For many years, we have struggled with how to consistently communicate to the ASABE Foundation the funding needs that are identified by the membership and Board of Trustees. The Foundation has done an excellent Board of Trustees. Distinguished Lecture Series Presented at AETC

The latest installment of the ASABE Distinguished Lecture Series, a highlight of the 2017 Agricultural Equipment Technology Conference in Louisville, Kentucky, is now available on the ASABE Technical Library.

"Increased Deflection Agricultural Radial Tires Following the Tire and Rim Association IF, VF, and IF/CFO Load and Inflation Standards," was presented by Bradley J. Harris, Firestone Agricultural Solutions, Des Moines, Iowa.

The Lectures Series was developed by the Machinery Systems committee (MS-47) of ASABE to provide in-depth design resource information for engineers in agricultural industry. New Ethics Competition Committee Formed

ASABE currently offers two ethics-based competitions: the Ag & Bio Ethics Essay competition and the Ethics Video competition, each of which has been operating for the last several years on an ad noc basis. To bring them in line with ASABE's other competitions, and give them permanency, a new committee has been formed for oversight, P-128 Engineering Ethics Competition Committee. The competitions exist to enhance and nurture ethical perspectives.

There are two competition formats available to participants, each with separate rules, entries, and judging formats. Both have an April 15 entry deadline.

The <u>Ag & Bio Essay Competition</u> is a 1,500-word essay on an ethics topic impacting the practice of professions related to agricultural and biological engineering, systems, or technology. The top three entrants are selected from the written submissions to summarize their paper at the ASABE annual meeting. This competition is open to members of ASABE and the Institute of Biological Engineering.

The <u>Ethics Video Competition</u> format is a five-minute (or less) video that describes an ethical issue faced by agricultural and biological engineers in practice or research. The top three entries are selected from the video submissions to moderate and participate in a session at the ASABE annual meeting. The session will feature playback and ethical discussion of video entries.

In Memoriam - William Chancellor



ASABE Fellow William Chancellor, Davis, Calif., pas away peacefully on February 16, surrounded by his family. He was 85 years old.

Chancellor received a bachelor of engineering degree from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, and masters and doctoral degrees from Cornell University. He joined the University of California-Davis in 1957, and he worked and

University of California-Javis in 1957, and ne worked and taught topics relating to soil mechanics, soil-machine relations, vehicle stability and traction, forage harvesting and handling, rice production and processing, economic optimization of farm equipment use, agricultural technology for developing nations, energy relations in agricultural production, and many others. He was a global authority on smallholder-farm mechanization. Following on his early interests in information theory, he was one of the first to recognize the interconnection and substitutability of information and energy in developing more advanced, efficient, and sustainable food production systems.

With an encyclopedic knowledge of everything in the agricultural engineering field,

and many other fields as well, he was also the author of a pioneering searchable database of articles and other information that earned him a Presidential Citation from ASABE in 1996. He held a deep concern for the needs and welfare of his students, who have continued his work and influence around the world. Few would have noticed his retirement, in 1994 after 37 years with the university, as he remained a notable presence in the department and on campus, and if approached for advice or assistance, selflessly provided the benefit of his experience, insight,

Chancellor was the recipient of numerous awards serving as testament to the wide recognition and significance of his work, including election to the National Academy of Engineering in 2005. In honor of his great service to the campus, he was recently informed he would be presented with the UC-Davis Medal.

Chancellor was a brilliant scholar, teacher, and mentor. His passing is a great loss for the department and the University. He is survived by his wife and daughter and the rest of his family and friends who have been steadfast in their support.

He was a 63-year member of ASABE.

In Memoriam - James H. Ebbinghaus



ASABE Fellow James H. Ebbinghaus, PE, 91, of Lake Barrington, Ill., passed away peacefully February 7, 2017.

Born December 4, 1925, in Vincennes, Ind., Ebbinghaus graduated from Purdue University in 1955 with an agricultural engineering degree. He served his country proudly in the Air Force. Raised on a farm, agriculture and its equipment was the focus of his professional life. Ebbinghaus was vice president of the Association of Equipment Manufacturers and served a 40-plus-year executive career in the farm equipment industry. Active in ASABE, he was especially proud of his part in developing safety standards.

Ebbinghaus is survived by his wife of 65 years, Mary, and four children: David (Rosann), Donald (Ruth), Janet (Douglas) Wisniewski, Joyce (Kent) Johannsen. Grandchildren Jeffrey (Rachel), Deborah, Elora, Madison, Christopher, and Austialso survive. He was preceded in death by his parents, sister Nanoy, sister Ellen (Richard Winner), and brother Richard. A memorial service will be held Saturday, March 11, at 11:00 a.m. at Community Presbyterian Church, Mount Prospect, Ill. The family suggests memorial contributions be sent to Special Olympics or Community Presbyterian Church.

He was a 56-year member of ASABE.
