# Discovering Your Family Story

### TIP

General genealogical family history research **does not require** a certified copy. Free vital record copies are available online 24/7 in the Digital Archive.

Records at the State Archives have been used by generations of Rhode Islanders to trace family history, study immigration, and research demographics. View historic Vital Records online in the <u>Digital Archive</u>.

### Step 1: Identify whose story will you research.

- Be prepared with your ancestor's full name and date of birth or death.
- Additional information such as names of parents, siblings, spouse, or city of birth are also helpful.

### Step 2: Confirm if the birth, marriage, or death record you need is at the State Archives.

### VITAL RECORDS

Explore records of births, marriages, and deaths in Rhode Island dating to the 1600s.

- Death records must be at least 50 years old.
- o Marriage and birth records must be at least 100 years old.
- Note: To request records of births and marriages under 100 years, and deaths under 50 years, please visit the Department of Health, Office of Vital Records or call 401-222-2811.

### Step 3: Review the other helpful records available at the State Archives.

### • CENSUS RECORDS

Learn where your ancestors lived, trace new family members, and research family connections. **[these records have not been digitized]** 

## CITY AND TOWN DIRECTORIES

Dive deeper into the life and businesses of Rhode Island and make new connections to your own family history with directories dating back to 1824. **[on-site only – these records cannot be digitized]** 

### MILITARY RECORDS

Discover military service on your family tree with State Archives records dating back to the mid-1700s.

View digitized material online by searching the <u>catalog</u>.

### Step 4: Request your record.

- Request birth, marriage, or death records using the Vital Records Request Form.
- Request additional records via email at <u>statearchives@sos.ri.gov</u>.
