Denver, Colo., June 25.-Samuel Compers was re-elected president of the American Federation of Labor

The American labor leader defeated John L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers, by a heavy

Only two of the largest organizations east a solid vote for Lewis, the Machinests Union and United Brotherhood of Carpenters

The miners delegation split their vote, giving Compers '50% and Lew's 2172. President Lewis declining to vote the 533 votes he held.

The railroad organization which had been claimed almost solidly by Lewis supporters split their vote, the two largest writers—the Electrical Workers and the Railway car mencasting their entire vote to Compers. The official vote was: Compers.

Volstead Law Is Attacted

Chicago, June 25 .- A new attack upon the present construction of the eighteenth amendment and the Volstead law was filed here in United States court today by Former United States Senator J. Hamilton Lewis, to recover whisky valued at \$500,000, stored in Chicago warehouse.

The plaintiffs are distillers and merchant owners of bonded whisky while the government, the United States internal revenue collector. prohibition director, Attorney Geneal Brundage and the United States Atterney are made defendants.

The new assault does not attack the amendment or the Volstead law as invalid, but the plantinffs claim no provision of either measure can apply to whisky deposited in government warehouses by the direction of the government before either measure was passed where the goods are now owned by the same owners who deposited the liquors on a contract to have it returned when the governmnt tax was paid.

The principal new point raised c'aim of the complainants that the provision of the constitution against manufacture referred to manufacture before and not after passage of the amendment; that the provision of the amendment against use of itquors for beverage refers to the particular set of spirits allowed by law to be used for medical. Mechanical and industrial proposes and that the Volutead Isw's provisions apply only to those who would attempt to use as a beverage the spirits permitted to be manufactured for medical


