QUICK HITS

ACC/SEC CHALLENGE

The Hurricanes are set to meet the Wildcats in the first ever iteration of the ACC/SEC Challenge. Miami is 44-65 all-time against SEC opponents (in the SEC at the time of the game) and 9-40 when playing on the road. Since the program rebirth (1985-86), the Hurricanes have posted a 14-22 record against SEC teams and a 4-11 mark in away games. Until this season, Miami competed in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, boasting a 9-6 all-time record and an 8-3 mark under Coach L.

ELITE COACHES

Coach Larrañaga and Coach Calipari are two of the winningest coaches in Division I men's basketball combining for 1,525 career victories. Coach L (730) and Coach Calipari (795) are two of seven active DI coaches with at least 725 victories, joining Cliff Ellis (829), Rick Barnes (783), Bill Self (777), Kelvin Sampson (739) and Dana Altman (735). Both Coach L and Coach Calipari have totaled 150-plus wins at three DI schools, making up half of the legendary group of four coaches (three active) who have done so, alongside Lefty Driesell and Cliff Ellis.

UNDEFEATED CANES

The University of Miami is one of eight schools with both its men's and women's basketball teams undefeated. The Hurricane men sit at 5-0, while the women's team is 4-0 on the year. Miami is the only ACC school to have an unblemished hoops record and is joined in the undefeated ranks by Baylor, BYU, Colorado State, Houston, Mississippi State, South Carolina and TCU.

THE MATCHUP

• Miami and Kentucky have met just four times before in program history and thrice since the program rebirth in 1985. Kentucky holds the 3-1 edge in the all-time series (2-1 since rebirth), with Miami's lone victory coming the last time the Hurricanes played at Rupp Arena on Dec. 6, 2008.

• Miami entered that game the No. 21/22 team in the nation, while the Wildcats were the unranked home team. The Hurricanes downed Kentucky, 73-67, and were led on offense by Jack McClinton, who poured in a game-best 23 points.

LAST TIME OUT

• The Hurricanes brought home some hardware after defeating Kansas State, 91-83, to win the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship. Fourth-year junior Nijel Pack led all scorers in the game, pouring in 28 points and knocking down 7-of-12 shots from beyond the arc.

• Fourth-year junior forward Norchad Omier recorded his second 20-point game of the season with 23 points on 7-of-14 shooting and lead the Hurricanes on the boards at seven.

UP AGAINST THE BEST

• The No. 8 Hurricanes will face a ranked opponent for the first time this season in No. 12 Kentucky on Tuesday. Miami is 67-186 all-time against Associated Press ranked teams and 19-82 when playing those teams on the road.

• Under Coach L, the Hurricanes sit at 29-61 against ranked opponents with a 9-25 mark in away games. Miami's last victory over a ranked opponent came in the Elite Eight of the 2023 NCAA Tournament, an 88-81 defeat of No. 5 Texas on March 26.

• This will be just the 39th game in program history that both Miami and its opponent enter the contest ranked in the AP Top 25. The Hurricanes are 20-18 overall in AP ranked matchups and went 6-2 in those games last season. Fourteen of Miami's 20 wins have come under the direction of head coach Jim Larrañaga.

THREE-POINT MACHINES

• Through five games this season, the Hurricanes are shooting 45.8 percent from 3-point range, which ranks first in the nation.

• Junior Wooga Poplar currently ranks third in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage (.594), while Bensley Joseph (.556), Matthew Cleveland (.500) and Christian Watson (.500) are all shooting better than 50 percent from deep.

BAHAMAS CHAMPS

- The Hurricanes won their 18th regular season tournament/multi-team event (MTE) last week, taking home the Baha Mar Hoops Bahamas Championship title. Miami's last MTE team title came in 2015 when the Hurricanes won the Puerto Rico TipOff in San Juan, Puerto Rico.
- Fourth-year junior Nijel Pack was named the Tournament MVP after averaging 22.0 points per game on and shooting 47.1 percent from 3-point range. Pack broke the tournament record for total points (44) in the tournament and single-game scoring with 28 points against Kansas State. He was the first Hurricane to earn a MTE MVP honor since Kamari Murphy was named the 2016 Hoophall Miami Invitational MVP.
- Junior Wooga Poplar joined Pack on the Bahamas Championship All-Tournament Team after averaging 14.0 points and 8.5 rebounds in the tournament.

ELECTRIC OFFENSE

- Through five games this season, the Hurricanes are averaging 89.0 points per game, good for 12th in the nation in scoring offense.
- Kentucky is one of the few teams scoring more than the Hurricanes as they sit in fourth in the country in points per game at 94.3. The gap is much smaller when looking at KenPom's adjusted offensive efficiency with Kentucky sitting in seventh (119.1) and Miami sitting in 11th (117.4).

PACK ALL DAY

- Fourth-year junior Nijel Pack put on his best performance in a Miami uniform last time out, totaling 28 points on 9-of-16 shooting for his highest scoring output as a Hurricane.
- The guard knocked down 7-of-12 shots from beyond the arc and put up 20 points in the first half alone.

AT THE LINE

- Miami has made every trip to the charity stripe count this year, shooting 82.7 percent (81-of-98) from the line, good for seventh in the nation. Junior Wooga Poplar ranks tied for first in the nation in free throw percentage at a perfect 100 (13-for-13) on the season.

IN THE POLLS

- The Hurricanes ascended two spots to No. 8 in the Associated Press Top 25 this week, marking the 18th straight week that Miami has appeared in the AP Poll, breaking the program record of 17 consecutive weeks set during the 2015-16 season.
- The Hurricanes appeared in 18 straight USA TODAY Coaches Polls in 2015-16 due to the final poll at the conclusion on the season.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES

- For the first time in program history, two Hurricanes earned Preseason All-ACC plaudits as fourth-year junior Norchad Omier was named Preseason First Team All-ACC, while fourth-year junior Nijel Pack picked up Preseason Second Team All-ACC honors.
- Omier, who was a Third Team All-ACC selection in 2022-23, averaged a double-double last season, tallying 13.1 points and 10.0 rebounds per game. Pack, the NCAA Tournament Midwest Region Most Outstanding Player, scored in double-figures 22 times in 2022-23, averaging 13.6 points per game and shooting 40.4 percent from 3-point range.

- With the nod for Omier, Miami has now placed a player on the Preseason All-ACC First Team in each of the last four seasons.

LEGENDARY COACH L

- The Hurricanes' Final Four trip last season was the second of Jim Larraga's career, making him one of nine active DI head coaches with multiple trips. Coach L and Larry Brown are, per Stats Perform, the only coaches to take two different schools to the Final Four while seeded fifth or lower.
- Coach L, a 2023 Naismith HOF first-time nominee and UM Sports HOF 2023 inductee, is Miami's all-time leader with 255 victories. His eight 20-win seasons are the most by a Miami coach and 40 percent of The U's total (20).
- Coach L has led Miami to all five of its 25-win years, half its 12 NCAA berths, 11 of its 15 wins in the field, four of its five Sweet 16s, its two Elite Eights, its first Final Four, its two ACC regular season titles and its one ACC Tournament crown.

• The Hurricanes will play their first true road game of the season on Tuesday in one of the most storied arenas in the nation, Rupp Arena.

• Miami posted a 7-4 record in true road games in 2022-23 and a 13-7 mark in games played away from the Watsco Center.

• The Hurricanes are 278-411 all-time in road games and 156-251 since the program rebirth in 1985. Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami holds a 70-68 record on the road.

• Junior Bensley Joseph was just one block shy of the elusive 5x5 recording 15 points, 5 rebounds, 5 assists, 5 steals and 4 blocks against UCF on Nov. 10.

• He is just one of three Division I players (Chris Singleton, Syracuse, 2010; Michael Carter-Williams, FSU, 2008) to put up those numbers in the last 14 years. Joseph's 15 points, five steals and four blocks were also new career highs in scoring.

WATSCO IS ROCKIN'

• Miami has seen unprecedented fan interest in the program under Larrañaga. In 2017-18, for the third straight season, the Hurricanes sold out their season-ticket allotment at the Watsco Center.

• The 2015-16 campaign marked the first time in UM history that any team sold out of season tickets. Across the last two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23, Miami recorded four of the five highest single-game student attendance marks in program history.

In his 12 seasons at the University of Miami, head coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to six NCAA Tournament appearances, including four trips to the Sweet 16. He has guided the Hurricanes to their first Elite Eight (2022), first Final Four (2023), first ACC Tournament title (2013) and first two ACC regular season crowns (2013 and 2023). Larrañaga has been named the Associated Press, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

The winningest coach in program history, Larrañaga has posted five 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to do so even once – and seven in his career. He also has recorded eight 20-win campaigns at Miami and 14 in his career. In conference action, the Hurricanes have won nine or more league games in eight of 12 seasons, while prior to Larrañaga's arrival, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Hurricanes to 30 postseason victories, including 11 in the NCAA Tournament (six appearances), 13 in the ACC Tournament (13) and five in the NIT (two). He ranks top-30 all-time among Division I coaches with 725 victories, including eighth among active coaches. In 2023, Larrañaga was both inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame & Museum and named a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame first-time nominee.

Miami's 69 total road wins in the past 12 seasons are fourth-most among ACC teams during Larrañaga's tenure and its 114 total victories away from home also place fourth. During that same stretch, the Hurricanes are fifth in overall ACC wins (120), as well as fourth in both ACC road victories (48) and ACC Tournament triumphs (13), plus sixth in ACC home wins (72). In the six years prior to Larrañaga's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for ninth in ACC victories (36) and won just 10 total ACC road games. In nine of Larrañaga's 12 years, the team has finished higher in the ACC final standings than it was picked in the preseason poll, including placing multiple spots higher on seven occasions.

The Hurricanes have a combined 16 wins over Duke (8-9) and North Carolina (8-10) under Larrañaga, tied for the second-most of any team during his 11-year tenure, after going 4-31 versus those two programs before his arrival. Eight of those victories are by double digits and seven are on the road, the former the most of any team during that stretch and the latter tied for the most. Miami's 27-point win over the Blue Devils on Jan. 23, 2013, is the third-largest ever against the AP No. 1 team in the nation. It is one 31 victories over a top-25 foe under Larrañaga, including 13—five of which came in the past two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23—versus a top-10 opponent.

Miami has seen unprecedented fan interest in the program under Larrañaga. In 2017-18, for the third straight season, the Hurricanes sold out their season-ticket allotment at the Watsco Center. The 2015-16 campaign marked the first time in UM history that any team sold out of season tickets. Across the last two seasons, 2021-22 and 2022-23, Miami recorded four of the five highest single-game student attendance marks in program history.

From 2017-19, Miami was one of two ACC programs, alongside Duke, to have a player selected in each NBA Draft. Four total Hurricanes were picked in that span, including Lonnie Walker IV going No. 18 in 2018.

During the most recent campaign, 2022-23, Larrañaga guided Miami to its best year ever. The Hurricanes finished 29-8 (15-5 ACC), shared the ACC regular season title and earned their first Final Four appearance. Miami set or tied program records for overall, ACC, regular season (24), home (16), top-25 (seven), top-10 (three) and top-five (two) victories. The team ended the year third in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll, good for its best finish ever.

Seeded No. 5 in the Midwest Region, the Hurricanes knocked off top-seeded and No. 2/1-ranked Houston, 89-75, and second-seeded and No. 5/7-ranked Texas, 88-81, in a three-day span in Kansas City, Mo., to clinch their Final Four bid. They also knocked off seven teams with a combined 23 NCAA titles (including one vacated) during the 2022-23 campaign, including an eight-point road victory at North Carolina, a 22-point home win over Duke and a 16-point triumph over Indiana in the NCAA Tournament. The team lost by more than seven points just twice all year.

Larrañaga earned multiple significant achievements during the historic season. First, on Nov. 19, 2022, he led Miami to a 74-64 victory over his alma mater, Providence, in Uncasville, Conn., to become just the 35th coach with DI experience to reach 700 wins, including only the fourth to do so while in the ACC. On Dec., 21, 2022, he was named a Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame first-time nominee. Following the season, on May 4, 2023, he was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame & Museum.

Numerous Hurricanes claimed major awards during the season, as well. Isaiah Wong became Miami's second ACC Player of the Year and sixth All-America, garnering NABC third-team distinction. He was also a finalist for the John R. Wooden Award and the Jerry West Award, among many other accomplishments. Jordan Miller received Second Team All-ACC status, while Norchad Omier picked up third-team plaudits. Nijel Pack won NCAA Tournament Midwest Region Most Outstanding Player honors, while Miller and Wong both tallied All-Tournament Team status.

The 2022-23 success followed another tremendous season the year before, as Miami, picked No. 12 in the ACC preseason poll, went 26-11 (14-6 ACC). Seeded No. 10 in the Midwest Region, the Hurricanes rattled off three straight victories to make the Elite Eight for the first time, including throttling second-seeded and No. 8/7 ranked-Auburn, 79-61, in the Round of 32, en route to finishing co-No. 16 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll.

Larrañaga set the program record with his 221st victory at The U on March 2, 2022, at Boston College, just weeks after a Feb. 9, 2022, triumph over Georgia Tech made him the first coach in NCAA history with 100 league wins at three DI schools and/or in three DI conferences. Kameron McGusty turned in one of the best years in program history, claiming First Team All-ACC, NABC First Team All-District 2, ACC All-Tournament First Team, NCAA Tournament All-Midwest Region and Senior CLASS Award finalist accolades.

In 2017-18, Miami played in its fourth NCAA Tournament in a six-year span, claiming the No. 6 seed in the South Region. The Hurricanes tied for third in the ACC and finished the season with a 22-10 mark, including an 11-7 record in conference play. The Hurricanes were nationally ranked for 15 weeks, reaching as high as No. 6 in the polls.

Freshman Lonnie Walker IV was named Honorable Mention All-ACC, becoming the first freshman all-conference honoree in program history. He also was named to the ACC All-Freshman Team. Miami earned road wins over then-No. 12 Minnesota and then-No. 9 North Carolina, the fourth straight year and the sixth time in Larrañaga's first seven seasons that the Hurricanes defeated two or more top-15 teams.

In 2016-17, Miami went 21-12 overall and claimed the No. 8 seed in the Midwest Region. It defeated three ranked teams, including two in the top 10. Davon Reed won the Skip Prosser Award and Larrañaga registered his 600th all-time win with a 72-46 triumph at

The 2015-16 Hurricanes played their way into the NCAA Tournament's Sweet 16 for the second time in four seasons, and just the third time in school history.

In 2012-13, Larrañaga helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA tournament. At the time, he was the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final Top 25 poll in 2006.

Individually, Shane Larkin earned the ACC Player of the Year and Lute Olson National Player of the Year awards, as well as All-American status and finalist nods for the Bob Cousy, John Wooden and James Naismith player of the year honors before declaring early for the 2013 NBA Draft. Larkin was also the ACC Tournament MVP, on the ACC All-Defensive Team and a Defensive All-American. Durand Scott was the ACC Defensive Player of the Year.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided the program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (1999, 2001, 2006, 2008, 2011), including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, as the Patriots defeated Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. Following that run, Larrañaga was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga built the George Mason program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (1999, 2001, 2008).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned the CAA's first NCAA tournament at-large berth in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, its first-ever national ranking, its first-ever appearance in the Top 10 and its first wins over Top 10 teams.

Larrañaga served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79).

At Bowling Green, he made an immediate impact in his first season. In 1986-87, the Falcons were the nation's most improved team under a first-year head coach that took over a program with a losing record, posting a 15-14 record for an eight-game improvement over the previous season. Larrañaga went on to record a 170-144 mark in 11 years at Bowling Green, earning 1997 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year honors after leading Bowling Green to a 22-10 record, a conference regular season co-championship and a berth in the NIT. The 22 victories were the most by a Bowling Green team in 47 years and the 13 conference wins were the second-highest total in BGSU history.

Larrañaga's 170 victories at Bowling Green ranked second all-time on the Falcons' coaching list and he was only the second coach to record consecutive postseason appearances. Larrañaga led his squad to NIT berths in 1990 (18-11) and again in 1991 (17-13), the first time the Falcons enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances since the early '60s. Bowling Green won better than 60 percent of its games in Larrañaga's last four years, recording a 70-44 mark during that stretch. The Falcons finished fourth or better in the MAC in five of Larrañaga's 11 seasons and he is among the winningest coaches in MAC history.

Larrañaga received his first head coaching position in 1977 when he was named to the post at American International, a Division II program in Springfield, Mass. Taking over a team that had suffered through five consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, Larrañaga turned AIC into a winning program in his first year and compiled a 28-25 mark in two seasons.

Larrañaga's first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College from 1971-76, serving as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Conference regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his five years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium.

After his two-year stint at American International, Larrañaga was reunited with Holland at the University of Virginia in April 1979. An assistant coach under Holland at UVA for seven seasons from 1979-86, he helped the Cavaliers reach the NCAA Final Four on two occasions (1981 and 1984), finish in the top five of the AP and UPI polls and average more than 24 victories per season. The Cavaliers were 169-62, won three regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championships and made four NCAA Tournament appearances in that span. Virginia also made a pair of NIT appearances, winning the NIT Championship in 1980. Larrañaga was on the staff during the careers of three-time National Player of the Year Ralph Sampson and NBA first-round draft choice Olden Polynice.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophomore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga and his wife, Liz, have two sons and four grandchildren. Their son, Jay, played for his father at Bowling Green, was the head coach of the NBDL's Erie Bayhawks and is now an assistant coach with the Los Angeles Clippers. Jon was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003, earning first team Academic All-America honors for NCAA Division I-AAA schools.
