The NOAA Seattle Regional Library provides library services to about 1,200 NOAA employees and contractors in the Western region, including Washington, Oregon, California, Alaska, Hawaii and Idaho. The Library supports research in the areas of meteorology, physical and chemical oceanography, marine biology, geochemistry, atmospheric physics, ocean engineering, mathematics, statistics and computer science. Library facilities include comfortable working areas with views of Lake Washington, a copy machine, a microfilm reader-printer and two public access PCs with a high-speed Internet connection.

Finding Materials

• **Databases & Citation Indexes**

Search online for articles in databases such as ISI Web of Knowledge, Aquatic Science & Fisheries Abstracts and Meteorological & Geostrophysical Abstracts

• **Journals Database**

Look for print and online journals held by the NOAA Seattle Regional Library, the National Marine Mammals Laboratory Library and the Northwest and Alaska Fisheries Science Center Library

• **NOAALINC Catalog**

Search for items held by 35 NOAA libraries across the United States

• **WorldCat**

Find books and reports available for interlibrary loan that are not found in the NOAA Library Catalog

• **Current Awareness**

Receive tables of contents from journals in your field of research via e-mail



Getting Materials

• **Photocopy Services**

Order copies of articles from the library's print journal collection free of charge

• **Interlibrary Loans**

Request books or articles from other NOAA libraries or from libraries outside of NOAA

• **Courier Service to the UW**

Request books or journal articles from the University of Washington's collection. Trips are made on Wednesday mornings.
