


# The Notecard Detail View *explained*

2. New notecards can be added from the Tabletop View or Sources screen.
3. View/hide notecard comments.
4. Detail View is the active view.
5. Notecards are grouped by pile.
6. Notecards are indented relative to pile title.
7. Click a notecard to view/hide its contents (eye icon indicates notecard is displayed).
8. Drag notecards from viewing area into the outline as needed.
9. Edit the notecard.
