





Kentucky Sheep and Fiber Festival (KSFF)



The Kentucky Sheep and Fiber Festival was started in 2009 and has held 13 Annual Festivals in Lexington, Kentucky at Masterson Station Park. In 2023 21 workshops were conducted covering a variety of fiber art skills and fiber production courses. The event had 67 vendors from all over the country with over 25% of those being from Kentucky. The Woolery, a local company, sponsored the event and hosted 12 demonstrations. Wool, alpaca and angora competitions were held with sales of the fleeces for local producers. The event boasted the highest gate count since 2020.

EDUCATION IMPACT

The Kentucky Sheep and Goat Development Office offers several online, self-paced courses, as well as in person clinics to help producers enhance their operation. The results speak for themselves!

KY Small Ruminant Grazing School: 100% of participants felt more confident about forage management and in choosing and establishing forages in their operations

KY Master Small Ruminant Nutrition: 100% of participants felt more knowledgeable about small ruminant nutrition and meeting the nutritional needs of their small ruminants



EDUCATION IMPACT CONT.



KY Master Small Ruminant Genetics: 100% of participants plan to make genetic changes to their flocks/herds based on breed traits learned in the course and all felt more knowledgeable about breeding systems

Basics of Small Ruminant Parasite Management: 100% of participants became more knowledgeable about parasites and more confident with treatment options

Parasitology Clinics: 100% of participants felt more knowledgeable about fecal testing, 96% participants planned to incorporate new practices taught from the clinics, and 100% participants believed they could improve the health of their flock/herd

Hoof Trimming Clinics: 100% of participants felt more familiar with hoof problems and more confident in preventing and treating hoof problems

100% of participants learned conformation traits to look for in replacement stock



93% identified records to keep in their flock/herd


