

Waterbury Reservoir



-Remote Campsites are available only with advance reservation. Visit VTStateParks.com or call 888-409-7579 to book. Reservations must be made no less than 24hrs in advance. Vacant Remote Campsites may not be used without a reservation.

-All campers must check-in with park staff immediately upon arrival. **Text message 802-585-4855 to check-in.**

-Check-in time is 2pm, Check-out is 11am. Remove all gear and equipment, leaving no trace of your stay.

-Camp only at designated sites. Keep your site clean. Keep all food and garbage out of reach of animals.

-**Firewood** - To help slow/prevent invasive species spread, only packaged, labeled, heat-treated firewood may be brought in. Left-over wood must be taken with you. You may only gather firewood that is dead, down and distant. **Cutting down standing trees, alive or dead, is punishable by law.** The use of cookstoves is strongly encouraged. **Chainsaws are not allowed.**

-Refrain from cutting any vegetation, peeling bark or otherwise damaging trees.

-Fires are allowed only in the fire ring provided. **Leave no fire unattended** and make sure the fire is out before you leave. Do not alter, move or build fire rings. Do not incinerate garbage. -Do not soap or rinse yourself, clothing or dishes within 150 feet from any stream, pond, lake or water source.

-Use the composting toilet to protect others and the water from waste. Review the posted usage of composting toilets.

-To protect wildlife and respect other visitors, keep pets under control at all times.

-**Quiet hours are from 10pm to 7am.** Maintain reasonable quiet at all times, remembering sound carries easily over water. Report excess noise to park staff immediately.

Day Use	Other Rules and Guidelines
<p>-Day Use areas are open from sunrise to sunset. No overnight camping allowed.</p> <p>-Fires are allowed only at designated day use sites and within the fire ring provided. (see map) Leave no fire unattended and make sure the fire is out before you leave.</p> <p>-Carry In/Carry Out all food, gear and garbage. Keep food out of animal's reach. Leave no trace.</p> <p>-Day Use areas may not be reserved. All day use areas are public, shared spaces.</p> <p>-Firewood brought in must be heat-treated and labeled. Gather only dead, down and distant firewood from the forest.</p>	<p>-No firecrackers or other explosive devices, firearms, air rifles/pistols, gas weapons, paintball guns, slingshots, crossbows, bows and arrows or similar devices shall be discharged.</p> <p>-If a composting toilet is not available, dig a hole 8 inches deep, 150 feet from water, trails or campsites. Mix waste with soil and leaf litter.</p> <p>-Sport hunting is allowed during regular hunting seasons, but fire-arms must not be discharged within 500 feet of any park structure.</p> <p>-Glass containers are not allowed in swimming areas and alcoholic beverages in containers larger than one gallon are not permitted.</p>
