East since 2014, a 17-10 decision at South Carolina and a thrilling come-from-behind 50-48 walk-off victory over Arkansas, its fifth-straight in the series.
- An appearance at No. 25 in the College Football Playoff rankings Dec. 7, only the third season the program has appeared in the CFP’s seven-year run.

Of the SEC’s four new head coaches to begin work in the nation’s toughest conference in 2020, Drinkwitz’s 5-5 regular-season record was the league’s best, ahead of Ole Miss’ Lane Kiffin (4-5), Mississippi State’s Mike Leach (3-7) and Arkansas’ Sam Pittman (3-7). The combined record of his teams from 2010-21 is 109-46 overall (.703), including a 65-32 conference mark (.670).

Drinkwitz took over the Tiger program following an impressive 2019 season at Appalachian State that saw the 20th-ranked Mountaineers win the Sun Belt Conference title en route to a 12-1 record. The Mountaineers set a Sun Belt record with their 12 wins, and also set the mark for the best regular season in conference history (11-1). They claimed the Sun Belt Championship with a 45-38 win against Louisiana.

Also in 2019, App State became the first-ever Sun Belt program to earn a top-20 ranking in the Associated Press poll, while also becoming the first team in league history to receive an in-season ranking in the College Football Playoff poll. Drinkwitz’s team also made history with a pair of Power 5 road wins (at bowl-eligible North Carolina, and later at South Carolina) – making it the first-ever Sun Belt team to register two Power 5 wins in a season. In all, the Mountaineers claimed an FBS-best six road wins en route to becoming the first-ever 12-win team among North Carolina’s FBS members.

For his efforts, Drinkwitz was named a finalist for the 2019 Eddie Robinson Award, a prestigious award which goes annually to the nation’s top coach. He was also named the North Carolina Coach of the Year by the North State Journal. App State junior running back Darrynton Evans was named the Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year, after rushing for 1,323 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Prior to App State, Drinkwitz spent three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for record-setting NC State teams (2016-18). Following a 7-6 season in 2016, the Wolfpack put together consecutive nine-win seasons (2017-18) for the first time since 1991-92. With an average of 35.6 points per game under his direction in 2018, NC State had a 1,000-yard rusher for the third-straight year, two 1,000-yard receivers and a quarterback with nearly 4,000 passing yards. The Wolfpack made a steady rise from 63rd nationally in total offense in his first season in 2016 to 25th in 2017 and 16th in 2018. He was a Broyles Award nominee as one of the nation’s top assistant coaches in his final year with the Wolfpack.

He excelled in two seasons at Boise State, coaching the tight ends in 2014 and serving as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2015. The Broncos won the Mountain West title in 2014 and finished 12-2 and ranked 16th nationally. In 2015, Drinkwitz was promoted to offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, and he helped the Bronco offense rank in the top 15 nationally in points (39.1) and yards (501.3) per game.

Before Boise, Drinkwitz was a key figure in back-to-back Sun Belt Championships in 2012-13 as running backs coach and co-offensive coordinator at Arkansas State. He got his first taste at the FBS level in the Southeastern Conference, as he served as a quality control assistant at Auburn from the 2010-11 seasons. The Tigers won the SEC in 2010, and went on to the BCS Championship that season with a perfect 14-0 record.

In his seven seasons as an offensive coordinator and/or head coach, Drinkwitz has produced six 1,000-yard rushers, four 3,000-yard passers and four 1,000-yard receivers. Three of those years (2015, 2017, 2018) his offenses produced at least one in each category.
