Ohio Birding Checklist with Difficulty Codes

Daily/Year/Life	

This checklist is arranged in three sections, each corresponding to a pair of difficulty codes. The six codes/descriptions are based primarily on the collective experience of Greg Miller and Dan Sanders. Overall abundance and ease of identification have been factored into each of the six codes and are as follows:

Easier to See Birds

- 1. Readily found within expected habitat during at least one season of the year.
- 2. Migrant in spring & fall OR breeding/ wintering somewhat restricted within the state.

Harder to See Birds

- 3. Spring-only or fall-only migrant OR breeding/wintering very local within the state.
- 4. Reported annually but easily missed, even with special effort.

Review List Birds

- 5. More regularly occurring of the OBRC review-list species during the past 20 years or so.
- 6. Least expected of the OBRC review-list species; very rare in Ohio.

Taxonomic order and nomenclature within each section are from the Fifty-Seventh Supplement (July 2016) to the American Ornithologists' Union *Check-List of North American Birds*. The original version of this checklist was produced by Paul Gardner and Joe Hammond. Helpful comments were contributed by Bill Whan.
