



Total Clients Served By Region October 1, 2004 – December 31, 2004




Client Services October 1, 2005 – December 31, 2005

REGIONAL SUMMARIES

October – December 2005

Our family health care advisors served 1,752 total clients this quarter. A total of 33,501 services were provided to these clients. \$1,881,033 of free medication was provided to our clients in this service area.

Those attending were provided with excellent information and a question-and-answer session to help them better understand diabetes and prevent possible future complications that may occur with lack of proper understanding and care.

Kentucky Homeplace staff provided grocery/gift baskets to 12 clients during the holidays. The baskets contained groceries and various other personal care items. A Warren County Homemakers organization assisted Velma Koostra and Sharon Cherry with donations of food for the baskets in Warren, Hart and Edmonson counties.

This quarter our family health care advisors served a total of 1,680 clients and provided 29,051 services. Medication in the amount of \$1,934,961 was ordered by the FHCAs in this region. All FHCAs participated in a Medicare Part D computer training held at the Center for Rural Health.

Knott County

Paul Vance attended the Small Hospitals Improvement Program (SHIP) Medicare Workshop at Knott County Human Services building. Paul assisted 180 clients and provided 3,673 services for them.

Floyd County

Gina Bates relocated her office from the Floyd County Health Department to the McDowell Appalachian Regional Healthcare Clinic. She met with a representative from the SHIP program to discuss the new Medicare Part D program. Gina helped provide training on this new program to her co-workers. Gina has been working with the McDowell ARH to provide Homeplace services to their patients. Gina provided 3,435 services to 250 clients in her community.

This quarter our family health care advisors served a total of 1,569 clients, performed 14 home visits, 1,173 client site visits, and provided 27,488 services. Medication in the amount of \$3,121,695 was ordered by the FHCAs in this region.

Clay County

This quarter we hired John Howard to fill the vacant FHCA position in Clay County.

The Clay County office participated in a health fair called Fit for the Future at the Senior Citizens Center. In an effort to help our clients better understand Medicare D, we hosted a Medicare D Day for the citizens of Clay County. We had more than 150 participants. A representative from Thompson Drug hosted a Diabetic Day for our clients. On this day, individuals were able to obtain shoes and other needed supplies. If they have Medicare, the representative waived the fee they would normally pay. This was a very successful event. During the Christmas holiday we helped a local food pantry with its giveaway of food and toys.

Harlan County


