

Pastoralist Knowledge Hub

Bringing pastoral voices to the global stage

The Hub brings together pastoralists and international actors to ensure that **pastoralists' concerns** are integrated into the international policy dialogue. It is the first comprehensive initiative to attempt this.

Several hundred million pastoralists worldwide rely on a rich legacy of traditional knowledge and mobility to survive in some of the harshest environments on the planet. They produce meat, milk and fibre, as well as providing essential ecosystem services. Yet they are often misunderstood, marginalized and excluded from decisions that affect them.

The Hub gives them a voice. It enables pastoralists to connect, to meet and to discuss issues like the loss of rangeland or the disruption of their migration routes.

Through the Hub, they can find shared solutions to common challenges.



Pastoralists manage rangelands that cover about a third of the Earth's land surface. Yet they are still poorly represented when decisions are made by international bodies or by national governments.

The **Hub** enables pastoralists and their representatives to meet, discuss and voice their concerns to the international community.

The Hub is coordinated by FAO.

The Hub is a tool to support pastoralists in establishing a mechanism – transparent, inclusive and democratic – for pastoralists to nominate their own representatives at global forums such as the Committee on World Food Security.

The Hub organizes meetings and thematic discussion groups of pastoralists in Africa, Latin America, Asia, the Near East and Europe where they can discuss issues such as food sovereignty, land tenure, environmental issues, pastoral culture and organization.
