

AWP Giving Circle Grant Program Overview

Executive Summary

Since the creation of the Giving Circle in 2007, by executive board members of the Alliance, 81 UT programs have received more than \$744,000 from the collective effort of the circle's members. Grounded in its mission to change lives and instill leadership, the Alliance Giving Circle desires to enhance what it has started and support more initiatives of instruction, research, outreach, and fundraising of UT students, faculty, and alumni.

Every gift counts. All Alliance general members are able to contribute, in any amount, to the Giving Circle. When pooled together, these gifts cause a ripple effect throughout the university that will forever shape our community and state. Grants range up to \$25,000 and are awarded to the most innovative and deserving applicants annually.

Impact

In 2024 the Alliance awarded over \$40,000 in grants across the UT System to innovative programs that help advance the university's mission to serve all Tennesseans and beyond through education, discovery and outreach that enables strong economic, social and environmental well-being.



UTC received **\$11,676** to establish an aging in place home environment teaching laboratory. This project cultivates excellence in innovation and advocacy for older populations.

UTK & UTHCS Audiology and Speech Pathology received **\$8,000** for inclusive play equipment to support patients with special needs and to help reinforce treatment strategies.

UT Martin Veterinary Science received **\$16,000** for realistic canine and bovine models to enhance handson skills practice while reducing unnecessary live animal examinations. UT Chattanooga received **\$4,687** to curate a library collections of stress and anxiety management tools to improve access to mental health resources on campus

Eligible Applicants

Faculty, staff, departments, and university-recognized student organizations from any University of Tennessee campus or unit are eligible to apply. Additionally, organizations with a formal relationship with the following entities may also apply:

- University of Tennessee Institute for Public Service
- University of Tennessee Space Institute
- University of Tennessee Institute of Agriculture
- University of Tennessee Alumni Association

The Alliance Executive Board is dedicated to supporting transformative ideas by awarding grants to the most innovative and deserving applicants. We seek proposals that challenge conventional approaches and inspire new solutions to pressing needs. With funding ranging from \$2,500 to \$25,000, we aim to empower visionary projects and programs that demonstrate creativity, impact, and potential for meaningful change. Whether an ongoing initiative or a groundbreaking one-time event, eligible proposals should exemplify forward-thinking strategies that advance our mission and leave a lasting legacy.

Prohibited uses of funding includes any of the following activities or expenditures:

- General operating expenses or overhead, including faculty salaries
- Grants to benefit only one individual
- Endowment funding
- Interim or bridge funding

Timeline

Faculty members are <u>required</u> to submit their grant application to the UT Research Foundation's Office of Sponsored Programs via Cayuse SP by Wednesday, February 19, 2025.

The Office of Sponsored Programs will review to ensure application criteria has been met and will submit the proposal to the Alliance by 5:00 P.M. EST on Wednesday, February 26, 2025.

Grant Recipients

The AWP will publicly announce all grant recipients at their annual Women & Philanthropy Symposium on Friday, April 25, 2025 at the Pavilion at Hunter Valley Farms in Knoxville, TN

If your project/program is selected for funding you will be invited to record a short (2 minute) impact statement describing your project the week of April 7-11 to be shared in compilation with other winners at the Symposium. Representatives from all winning programs will also be invited to attend the Symposium to be recognized for their work.

Funding Process

To ensure transparency and accountability, the Alliance will distribute funds in two phases to align with the project's goals. The first half of your grant funding will be transferred to your designated UT restricted account after you submit your mid-project progress report. The remaining funds will be transferred into your account after you submit your final project at the end of your program/project.

- Grant recipients will be asked to fill out an acceptance form by June 28, 2025
- Mid-Project Progress Report will be due on or before December 13, 2025
- Final Progress Report (on or before May 31, 2026)

In some cases, it will make sense for us to deviate from this schedule, but a report will be required *prior* to the distribution of funds. Funding extensions may be considered for projects demonstrating significant progress and continued impact, subject to the approval of the Alliance Executive Board
