**UPDATED SCHEDULE FOR REGULAR AND PREDICTABLE RATE ADJUSTMENTS**  
(September 23, 2024)

Rule 3030.102 requires the Postal Service to maintain and publish an up-to-date schedule for regular and predictable rate adjustments.

Rule 3030.102 also requires the schedule to provide estimated filing and implementation dates for future rate adjustments for the next three years, as well as information sufficient to predict the amounts of those rate adjustments.

The Postal Service last filed this schedule with the Commission in December 2023, along with its FY 2023 annual compliance report.

An updated schedule is attached, showing that, subject to the approval of the Governors, the Postal Service currently intends to next adjust Market Dominant prices in July 2025 and each January and July thereafter, through December 2027.

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**Schedule for Regular and Predictable Rate Adjustments – Effective through  
Calendar Year 2027**

Subject to the approval of the Governors, the Postal Service next expects to implement price changes for all Market Dominant classes in July 2025, with the filing occurring in April 2025.

Likewise, subject to the approval of the Governors, the Postal Service expects that in 2026 and 2027, it will change prices for all Market Dominant classes in both January and July, with filings occurring the preceding October and April, respectively.

The Postal Service intends in all cases to be judicious in the use of available pricing authority, but it anticipates that the changes for Market Dominant classes may apply most or all pricing authority available on the date of filing, given our legal obligation to be financially self-sufficient, our progress under the Delivering for America Plan and its fundamental goals of providing excellent service while still achieving financial sustainability, and our current and anticipated financial condition.
