

## 567 IAC Chapter 100 - Scope of Title, Definitions, Rules of Practice (Final Draft, July 2024)

*\*The purpose of this document is to identify proposed revisions and to indicate where provisions from [567 IAC 100](#) and [567 IAC 102](#) have been incorporated within the proposed rulemaking. For ease of use, the DNR is focusing on substantive revisions within this document, and will not individually highlight minor revisions made for solely for clarification purposes.*

Types of permits	102.2	<b>567—102.2(455B) Types of permits.</b>	100.4	<p><b>100.4(1) Sanitary disposal project permit.</b> Revisions include extending the permitting timeframe beyond three years to align with how sanitary disposal project (SDP) permits are currently being issued. It was also clarified that the DNR may conduct an inspection of SDPs as part of renewal, rather than mandating it, which is not supported by statute or current practice.</p> <p><b>100.4(2) Solid waste management permit.</b> This permit type was added to clarify the distinction between SDPs and the regulations that specifically apply to them, and other solid waste and recycling permits the DNR has specific regulatory authority to issue. Historically, the DNR grouped most permits under the heading of SDP, which is not supported by statutory authority, and which at times, inaccurately placed requirements upon non-SDPs (e.g., financial assurance).</p> <p><b>100.4(3) Developmental permit.</b> This permit type was left unchanged except for the inclusion of solid waste management permits.
