


Wintery Weather Continues

Snow Impacts through Wednesday morning

Key Messages:

- **Update:** Wind River Basin now under an Advisory.
- The snow graphics on slides 3 and 4 are additional amounts beginning at 6 PM this evening.
- Snow continues through this evening, decreasing after midnight for most locations.
- Elevations below 7,000 ft: Rain/snow mix or snow with light accumulations during daylight hours. Snow will accumulate more efficiently after sunset, though will become lighter as the evening progresses for most locations.
- Mountains and Mountain Passes: Additional snowfall amounts after sunset of 4 to 8 inches across most areas, 6 to 12 inches in highest peaks of the Wind River Mountains, Owl Creek and Bridger Mountains, and eastern Absarokas. Casper Mountain is favored to see 12 to 18 inches of additional snow.
- Gusty north winds will occur through this evening, decreasing after midnight.

Snow amounts have generally increased since our last update. There is still quite a bit of uncertainty regarding amounts where there is a sharp accumulation gradient, notably in the Casper and Lander areas. Snow banding this afternoon and evening will also play a big role.

Confidence remains high on the timing, with snowfall rates decreasing for most late this evening into the early-morning hours. The exception will be in the Casper area which is likely to see light to moderate snow continue through Wednesday morning.





Chance of at least 1" of Additional Snow


Chance of at least 4" of Additional Snow






Low and High End Snowfall Amounts
