Businesses & Individuals

Licensing Timeline

October

 DATCP mails renewal packet.



December 31

License expires.

Applications received after
 Dec. 31 must pay a 20% late fee.
 *Account for delivery time by post office.

January 1

- New license year begins.
- You need your license to operate.

Individual Commercial Applicators License

- Commercial pesticide applicator certification is required.
- For-hire applicators must be employed at a licensed business.
- Apply online at https://mydatcp.wi.gov or by paper application.
- Six-diait license number.

Fee: \$40 License Fee +

Reciprocal Individual Commercial Applicator Certification & License

 Must be certified in an equivalent category by your home state's pesticide lead agency. Check out our website for further guidance.

- Allow extra time to obtain paperwork from your state pesticide lead agency.
- Apply online at https://mydatcp.wi.gov or mail a paper application.
- Alternative: Certify in Wisconsin and obtain a Wisconsin commercial applicator

\$115 License Fee + \$5 ACCP Surcharge

Dealer/Distributor of Restricted Use Pesticide (RUP) License

- Only required of businesses that distribute RUPs.
- RUP Reporting must be submitted prior to issuing a license. (Renewals only)
- Paper application and fee must be mailed.
- No online option or credit card payments.

Fee: \$60 License Fee + \$10 ACCP Surcharge

Commercial Pesticide Business License

Please see note below to see if Bulk Storage Surcharge applies to you

- Businesses must employ certified AND licensed applicators.
- You may apply for your business and applicator licenses at the same time.
- Paper application and fee must be mailed.
- No online option or credit card payments at this time.
- Required for each business location.

\$70 License Fee +
\$10 ACCP Surcharge +
\$12.50 ACCP Bulk Storage Surcharge*

*Note: "Bulk pesticide" means liquid pesticide in a container larger than 55 gallons or solid pesticide in undivided quantities greater than 100 pounds.

Pesticide Applicator Certification

- Purchase training material from the UW PAT Program
- Once you have the training material, you can sign up for an exam.

DATCP Testing Options

- Schedule an <u>exam</u> at no charge at one of our six proctored locations.
- Computer-based testing with <u>Pearson</u>
 <u>Vue</u>. Exams can be taken at one of
 their 54 locations or from anywhere
 online via a web camera-enabled
 computer.*
 - * Must meet Pearson Vue's internet and computer system requirements.
- Certification is good for five years.
 Adding additional categories during that period does NOT extend the expiration date.
- You MUST have your six-digit PAT number prior to taking the exam.

Address or Name Change?

- Use current addresses and names on license application forms.
- Notify the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) if an applicator address or name changes during the license year.
 - *Renewal notices are sent to the address DATCP has on file.

Reminders

- To apply pesticides commercially in Wisconsin, you need three things:
 - 1. Certified in a specific category.
 - 2. Individual Commercial Applicators License (ICAL).
 - 3. Work for OR own a licensed Pesticide Business (PBL).
