

SPORT GROUNDFISH What can I keep and how many?

Effective as of January 1, 2025. Regulations can change in the middle of the season, so be sure to check myodfw.com/fishing/marine-zone for the most up-to-date regulations and bag limits before you go fishing.



Any vessel fishing for or possessing bottomfish, Pacific halibut, or flatfish in the ocean must have a <u>functional descending device</u> onboard, regardless of depth. You are required to use it on any rockfish released outside (seaward) of the 30-fathom regulatory line.



• Anglers may keep <u>one</u> general marine fish daily bag limit of up to <u>4</u> fish on a bottomfish trip and do a separate <u>offshore longleader</u> trip on the same day, but fish must be offloaded in between trips and may total <u>no more than <u>10</u> general marine species per day.</u>
