

## EFAP Biennial Meeting Ballot Tool: Voting in New Food Pantries

Participation in Emergency Food Assistance Program (EFAP) requires that an interested Food Pantry not be providing duplicative services to those of another participating Food Pantry. Interested parties present on the Food Pantry services they provide in their community to current participating Food Pantries and the Lead Agency.

All voting agencies must vote whether the applicant is providing duplicative services (see EFAP Biennial Meeting Handout, AGR-131). If otherwise eligible, this is the only grounds by which an interested party may be denied entry into EFAP as a Food Pantry. If based on the contents of the presentation, duplication of service has been determined, the voting agency must provide a justification for its decision. The Lead Agency must collect this form and submit it to Food Assistance (FA) along with the Lead Agency EFAP Application and meeting minutes.
