# **Freshman Eligibility**



#### **A-G Courses**

Complete UC-approved A-G courses with a "C" or better. Refer to **hs-articulation.ucop.edu/guide** for in-depth details.

A. History/social science: 2 years

B. English: 4 years

C. Mathematics: 3 years (4 recommended)

D. Science: 2 years (3 recommended)

E. Language other than English: 2 years (3 recommended)

F. Visual/performing arts: 1 year

G. College preparatory elective: 1 year beyond the

minimum A-F courses required

UC is test-free. UCSB will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions or scholarship decisions.

# **Grade Point Average (GPA)**

Earn a weighted **3.0 minimum GPA (3.4 for nonresidents)** in A-G courses. Grades from A-G subjects in the 10th-11th grades (including summer work) are used to calculate the UC GPA.

# **Transfer Eligibility**



#### **Seven-Course Pattern**

Complete the seven-course pattern requirement with a "C" or better:

- A. Two courses in English composition (UC-E)
- **B.** One course in mathematics beyond intermediate algebra, such as college algebra, precalculus or statistics (UC-M)
- **C.** Four courses from at least two of the following areas:
  - Arts and humanities (UC-H)
  - ▶ Behavioral and social sciences (UC-B)
  - ► Biological and physical sciences (UC-S)



### **Transferable Credit**

Complete **60 semester/90 quarter units** of UC-transferable credit with at least a 2.4 GPA for California residents (2.8 for nonresidents). A selective GPA for most majors is 3.4 and above.


