The Palm Beach County Library System is pleased to announce the grand opening of the Canyon Branch Library. The community is invited to take part in the celebration happening on Jan 11, 2025.

This project is many years in the making, with the official planning for the new library branch started in 2019. Thanks to the support from the Board of County Commissioners, County Administration, the Library Advisory Board, the Friends of the Palm Beach County Library System, the outstanding Library staff and supporters in the community, the Canyon Branch is completed and ready to serve Palm Beach County.

In celebration of this momentous occasion, there will be an official opening ceremony held at 10:00 am on Sat, Jan 11, 2025.

Festivities will include:

- Speeches and a Ribbon Cutting
- Artist talk with Brad Goldberg, designer of the "Opening Minds" columns that grace the building's entrance.
- Music and delicious snacks.
- Live demos of the CreationStation and MakerSpace.
- Meet & greet with Dewey the Library Owl.
- Children's show with performer Suzy Hammer.

This branch serves Palm Beach County residents in the community encompassing the unincorporated area west of Boynton Beach surrounding the Canyon Town Center, which includes the region west of Jog Road, south of Hypoluxo Road, east of State Road 7 and north of Valencia Bay.

The new branch is remarkably spacious, totaling 33,321 square feet. The building is airy and has flexible spaces that encourage collaboration and inspiration. Although it's not the largest branch in the library system, Canyon does boast the largest meeting room at 3,682 square feet. One of the unique features of this branch are the dividable meeting spaces. The large meeting room and the collaborative room space have walls that easily transform the areas from one room to two. With this kind of flexibility, the branch can accommodate multiple groups of users both large and small.

In addition to being a brand new building, Canyon also has total of 44 new computer workstations. These computers are spread out between the adult, children and teen spaces ensuring plenty of access for all members. To go along with the computers, the branch also has a two high quality printer/copiers available for use.

This branch also fuels creativity with the inclusion of a CreationStation and MakerSpace. The CreationStation is a digital media lab and recording studio where you can create multimedia content using: iMac computers, video cameras, light kits, a green screen, sound recording and editing equipment, photo scanners and more. Members can explore 3D printing, sound engineering, videography, recording a podcast or develop a digital painting masterpiece with the free all access CreationStation studio. The MakerSpace is where members can work on crafting projects of all kinds. This space includes five sewing machines and a Cricut® enabling members to expand their creative endeavors. From knitting and crocheting to jewelry making, upcycle DIYs and more, this bright space is an excellent place for members to collaborate, create and find inspiration.

Not only is the Canyon Branch conveniently located in the Canyon Town Center plaza, it also features an adjoining drive-up service window and return drop box. Members in a hurry can pick-up holds and return items from the comfort of their vehicle.

Library Director Douglas Crane stated, "My thanks goes to all our Library staff, stakeholders and sponsors for their dedication and work complete for the opening of the Canyon Branch. This new location embodies our commitment to providing accessible, innovative and engaging spaces for all. 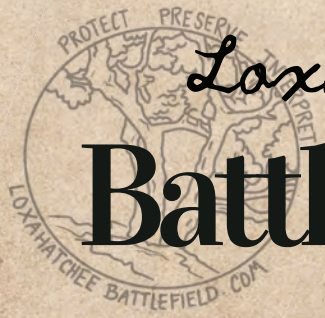

Recognizing **HUMAN TRAFFICKING** in Palm Beach County



January is Human Trafficking Awareness Month. Human trafficking is a serious issue that affects communities across the nation, including Palm Beach County. It involves the exploitation of individuals through force, fraud, or coercion for the purposes of labor or sexual exploitation. Recognizing the signs can save lives and help combat this crime.

Common Indicators of Human Trafficking

1. Behavioral Signs:

- Fearful, anxious, or submissive behavior.
- Avoids eye contact or exhibits a lack of trust.
- Unable to speak freely or appears to be under someone else's control.

2. Physical Signs:

- Signs of physical abuse, malnourishment, or poor hygiene.
- Unexplained injuries or branding tattoos that could indicate ownership.

3. Work and Living Conditions:

- Lives where they work or in overcrowded conditions.
- Restricted freedom of movement or isolation from the community.
- Excessive work hours with little or no pay.

4. Documentation and Identification:

- Lack of personal possessions or identification documents.
- Someone else holds their ID or travel documents.



High-Risk Environments in Palm Beach County

- **Hospitality Industry:** Hotels, motels and massage parlors.
- **Agricultural Work:** Farms and food production facilities.
- **Domestic Work:** Housekeeping or childcare in private homes.
- **Online Platforms:** Social media and job recruitment sites.

What You Can Do

If you suspect someone is a victim of human trafficking:

- **Do not confront the suspected trafficker directly.** It could endanger the victim and yourself.
- **Report Your Concerns:**
 - Contact the **National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-888-373-7888** or text **"HELP"** or **"INFO"** to **233733**.
- **Provide as much information as possible** about the situation, such as location, description of individuals involved, and any observed indicators.

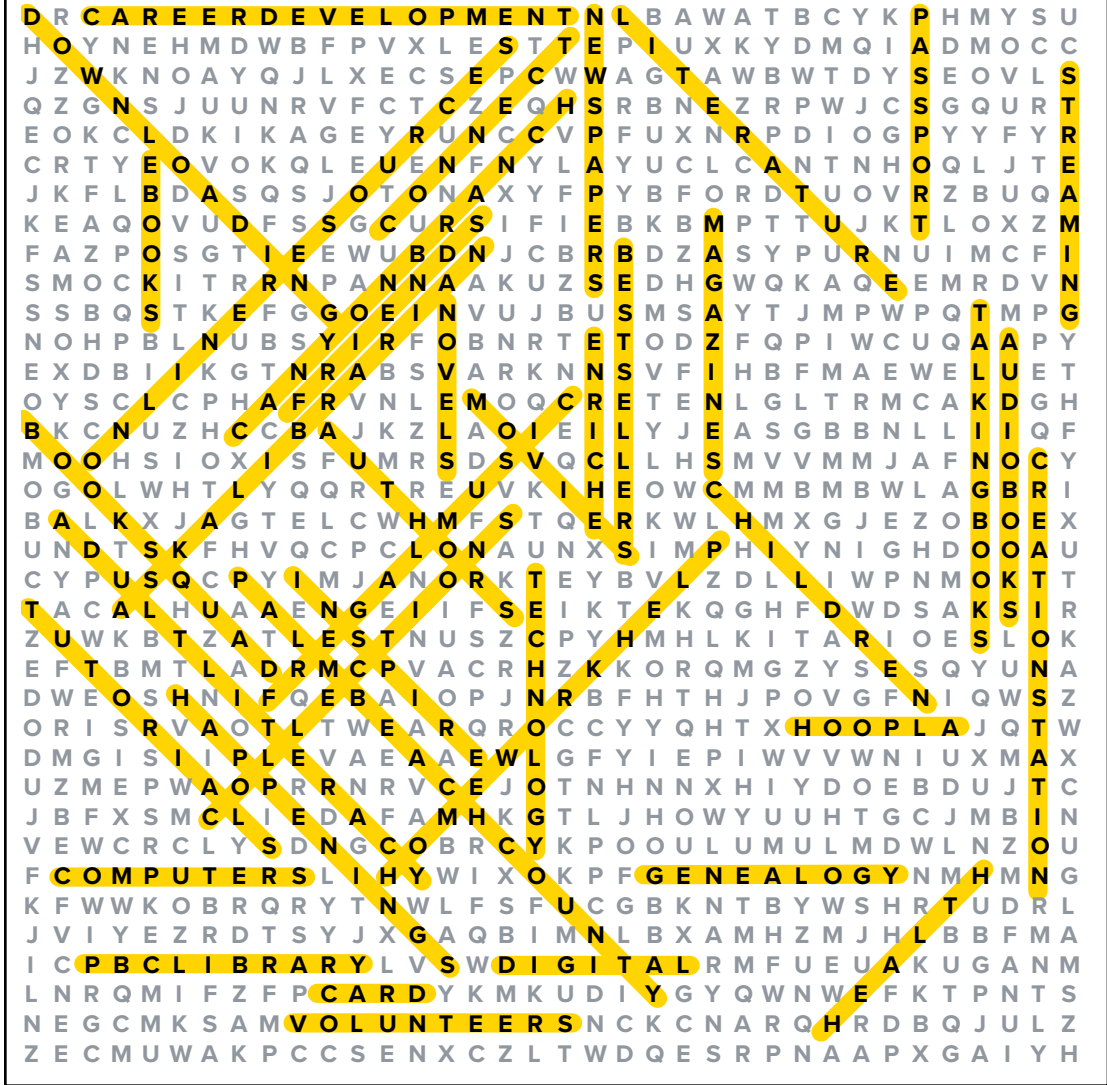

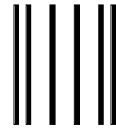

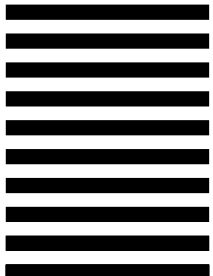
