

PART 1: JOINT STAFF SECURITY AGREEMENT

1. I understand that by virtue of my duties within the Joint Staff, I may be the recipient of classified material or become knowledgeable of the categories of information indicated below. The loss or compromise of such material could result in exceptionally grave damage to the security of the United States. I have read excerpts of the Espionage Act and understand my responsibilities to safeguard such information.

2. Because of the extreme sensitivity of the classified information for which I will be responsible, I certify that I will not communicate, transmit, or disclose in any manner such information, except in the performance of my official duties and as authorized by competent authority.

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PART 2: SECURITY TERMINATION STATEMENT
