TIPOFF

- The top-two winningest programs in college basketball history will meet for the 11th time in the last 13 seasons when No. 1 Kansas (2-0) will face No. 17 Kentucky (2-0) in the State Farm Champions Classic, Tuesday, Nov. 14, at 8:30 p.m. Central, at the United Center in Chicago. ESPN will televise the game with Dan Shulman, Jay Bilas and Holly Rowe calling the action.
- Kansas is 2-0 after its 99-61 win against Manhattan College on Nov. 10. The Jayhawks are 2-0 for the 12th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons at KU. Kentucky is also 2-0 after its 81-61 win against Texas A&M-Commerce on Nov. 10.
- The Champions Classic began in the 2011-12 season. Kansas is 7-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won six of their last seven appearances in the event after last year's 69-64 win against Duke in Indianapolis. Duke is 7-5 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-7 and Michigan State 5-7.
- Kentucky leads the all-time series with Kansas, 24-11, and this will be the 11th time in the last 13 seasons these two blue bloods will meet (since 2011-12). Kansas has won two of the last three and five of the last seven meetings. The series is tied at 2-2 in the Champions Classic.
- Kansas' and Kentucky's home facilities are named after Kansas greats. Kentucky's Rupp Arena is named after Adolph Rupp, a KU graduate who played at Kansas in 1923 under coach F.C. "Phog" Allen, of which Allen Fieldhouse is named. Rupp was a member of the 1922 and 1923 Helms Foundation National Championship teams while at Kansas.
- Though its only two games, Kansas leads the nation in FG% at 62.6%, is second in assists per game at 29.5 and 10th in 3FG% (46.9%).
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener, 99-56 against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers under Bill Self.
- Kansas posted a 28-8 overall record in 2022-23 and won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league mark.

ABOUT KANSAS

No. 1 Kansas is 2-0 for the 12th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons after its 99-56 win against Manhattan College on Nov. 10. Through two games, the Jayhawks lead the nation in field goal percentage at 62.6 percent and ranks in the nation's top 10 in assists per game (second at 13.2 apg) and three-point field goal percentage (10th at 46.9 percent). KU also leads the Big 12 in points per game (99.0).

Senior center Hunter Dickinson leads Kansas in scoring at 19.5 ppg and rebounding at 8.0 rpg. Name the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week Nov. 13, Dickinson has made all four of his three-point field goals attempts through two games. Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. is next in scoring at 18.5 points per contest, including a team-high 22 points in the win versus North Carolina Central (11/6). McCullar is tied for the team lead with five three pointers made, has nine assists and pulls down 6.5 rebounds per game, and leads the nation in FT% (6-6). Junior KJ Adams Jr., leads the Big 12 in field goal percentage as he is 13-for-16 (81.3%) from the field in two games. Adams averages 13.0 points and 5.0 rebounds per contest. Other KU starters include freshman Elmarko Jackson (8.5 ppg, 7.5 assists per game) and redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. who has 15 assists as well. Other KU regulars include freshman Johnny Furphy (10.5 ppg) who is tied with McCullar with a team-high five threes made, graduate-senior Parker Braun (10.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, four blocks) and graduate-senior Nicolas Timberlake (7.5 ppg, three threes made).

Kansas opened the 2023-24 season with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6, in Allen Fieldhouse. The game was part of the McLendon Classic honoring Kansas grad and two-time Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame coach John McLendon.

Kansas is coming off a 28-8 season in which it won the Big 12 regular-season title with a 13-5 league record. It was KU's NCAA-record 63rd conference regular-season title and 16th under head coach Bill Self in his 20 seasons at Kansas.

Kansas returned three starters – Adams, Harris and McCullar – and eight letterwinners from last season. KU welcomed nine newcomers, including the 2023-24 coaches' Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year Dickinson. Dickinson, Harris and McCullar were on the All-Big 12 Preseason team as well.

ABOUT KENTUCKY

Located in Lexington, Kentucky, No. 17 Kentucky is 2-0 on the season after its 81-61 win against Texas A&M-Commerce on Nov. 10. The Wildcats are coached by former Kansas assistant coach John Calipari who is 389-113 in his 15th season at UK and 792-251 in his 32nd season as a college coach.

Kentucky averages 83.5 points per game with a plus-30.0 scoring margin. The Wildcats shoot 48.5 percent from the field and pull down 39.5 rebounds per game with a plus-6.5 rebound margin. Kentucky averages 8.5 three-point field goals made with a 32.7 three-point shooting percentage. UK also averages 14.5 assists, 10.5 steals and 3.0 blocked shots through two games.

UK has five players averaging double figures led by fifth-year guard Antonio Reeves at 16.0 ppg. Reeves has made a team high seven threes in two contests. Freshman guard Rob Dillingham (14.5 ppg, 5.0 rpg) is tied for the team lead in assists with seven. Freshman guard Justin Edwards (14.0 ppg, 6.0 rpg), graduate forward Tre Mitchell (13.5 ppg, team-high 8.5 rpg, four steals) and freshman guard D.J. Wagner (12.0 ppg, seven assists, four steals) round out the Kentucky double-figure scorers. Freshman guard Reed Sheppard (7.5 ppg) has a team-high five steals, while sophomore guard Adou Thiero (5.0 ppg) and freshman guard Jordan Burks (3.5 ppg) rounds out the Kentucky regulars.

THE KANSAS-KENTUCKY SERIES

Kentucky leads the all-time series with Kansas, 24-11, and this will be the 11th time in the last 13 seasons these two blue bloods will meet since 2011-12. The series is tied at 2-2 in the Champions Classic with Kentucky winning the first two meetings in 2011 (75-65 in New York City) and in 2014 (72-40 in Indianapolis) and Kansas winning the last two in 2017 (65-61 in Chicago) and 2020 (65-62 in Indianapolis).

Kansas has won two of the last three meetings and five of the last seven battles, including last season's 77-68 win on Jan. 28, 2023 in the SEC/Big 12 Challenge. In 2011-12, the two teams met twice with Kentucky claiming both wins: 75-65 in the Champions Classic at Madison Square Garden and 67-59 in the NCAA title game in New Orleans. On Nov. 18, 2014, then-No. 1 Kentucky defeated Kansas 72-40 in the Champions Classic in Indianapolis.

Prior to 2011-12, the two teams last met in the second round of the 2007 NCAA West Regional in Chicago with Kansas defeating Kentucky, 88-76. The two teams had a home-and-home series in 2005 and 2006 with KU winning in Lexington 65-59 on Jan. 9, 2005, and 73-46 the following season (Jan. 7, 2006) in Allen Fieldhouse.

The series dates back to 1950, a 68-39 UK win in Lexington. Kansas' single-game record of 150 points came against Kentucky in a 150-95 win over Rick Pitino's Wildcats on Dec. 9, 1989 in Lawrence. Kansas coach Bill Self is 8-6 against Kentucky, 7-5 while at Kansas. Kentucky coach John Calipari is 5-6 all-time versus Kansas, 5-5 while at UK. - Both schools' home facilities are named after Kansas greats. Kentucky's Rupp Arena is named after Adolph Rupp, a KU graduate who played at Kansas in 1923 under coach F.C. "Phog" Allen, of which Allen Fieldhouse is named. Rupp was a member of the 1922 and 1923 Helms Foundation National Championship teams while at Kansas.

A KANSAS WIN WOULD...

Make Kansas 3-0 for the third-consecutive season and 12th time in head coach Bill Self's 21 seasons at KU ... Make Kansas 6-2 against Kentucky in its last eight meetings, including 3-2 in the Champions Classic ... Make the KU-UK all-time series 24-12 in favor of UK ... Make Kansas 8-5 all-time in the Champions Classic ... Make Self 568-132 while at Kansas, 775-237 overall and 9-6 all-time versus Kentucky (8-5 while at Kansas) ... Make Kansas 2,373-885 all-time.

A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

Make Kansas 2-1 for the first time since also going 2-1 in the 2020-21 season ... Make the Kansas-Kentucky series 25-11 all-time in favor of UK ... Drop Kansas to 7-6 in the Champions Classic, including 2-3 against Kentucky in the event ... Make Bill Self 567-133 while at Kansas, 774-237 overall and 8-7 all-time against Kentucky (7-6 while at Kansas) ... Make Kansas 2,72-886 all-time.

MANHATTAN COLLEGE LEFTOVERS

- Kansas held Manhattan to 19 points in the first half. The last time Kansas held opponents to less than 20 points in the first half in back-to-back games was Dec. 22, 2011 at USC (13 pts) and Dec. 29, 2011 vs. Howard (13 pts). On Nov. 6, KU held NC Central to 18 first half points.
- Kansas dished out 25 assists. The last time Kansas had at least 25 assists in back-to-back games was Nov. 27, 2009 vs. Tennessee Tech (29 assists) and Dec. 2, 2009 vs. Alcorn State (28 assists). Kansas had 34 assists on Nov. 6 vs. North Carolina Central.
- KU made 10 three-point fields goals, making it consecutive games with double-digit triples. The last time KU started the season with back-to-back games with 10+ threes was 2018.
- Kansas finished with 99 points for the second straight game. Kansas has finished with at least 90 points in the first two games of the season for the first time since 2020.

- Kansas had five players score in double figures (Dickinson – 18, McCullar – 15, Furphy – 15, Adams – 14, Braun – 10).
- Senior Hunter Dickinson finished with a game-high 18 points on 7-of-14 (50.0 percent) shooting, a game-high-tying eight rebounds and two assists. Dickinson has scored in double figures 85 times in his career, including in both of his games at Kansas. Dickinson secured his 800th career rebound in the second half.
- Graduate-senior Kevin McCullar Jr. had 15 points on 5-of-9 (55.6 percent) shooting, seven rebounds, four assists and a team-high two steals. He grabbed his 600th career rebound.
- Junior KJ Adams Jr. posted 14 points on 7-of-8 (87.5 percent) shooting, five rebounds and two blocks. Six of his seven made baskets were dunks.
- Freshman Johnny Furphy contributed 15 points on 6-of-10 (60.0 percent) shooting and three rebounds off the bench.
- Graduate-senior Parker Braun added 10 points on a perfect 4-of-4 (100.0 percent) shooting, five rebounds, two assists and a game-high three blocks off the bench. Braun has 19 double-digit scoring games in his career, including in both of his games at Kansas.
- Graduate-senior Michael Jankovich scored a career-high six points on a pair of second half three-pointers.
- Freshman Elmarko Jackson was just shy of a double-double with nine points and a game-high 10 assists. He is the first Kansas freshman with double-digit assists in a game since Quentin Grimes on Nov. 12, 2018 vs. Vermont (10).

CHAMPIONS CLASSIC HISTORY

Beginning in 2011, the State Farm Champions Classic is a neutral site doubleheader series featuring men's basketball powers Kansas, Duke, Kentucky and Michigan State. The inaugural Champions Classic was held at Madison Square Garden in 2011 followed by the Georgia Dome in 2012 and the United Center in Chicago in 2013.

Kansas is 7-5 in the Champions Classic and the Jayhawks have won six of their last seven appearances in the event after last year's 69-64 win against Duke in Indianapolis. Duke is 7-5 in the Champions Classic, while Kentucky is 5-7 and Michigan State 5-7.

In 2011, Kansas and Kentucky's Champions Classic meeting also became the matchup for the 2012 NCAA National Championship title game in New Orleans. The Wildcats defeated the Jayhawks, 75-65, in the Champions Classic.

In the 2016-17 season, Kansas defeated all the other three teams in the Champions Classic. KU defeated then-No. 1 Duke, 77-75, in the event and won at then-No. 4 Kentucky, Jan. 28, in the Big 12/SEC Challenge. KU completed the feat with a 90-70 win versus Michigan State in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Tulsa on March 19, 2017.

KU will face Michigan State in 2024.

JAYHAWKS NO. 1 IN PRESEASON POLLS

Kansas entered the 2023-24 season No. 1 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' polls. This marked the fourth time KU has been No. 1 in the preseason AP poll with all four in the Bill Self era - 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24. This is the fifth time in the coaches' poll that the Jayhawks have been No. 1 in the preseason poll with four in the Self era - 1996-97, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2018-19 and 2023-24.

Under 21st-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 18th time that Kansas entered the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll. Historically, the No. 1 ranking marks the 26th time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas could possibly play 10 games against teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25. KU will play against No. 6 UConn, No. 7 Houston, No. 16 Kentucky, No. 18 Texas and No. 20 Baylor (twice). KU could also play No. 3 Purdue, No. 5 Marquette, and No. 11 Gonzaga in the Maui Invitational, Nov. 20-22, in Honolulu.

The No. 1 ranking marked the 10th-straight year Kansas has entered the season No. 5 or higher in the coaches' poll dating back to 2014-15. Additionally, it is the 18th time in the Self era the Jayhawks have been preseason seventh or higher, including each of the last 12 seasons.

KU PICKED FIRST IN THE PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the 20th time in the 27-year history of the coaches' preseason Big 12 poll, Kansas has been selected as the favorite to win the league as the preseason poll was announced Oct. 13.

For the 2023-24 poll, KU collected 12 of a possible 14 first-place votes and finished with a total of 168 points. Houston received two first-place nods and was second with 153 points. Texas was third with 143 points, while Baylor was fourth with 137 points and TCU fifth with 113 points to round out the top five.

PRESEASON ALL-BIG 12

Kansas men's basketball senior Hunter Dickinson, redshirt-senior Dajuan Harris Jr. and graduate Kevin McCullar Jr. were named to the 2023-24 Preseason All-Big 12 Team as voted on by the league coaches, the conference announced Oct. 12.

Dickinson is the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year and the Big 12 Newcomer of the Year, becoming the first player in conference history to earn both honors in the same season. Dickinson is joined on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team by Harris, while McCullar is an honorable mention honoree.

Historically, Dickinson is the 11th Jayhawk to collect the preseason player of the year award and the fifth to earn preseason newcomer. Kansas has had at least one player on the Preseason All-Big 12 First Team in all but two of the 28 seasons the conference has existed, since 1996-97. Dickinson and Harris are the 39th and 40th Jayhawks to be listed on the preseason all-league first team.

KU TRIO ON NAISMITH PRESEASON TOP 50

The Kansas men's basketball trio of Hunter Dickinson, Dajuan Harris Jr. and Kevin McCullar Jr. have been named to the 2023-24 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy Men's preseason 50 watch list the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced Nov. 6, the opening day of the season. Kansas is the only team with three players on the list and one of eight schools with multiple players.

Kansas has had two previous winners of the Naismith Trophy with Danny Manning in 1988 and Frank Mason III in 2017.

In late January the Naismith Trophy will name a top 15 midseason team. In early March 2024 the award will announce 10 national semifinalists and later that month name four finalists. The Naismith Trophy Men's Player of the Year will be awarded April 7, the Sunday prior to the NCAA title game.

DICKINSON ON THE PRESEASON NABC WATCH LIST

Kansas senior Hunter Dickinson was one of 20 players named to the 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year Watch List, the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) announced Nov. 2. The 2024 NABC Division I Player of the Year - selected by a vote of Division I head coaches - will be announced the week of the 2024 Men's Final Four.

FOUR JAYHAWKS ARE ON STARTING FIVE WATCH LISTS

In October, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced watch lists for its "Starting Five" for the 2023-24 season. Four Jayhawks were among the 20 watch list honorees with Dajuan Harris Jr. on the Bob Cousy Point Guard Award, Kevin McCullar Jr. on the Jerry West Shooting Guard Award, Johnny Furphy on the Julius Erving Small Forward Award and Hunter Dickinson on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center Award.

A national committee of top college basketball personnel determined the watch lists of 20 candidates for every starting five.

College basketball fans are encouraged to participate in Fan Voting presented by Dell Technologies in each of the three rounds. In late January, the watch list of 20 players for each honor will be narrowed to 10 and then in late February to five. In March, the Hall of Fame's selection committee will determine the winners.

Historically, Kansas' Jalen Wilson was the 2023 Julius Erving Award recipient and Jayhawk Frank Mason III won the 2017 Bob Cousy Award.

KANSAS VS. TOP-25 TEAMS

No. 14 Kentucky will be the first Associated Press (AP) ranked opponent for Kansas in 2023-24. Last season, KU was 7-7 against AP ranked foes in 2022-23, including 4-2 versus top 10 teams. KU played 12 Associated Press-ranked opponents during the 2021-22 season and went 8-4 versus those teams. Eleven of the last 14 and 17 of Kansas' last 23 losses have been to ranked foes. In 2019-20, KU went 4-3 against top-25 teams. In the Bill Self era, KU is 120-72 against AP-ranked opponents, including 47-28 versus Top-10 foes. In that span, Self's KU teams have collected seven or more wins against ranked foes in each of the last three and four of the last five seasons.

Kansas' record against top-10 ranked opponents is even more impressive. KU is 21-13 against foes ranked inside the top-10 of the AP poll since 2013-14. Since Bill Self's first season, 2003-04, the Jayhawks are 18-4 against AP top-10 teams inside Allen Fieldhouse, 9-1 versus top-five opponents.

Nov. 14, 1997: Senior Raef LaFrentz led all scorers with 22 points as the second-ranked Jayhawks defeated Santa Clara, 99-73, inside Allen Fieldhouse. LaFrentz made eight of his 12 attempts from the field, while grabbing a game high 19 rebounds. Junior Paul Pierce scored his 1,000th career point, recording 18 for the game. Kansas also had three other players score in double figures. Billy Thomas scored 16 points, while both Ryan Robertson and Eric Chenoweth finished the game with 14 points each. KU went on to finish 35-4 in 1997-98, won the Preseason NIT, the Big 12 regular-season title with a 15-1 record and the Big 12 Tournament at Kemper Arena in Kansas City.

WINNING THE BIG 12 NO CAKEWALK

If you think KU's success in the Big 12 is due to playing in a non-competitive conference, think again. The stats show that this is anything but the case. Over the last 20 seasons, the Big 12 has proven to be one of the toughest leagues in the NCAA, making KU's run of 16 league titles since 2004 even more impressive.

Beginning in the 2003-04 season, the Big 12 has ranked as the nation's No. 1 conference in the RPI/NET rankings six times and in the top-three on 11 occasions. The Big 12 was the only league that ended the 2020-21 season with seven teams and 70 percent of its membership in the top 36 of the NCAA NET ratings.

The stoutness of the league is also highlighted by KU's strength of schedule during this stretch, which has been among the toughest every season. The Jayhawks have posted a top-10 strength of schedule 13 times in Bill Self's 20 years at KU, which includes the nation's strongest schedule six times - 2004-05, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2018-19 and last season in 2022-23.

- Kansas has 2,372 all-time victories which is the second most in NCAA Division I men's basketball history.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has won 16 regular-season Big 12 championships with just 17 losses at Allen Fieldhouse.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 766 of its last 769 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Gonzaga (102-90) on 11.26.2020 with the previous being Oklahoma (100-78) on 2.27.1990.
- Kansas set the NCAA DI record for being ranked in the Associated Press poll at 231 consecutive weeks from Feb. 2, 2009 until Feb. 1, 2021. KU's stretch consisted of 433 games of being ranked.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 23 of the last 24 seasons.
- Each four-year KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games. The current KU four-year players - graduate Michael Jankovich and redshirt senior Dajuan Harris Jr. - have won 85.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every league foe.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 365-86 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 275-179. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is top at 417-99, while Texas is second at 304-201.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 157-11 (93.5%) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 3-2 in 2018, 9-0 in 2019, 8-1 in 2020, 8-1 in 2020-21, 9-0 in 2021-22 and 8-1 in 2022-23.

MORE KANSAS NOTABLES

- On Nov. 7, Naismith Hall of Fame member Bill Self signed an amended contract with the University of Kansas. Self and KU Director of Athletics Travis Goff signed the reworked agreement — effectively a five-year extension worth \$44.5 million, including a \$1 million signing bonus.
- Kansas went 16-for-16 on free throws at Baylor on Jan. 23., 2023. That is the most free throws made in a game without a miss in program history, surpassing Dec. 9, 2015 vs. Holy Cross when KU went 12-for-12 from the free throw line.
- Kansas went 15-1 in Allen Fieldhouse each of the last two seasons (2021-22 and 2022-23). KU has won 10 or more home games for 38 of the last 39 seasons, beginning in 1983-84. KU has won 12 or more in Allen Fieldhouse for 23 of the last 24 seasons beginning in 1999-2000.
- KU won its mind-boggling 51st-straight home opener with a 99-56 win against North Carolina Central on Nov. 6. The streak began in 1973-74 under head coach Ted Owens. KU coaches Larry Brown (5-0) and Roy Williams (15-0) never lost a home opener. KU is 21-0 in home openers in the Bill Self era.
- Kansas has won 31 of its last 32 conference openers (beginning in 1991-92 under head coach Roy Williams and including 2022-23) and 30 of its last 40 Senior Nights (beginning in 1983-84 under coach Larry Brown).
- On Nov. 9, 2022, former KU guard Jacque Vaughn was named head coach of the Brooklyn Nets. He is the fourth KU graduate to coach at the highest level - John McClendon (ABA, 1969-70 at Denver); Wilt Chamberlain (ABA, 1973-74 at San Diego); Kevin Pritchard (NBA, 2005 at Portland, 27 games); Jacque Vaughn (NBA, 2012-15 at Orlando, 2022-present at Brooklyn).

BRAUN WINS NBA TITLE

Former Kansas guard Chirstian Braun became the 15th Jayhawk to win an NBA title, when the Denver Nuggets defeated the Miami Heat last June.

Braun played three seasons at Kansas from 2019-20 to 2021-22. In 2020, the Burlington, Kansas, native was named to the Big 12 All-Freshman Team and he was a 2021 all-conference honorable mention selection the following season. In Kansas' 2022 NCAA National Championship season, Braun averaged 14.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game. The two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team selection was an all-league second-team selection, and was on the all-tournament teams for the Big 12 Championship and the NCAA Tournament Midwest Regional. In his three seasons at KU, Braun played in 101 games with 74 starts and had 1,018 career points, 506 rebounds, 183 assists and 97 steals.

Braun is the fifth player in NBA history to win an NCAA title and an NBA title in back-to-back seasons. He joins Bill Russell (1956 San Francisco; 1957 Boston Celtics), Henry Bibby (1972 UCLA; 1973 New York Knicks), Magic Johnson (1979 Michigan State, 1980 L.A. Lakers) and Billy Thompson (1986 Louisville; 1987 L.A. Lakers).

With the addition of Braun, there have been 15 Jayhawks who have won 20 NBA titles during their professional careers. Braun becomes the seventh Jayhawk under head coach Bill Self to win an NBA title. He joins Wayne Simien (2006), Mario Chalmers (2012, 2013), Brandon Rush (2015), Sasha Kaun (2016), Markieff Morris (2020) and Andrew Wiggins (2022).

Braun is the fifth Kansas player to have won both an NCAA and NBA title and the fourth under Self. He joins Clyde Lovellette (1952 NCAA title), Chalmers, Rush and Kaun, who were members of the 2008 NCAA National Championship team.

Academy) and Labaron Philon (G, Mobile, Ala., Baker HS, Link [Mo.] Academy) have signed National Letters of Intent to play basketball at Kansas, KU head coach Bill Self announced Nov. 8-9. The three will be freshmen at KU for the 2024-25 season. The Kansas class ranks fourth nationally according to 247sports.com.

FLORY BIDUNGA – FR., F, 6-9, 220, DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO, KOKOMO (IND.) HS

- Is a five-star big man from the Democratic Republic of the Congo who attends Kokomo High School in Kokomo, Indiana.
- Has been described as a freak athlete who can rebound, block shots and plays above the rim.
- Was the 2022-23 Gatorade Player of the Year in Indiana where he averaged 20.2 points, 13.8 rebounds and 4.5 blocked shots last season. Additionally, he shot 81 percent from the field and led Kokomo to a 24-5 record and his team advanced to the Indiana 4A state title game.

NOTES

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 700th career game on Feb. 8, 2020, with KU's 60-46 win at TCU. He became the 31st coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat, the second youngest and the sixth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won two national championships (2008, 2022), 16 regular-season Big 12 Conference titles, including a KU- and NCAA-record-tying 13-straight titles from 2005-17, and eight league tournament titles.
- At Kansas, Self has won 16 regular-season league titles with just 17 losses in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's Kansas team won the title. Self is one of two active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won multiple national titles (Rick Pitino) and one of 16 all-time with multiple titles.
- While at Kansas, he has coached 13 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 23-win seasons in 23 of the last 25 seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 20 regular-season league crowns in the last 25 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Self's 10 career 30-win seasons are tied for third most in NCAA history - Mike Krzyzewski (16), Roy Williams (12), John Calipari (10); and is tied for No. 1 on the active coaches' list. Nine of his 10 30-win seasons have been at Kansas.
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catharines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including eight times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17-22). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
