✓ Complete six credit hours from the following. Courses must be from two departments. A-H 103 World Art; ANT 130 Introduction to Comparative Religion; ANT 160 Cultural Diversity in the Modern World; GEO 152 Regional Geography of the World; GEO 160 Lands and Peoples of the Non-Western World; HIS 104 A History of Europe through the Mid-17th Century; HIS 105 A History of Europe from the Mid- 17th Century to the Present; PS 210 Introduction to Comparative Politics; PS 212 Culture and Politics in the Third World; PS 235 World Politics; TA 171 World Theatre I.

◇ 6 hours of 'free' electives - that do not count toward any other requirement - must be taken. Additional electives may be required to reach the required minimum of 120 hours. Consider pursuing a 2nd major or minor.
