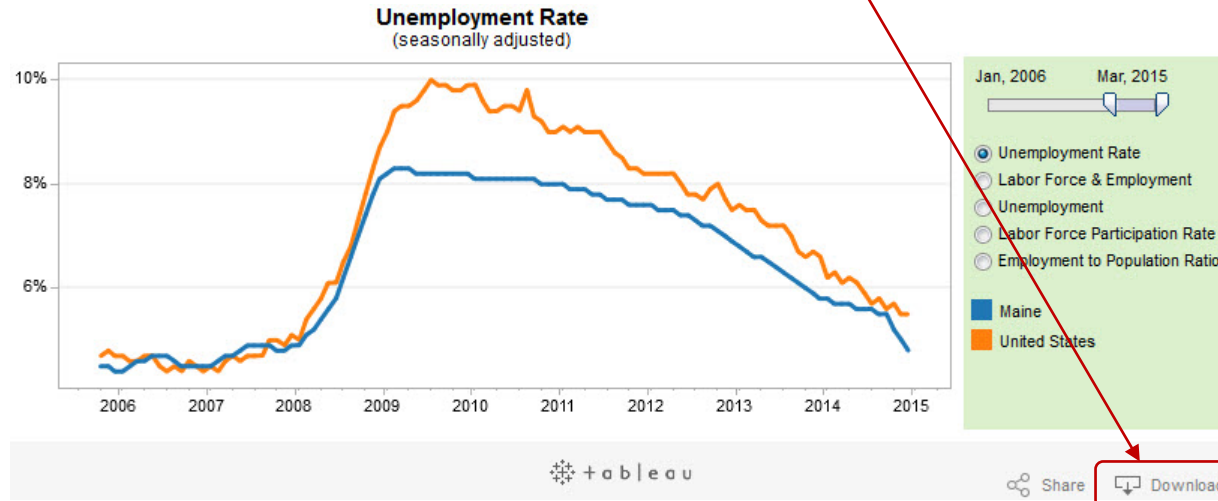
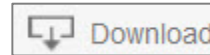


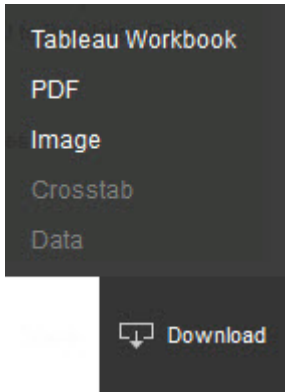
Exporting Data from Tableau Visualizations



Look for the **Download symbol** at the bottom right of the visualization



Active filters are applied to exported data



Clicking on the Download symbol will show all options

If the Crosstab and Data options are inactive/greyed out, click on a data point in the chart or table and then click on it a second time to deselect the data point.

This feature allows anyone with Tableau to review and extend the analytic work that was behind the original workbook.	Best when not needing to make changes to visualization. Can be used to export sheets, dashboards or workbooks.	Best when not needing to make changes to visualization and placing into a presentation or document.	Best to directly download data for analysis or make own visualization.	Best for viewing data only in a simple table and not needing to use data elsewhere.

This option allows user to choose a variety of layouts: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Portrait/Landscape Paper size and scale <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Many times selecting "At most 1 page wide" gives the best results One or more dashboards or workbooks (if applicable) 	Choosing this option will allow you to save <i>entire visualization</i> as a BMP, JPG, PNG or EMF (Windows only).	Choosing this option allows you to download data as a CSV or Excel file. <p>Each chart or table will need to be chosen and each data set will be exported separately.</p>	Choosing this option will display a web page which shows a table of the data.
