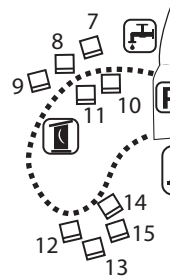

Shaftsbury State Park

Welcome to Shaftsbury State Park, and 84-acre property surrounding picturesque Lake Shaftsbury. The park offers both day and overnight recreation. A full-service day use area and a rustic group camping area are available. There is also a beautiful, fully furnished lakeside cottage available for rental on a weekly basis.

Picnicking, swimming, sunbathing, wildlife watching, boating and fishing are popular activities at Shaftsbury. Anglers can catch largemouth bass, yellow perch, bluegills, pumpkinseed, sunfish, rock bass, and brook trout. Trout fishing is best in the spring months. Boats with gas motors are not allowed on the lake.

Like much of Vermont, the town of Shaftsbury has a rich history. It was chartered on August 20, 1761. The first recorded instance of the Underground Railroad in Vermont occurred in Shaftsbury in June 1843 when escaped slaves passed through and hid at a local farm.

In the 19th century the area was known as the Vermont Healing Springs. Mineral water from the wet meadows was bottled and sold for its healing properties. The meadow was later flooded and created a pond which powered a lumber mill for logs harvested from the surrounding forest.

The park property has been a recreation destination since the early 20th century. Overnight tourism to the property began with the construction of the Lake Shaftsbury Inn and Bungalows. The property then became Camp Avalon, a girls' summer camp. In the 1920's, it was developed into a summer resort and campground. The property was purchased by the State of Vermont in 1974 establishing Shaftsbury State Park.
