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



SUBJECT ADDENDNUM TO ADD PH 160 INTRODUCTION TO PUBLIC HEALTH IN THE ASCC CATALOG 2016-2018

1. The new course will provide a transferrable Program Requirement Option course for the Associate of Science Degree in Health Sciences. (Refer to the attachment)

CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a public health inquiry course which centers on health promotion and disease prevention. Emphasis is placed on personal, community, and population health, and its interdisciplinary connections to other health care fields. Biomedical research ethics, critical thinking and analysis of public health problems that may affect the health and well-being of the individual and community will be introduced and discussed.
