


- → Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect

Winter Storm Headlines

Tonight through Saturday morning



- Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect for the majority of Eastern North Carolina.
- An advisory is for a nuisance snow or ice event.
- A warning is for a more impactful snow or ice event.

What We Know

- Highest threat for snow and ice will be inland from the coast
- The majority of the event will occur tonight through early Saturday morning


Precipitation Type Snow Snow/Ice/Sleet	Rain	None

Expected Storm Total Ice

Tonight through Saturday morning




- Biggest impact overnight tonight.
- Heavier icing is <u>MOST</u>
 <u>LIKELY</u> the farther
 NORTH and WEST you live.
- A small amount of ice can have a big impact, especially on bridges and overpasses.



Expected Storm Total Snowfall

This includes both snow and sleet



- Biggest impact overnight tonight.
- Heavier snow is <u>MOST</u>
 <u>LIKELY</u> the farther
 NORTH and WEST you live.
- Accumulating snow and ice possible on roads due to our continued stretch of very cold air.

Ice and Snow, Take it Slow

70% of snow and ice-related injuries occur in automobiles

Leave extra space between you and the vehicle in front of you
