In addition, the Act requires the Department's final report provide the document title and identification number for each SSN mailing deemed necessary by the Agency head, along with the rationale for such determination. - The Department is finalizing a revision to DoDI 1000.30 to generally prohibit the inclusion of an individual's full SSN on any document that is physically mailed, which includes delivery via the U.S. mail system (i.e., U.S. Postal Service) or other commercial parcel or letter delivery services (e.g., Federal Express, United Parcel Service, etc.) unless authorized by my office. This revised policy is currently in formal DoD coordination with anticipated publication in October 2022.
- The Department's revised policy recognizes that there is a need to mail documents containing full SSNs in certain instances, such as official records of vital statistics (death, marriage, divorce, etc.) and records containing an individual's SSN that are mailed to an individual (or their authorized representative) as part of a legal process, such as discovery in court proceedings, disciplinary proceedings, and responses to access requests under the Privacy Act of 1974 or the Freedom of Information Act. The policy therefore authorizes the mailing of documents containing full SSNs in

these limited circumstances. The policy also permits DoD Components to request authorization to mail SSNs in other specific circumstances (e.g., sending a specific agency form by mail) if there is adequate justification and my office has approved the request.

• Finally, the Department recently established a working group comprised of various DoD Component representatives to conduct a comprehensive review of DODI 1000.30 to ensure it sufficiently addresses the risks that SSN use poses to individual privacy and DoD's goal of minimizing SSN use wherever possible. The working group will recommend updates to DoD's SSN policy in 2023.

Number of SSN Mailings at DoD

- A review of the historical reporting data collected pursuant to the Act revealed the number of mailed DoD Component-specific documents containing SSNs has decreased annually. During the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 reporting period, the Department decreased the number of documents (e.g., forms) mailed containing SSNs by 30. Of note, during the Department's first report covering FY 2017, the Department reported 577 document mailings containing the full SSNs. On this fifth and final year of reporting, the Department reduced its document mailings containing a full SSN to 255 documents, which is a 43.5% decrease during the scope of this reporting requirement.
- The historical data also revealed that the majority of the documents containing SSNs mailed by DoD were documents (in many cases forms) required by other Federal agencies or State or local governments for operational necessity and processing.
- The Department continues its efforts to replace the SSN of DoD-affiliated persons with the DoD Identification Number in its internal systems and processes, where possible.

Enclosed are two lists that, when read together, set forth the documents identified by DoD Components in response to this year's data call to identify the title and identification number of any document containing the complete SSN of an individual transmitted via mail in FY 2022. The first list contains the Departments SSN mailings during FY 2022, and the second list sets out 92 documents containing the complete SSN of an individual that DoD Components will continue to transmit via mail past FY 2022, as deemed necessary my office, along with the rationale for such determinations. The Department has reviewed these documents to ensure the mailing is justifiable and in alignment with current Departmental policies for SSN reduction. The Department will work with its Components to further clarify the mailing need for the remaining 129 submissions.

I am sending identical letters to the Chairs of the House Committee on Oversight and Reform, the House Committee on Ways and Means, the Senate Committee on Finance, the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, and the Senate Committee on Armed Services.
