Presentation of "The 1billionhungry project" Petition

At the end of the Council's deliberation this morning a ceremony will take place in the Red Room to present formally "The Ibillionhungry project" petition. This advocacy campaign was first launched by the Director-General on the eve of the World Summit on Food Security (Rome, November 2009). The petition calls on national and international leaders to push hunger to the top of the political agenda. Over the course of the past six months, in coordination with this year's "United against Hunger" World Food Day activities, the campaign resulted in almost three million people signing the petition.
