



Invitation to the 23rd Session of the Committee on Forestry
and the 5th World Forest Week

Rome, Italy, 18-22 July 2016

Reply requested by 17 June 2016

The Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations has the honour to extend an invitation to attend the 23rd Session of the Committee on Forestry (COFO), which will be held at FAO Headquarters in Rome from 18 to 22 July 2016. The meeting will open on Monday 18 July at 10.00 hours. Registration of participants will take place from 14.00 hours on Sunday 17 July and from 08.00 hours on Monday 18 July at the Turkish Registration Centre, Building A.

The 23rd Session of COFO will be the main event of the 5th World Forest Week which will focus on the role of forests in implementing major global decisions, in particular the 2030 Agenda and the Paris Agreement, and will feature, in addition to COFO, a number of events sponsored by FAO partners and Members.

The Session is being convened under the provisions of Article V-6 of the FAO Constitution and is open to members of the Committee and to observers. Expenses incurred in connection with attendance at the Session and travel of representatives and observers shall be borne by the governments or organizations concerned.

The Session will be conducted in Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Russian and Spanish.

The Director-General would appreciate being informed by 17 June 2016 of the names, official titles and addresses of the observers designated to attend the 23rd Session, by e-mail to: COFO-2016@fao.org. Observer delegates are advised to register in advance of the meeting by completing the registration form available at <http://www.fao.org/forestry/57758/en/> and forwarding it to the above-mentioned email account, together with a recent passport-size digital photograph.

Participants requiring visas must obtain these from the Italian Consulate or competent Diplomatic Mission in their country before leaving for Rome. Visa applications must be submitted well in advance of departure, as three weeks or more may be required for an Italian visa to be issued. Exclusively those participants traveling from a country where there is no Italian Consulate or other competent Diplomatic Mission may obtain a visa on arrival in Rome, provided that they advise the Secretariat of the meeting of their full name, date of birth, nationality, passport number, issue and expiry dates, flight number, date and hour of arrival and their full travel itinerary, which must not include any other Schengen country. This information must reach FAO at least three weeks before the arrival of participants to permit FAO to request that a visa be issued at Rome airport. Participants failing to comply with the above will not be allowed to enter Italy by the Italian authorities.
