From the Executive Director



Inspired by the Women's March that was held earlier this year, three scientists launched the idea of holding a <u>March for Science</u> on April 22. The idea is gaining a lot of traction, and a number of organizations, primarily in the scientific community, are strongly supporting this effort to voice the critical role that science plays in our lives. April 22 is also Earth Day, and the plan is to co-locate marches in many communities with established Earth Day activities, such as teach-ins, rallies, and musical performances.

The organizers state that science protects our air and water, preserves our planet, saves lives with medical

treatments, creates new industries, puts food on our tables, educates the next generation, and safeguards our future. The mission is to champion robustly funded and publicly communicated science as a pillar of human freedom and prosperity, and to unite as a diverse, nonpartisan group to call for science that upholds the common good, and for political leaders and policy makers to enact evidence-based policies in the public interest.

The flagship March for Science will take place in Washington, D.C., and nearly 400 satellite marches are planned all over the world. The organizers encourage anyone interested in creating a satellite march to let them know through the website. ASABE has no official position on the March for Science. However, as a member of a professional society for research and engineering, you should be aware of this activity and decide whether or not to participate.

Student Honor Awards - Entries due April 20, 2017



Hoy Earns Holling Family Award for Teaching Excellence

ASABE Fellow Roger Hoy, professor in the Department of Biological Systems Engineering at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln, was among the recipients of the Holling Family Award for Teaching Excellence. The annual award honors outstanding teaching in the Institute of Agriculture and Natural Resources at the university.

Hoy has served as a professor, and director of the Nebraska Tractor Test Laboratory, for over a decade. At any point in time, Hoy employs 30 to 35 undergraduate students from the College of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources and the College of Engineering. Besides providing students with structured opportunities to apply classroom knowledge to real-world problems, Hoy develops strong mentoring relationships with his students, which in many cases continue beyond graduation.

The Holling Family award program for teaching excellence was made possible by a gift from the Holling family to honor their pioneer parents. John Holling was a 1912 electrical engineering graduate of the University of Nebraska - Lincoln and his brother, Gustave Holling, attended the College of Agriculture before farming the family's land in the Wood River Area.
