



Your Pharmacy Benefits in a Nutshell

We know you're busy, so we created a quick and easy guide to your benefits. It includes tips on how to make the most of your coverage and save money while you're at it.

First things first. Have you registered at www.anthem.com yet?

It's the fastest and easiest way to get all of your personalized pharmacy benefits information. Once you have registered, you can do things like:

- Find a pharmacy.
- Check your drug list.
- ♦ Compare drug costs with our "Price a Medication" tool.
- Switch to home delivery or refill a prescription.
- Check your claims status and history.
- Check your copay, deductible or coinsurance amounts.

There's an app for all of that, too. **Sydney** makes it easy to manage your pharmacy benefits from wherever you are. You can find it at the Apple Store® (iOS) or on Google Play (Android).

Your drug list

Keep in mind, changes can be made to your drug list, so you may want to check it when you get a new prescriptions.

- For more details specific to your benefit plan, log in at anthem.com and access the Prescription Benefits section. If your drug isn't on the list or has authorization or step therapy requirements, you'll see other options.

Your plan uses the Essential Drug List. It includes hundreds of generic and brand-name prescription drugs.

Drugs are grouped in tiers. Your share of the cost will depend on the drug tier. The lower the tier, the lower your cost. Generally, drugs in tier 1 are generic medications. Tier 2 medications are typically brand-name medications that do not have a lower-cost brand or generic alternative. Tier 3 medications are typically brand-name medications that may have a lower-cost brand or generic alternative in a lower tier. Tier 4 medications are typically specialty medications.

Here's what your plan covers

- ♦ Brand-name and generic drugs on your drug list
- Some preventive drugs at little or no cost to you (view our Preventive care flier at anthem.com/pharmacyinformation)
- Most specialty drugs if you have an ongoing health issue or serious illness

Your cost

Below are two charts that compare how much you'd pay for 30-day and 90-day supplies of your medicines, based on the drug list tier. Keep in mind, these costs are estimates of what you pay. The actual cost may vary depending on the pharmacy you use and your specific plan. You can utilize the pharmacy tools at anthem.com once you have registered to look up medications on your drug list and determine any drugs that might have prior authorization or step therapy requirements.

Here are a few more things to know about your drug coverage

Some medications require taking certain steps before they're covered by your plan. Here are a few you need to know about:

- Prior Authorization (PA) and Step Therapy (ST). Some prescriptions will require a review for clinical appropriateness before a pharmacy can fill them. Your doctor will need to work with AnthemRx to complete the review process.
- Quantity Limits (QL). For safety reasons, the plan may limit how much of a medicine you can get each month.
- Dose Optimization (DO). Minor adjustments in how your medication is dosed can help manage your cost. For example, you may be able to switch from taking a drug twice a day to taking it once a day at a higher strength.

Want to save on drug costs? Here's how!

- Take medicines on your plan's drug list.
- Choose drugs on tier 1 for your lowest cost share.
- Use the Purdue University Pharmacy (PUP) whenever possible (W. Lafayette only)
- Use a pharmacy in your plan.
- Talk to your doctor about lower-cost options.

Remember to always talk to your doctor before making any change in your medicine.

Need to fill a prescription? Here we go.

You have plenty of choices about how and where to get your prescription medicine, including local pharmacies in your plan or convenient home delivery.

Purdue University Pharmacy (PUP) (W. Lafayette only)

Conveniently located on campus, PUP can fill most of your prescriptions and will generally be your lowest-cost option. You can receive a 30 supply of most medications. Some specialty medications can be purchased at PUP. In addition, PUP supplies a variety of non-prescription, over-the-counter (OTC) medications. PUP can be reached at (765) 494-1374.

Retail pharmacies

Your plan includes nearly 70,000 pharmacies nationwide. You'll save money when you use one of these pharmacies. It's easy to find one near you. Just log in at anthem.com, find Locate a Pharmacy, and type in your ZIP code.

Home delivery

If you take medications regularly or need them on a long-term basis, you can save time with home delivery. You can get up to a 90-day supply delivered to your door, with free standard shipping. Sign up at anthem.com.

You'll have to get a new 90-day prescription from your doctor. You can call **833-236-6196** to get started.

Specialty pharmacy

If you have a complex health condition that requires specialty drugs for your treatment—drugs that may need special handling or that you may get by injection or infusion—first contact PUP to check for availability. If PUP is unable to accommodate, you will need to get them through IngenioRx, our specialty pharmacy. If you need assistance setting up your specialty medication with IngenioRx, you can contact 833-255-0645.
