Game Day in the Bluegrass

Media guides, rosters, Southeastern Conference information, updated game notes and statistics will be available prior to each match. The UK media relations staff will be pleased to accommodate your postgame distribution needs. Please have a list of numbers prepared by the end of the match of the media outlets you wish to be reached. The visiting media relations personnel will be provided one phone line. In the case that a media relations representative will not be traveling to Lexington, arrangements should be made the week of the match for additional services to be provided by UK.

Interviews

Interviews with Coach Jon Lipsitz, his staff and student-athletes will be available following the match after a 10-minute cooling off period. Media members wishing to interview coaches or any players other than on the day of a match should set up an appropriate interview time through John Hayden in the UK Media Relations Department. The best time to reach the coaching staff is 9 a.m. to noon ET, Monday through Friday. The best time to speak with the student-athletes is after practice during the week. Practice is usually 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. ET at the UK Soccer Complex. All interviews during the week must take place 30 minutes prior to the start of practice or immediately following practice.

2010 UK WOMEN'S SOCCER OUTLOOK

When UK head women's soccer coach Jon Lipsitz assumed the role of head coach prior to the 2009 season, he said changing the culture of the program and the conditioning level of its players were his two most pressing tasks. As Lipsitz moves toward his second season, he feels both goals have been met to a degree.

"It was a challenge," Lipsitz said, referring to changing the outlook and culture of the program. "There were some boulders that we had to break and climb over and go around, but we really got there. It did not happen in the fall, but it happened in the spring. Spring is when you get to spend a lot of time on individual development and in development of the culture of the team. We came a really long way this spring."

Lipsitz feels that the team's spring retreat to Charleston, S.C. was very beneficial in bringing players closer and adding to the family-type environment he promotes.

"I definitely came at them with a different level of demands and different types of demands than they had ever been asked before; especially off the field, in terms of their commitment to the culture of success and excellence we're trying to instill," Lipsitz said. "I think by both changing our roster and then getting to know every individual that was still here, I think we were incredibly successful in changing our culture and we'll see that from the first day of pre-season this fall."

Getting to know the entire roster could prove to be no easy task, as the coaching staff welcomes 16 newcomers onto the team, truly ushering in a new era of Wildcat soccer. Despite the massive roster turnover, Lipsitz does not feel the team will be hurt by inexperience. If anything, he feels the influx of new players will not only increase the team's talent level, but add to the culture he is attempting to foster at Kentucky.

"We'll be young, so there will be some sort of trial by fire, but we will be more talented," Lipsitz said. "I think we will certainly have a roster of players that is more committed to what it takes on a daily basis to be excellent. It takes mutual sacrifice to achieve excellence. It takes coming together in difficult times. While we will be young, I think in some ways we will be more

experienced in what we are looking to do."

One of the keys to this season will be maintaining consistent play for the duration of the schedule, which proved to be difficult for the Wildcats in 2009. Kentucky lost four of its final five matches and was outscored 12-2 in that stretch. Lipsitz attributes much of that late-season collapse to the conditioning, or lack thereof, of the players when he arrived in Lexington.

"Our fitness levels were a disaster when I got here. That's not on any previous staff. That's on the players. It's their job to be ready and they weren't. It was a shock to their system to hear how difficult it was going to be to meet our standards," Lipsitz said. "They also needed to be convinced that it was going to make a huge difference. That was a process that has been hugely successful, and I know we are going to be much more fit when we start this fall than we were last fall. We have a lot of players coming in that have chosen to come here knowing those standards, and that certainly makes a big difference."

Lipsitz is excited about the prospects for the coming season, as he feels many of the growing pains that were present in his first season are now a thing of the past.

"There were clearly times last year where there was a big disconnect between what the coaches wanted and what the players felt we needed to do," Lipsitz said. "I'm very proud of where we have come since last November. I feel like this is a different program already. I think the credit for that goes to our players. They have committed themselves to doing the things, on and off the field, that it takes to be an athlete at this level. Even more so, they have committed themselves to being great teammates. I'm very excited to get started from a much more positive point than where we ended last November."

SCHEDULE

The Wildcats will play 11 matches in the friendly confines of the UK Soccer Complex, including six against SEC rivals. For the second consecutive year, Kentucky will play a schedule loaded with NCAA tournament teams, with a total of eight on the docket for 2010.

"We're always going to play a difficult schedule," Lipsitz said. "I'm always going to try to find ways to challenge us with the teams we play and the trips we take. It's very important for us to be prepared for a very difficult conference with so many great teams and so many top coaches. We need to play different styles and we need to be challenged in different ways. That's what we're going to learn from. We're not going to learn from a series of matches that appear to be easy to us. I'm excited by our schedule. I think we'll find out a lot about ourselves and our youth very quickly."

The Wildcats kick off the second year of the Lipsitz Era with two straight home games, including the season opener on Saturday, Aug. 21 against Coastal Carolina, followed by another home date against border rival Indiana on Friday, Aug. 27. UK and IU haven't met since the 2002 season.

UK wastes no time being tested on the road, traveling to Wake Forest Sept. 3-5 to take on the Demon Deacons and Virginia Tech. Wake Forest, a traditional ACC power, advanced to the Elite Eight in last year's NCAA Tournament and finished the season ranked eighth. Virginia Tech finished as high as 10th in one poll and advanced to the Sweet 16 of last year's NCAA Tournament.

The Wildcats play a third-straight road game at Louisville on Sept. 9 before opening a five-game home stand which includes the 2010 SEC opener against last year's regular season SEC champion Florida and defending SEC Tournament champion South Carolina. The Gamecocks also advanced to the Sweet 16 of last year's NCAA Tournament.

Lipsitz hopes that such an ambitious non-conference slate will prepare the young team for the rigors of the Southeastern Conference.

"We start out with Florida and South Carolina," Lipsitz said when discussing the conference lineup. "We're going to find out right away where we are. I'm excited by that, and I certainly feel we'll be more prepared going into the SEC than we were this past year."

In league play, UK will also host Alabama, Auburn, Mississippi State and Vanderbilt. For the eighth straight season, the SEC will hold its postseason tournament in Orange Beach, Alabama. This year's tournament is scheduled for early November, running from Nov. 3-7.

GOALKEEPERS

Coming into 2009, Coach Lipsitz expressed his desire for one of his goalkeepers to step up and claim the position. He got his wish as Sydney Hiance turned in a solid season, shutting out seven opponents in 15 starts. Hiance finished in the top 10 of the SEC in shutouts, shutouts per game, saves per game and goals allowed. Her shutouts per game average of 0.44 ranked fourth in the conference. She was also named SEC Defensive Player of the Week for October 12th, having notched nine saves in shutout performances against No. 13 LSU and Arkansas. Hiance enters 2010 ranked fourth all-time in school history with 15 shutouts.

Along with incoming freshmen Carylynne Hudson and Kayla King, the Wildcats will carry a total of three goalkeepers on the roster this season. The competition for playing time should be fierce, and despite Hiance's outstanding season, Coach Lipsitz warns that she does not have the position locked up.

"Sydney Hiance was our starter for the vast majority of the year," Lipsitz said. "She's really dedicated herself to her fitness and being more mentally strong. She knows that she tailed off mentally as the season went on. It wasn't a physi-

cal issue. I think it's very clear that it's her job to win or lose. Last year, she won it and then lost it. I'm not the least bit hesitant to make a change in the goal if someone else earns it."

DEFENDERS

Defense was a shining light for Kentucky last season and Lipsitz expects more of the same in 2010, but the Wildcats will have to overcome the loss of graduated captain Julie Hull. To fill the void left by Hull, Lipsitz will look to junior Jenna Goblirsch, who will assume a role of team captain.

Another potential bright spot for the Wildcats' defense is freshman Christine Lutz, who graduated high school early to enroll at UK and switch to wide back.

"We've been looking for a left back since I got here," Lipsitz said. "Christine coming in and being converted to left back and developing so much is going to put her way ahead as we start the fall."

Lipsitz is also excited about the sheer number of defenders on the roster and the wide-open competition that will occur for playing time.

"The other positions are really wide open," Lipsitz said. "We had a lot of injuries in the spring, so there weren't other people that got to log a lot of minutes in the back. It will be very interesting to see who comes ready. We are fortunate to have a player coming in with international experience in Carys Hawkins (Scarborough, Australia) to help us, but there is a whole list of defenders who are already here and will have an opportunity to play. They will decide who plays. Everybody thinks the coaches decide that, but it's the players that do it, and they'll decide it on the first day of the fall."

MIDFIELDERS

The midfield was a major point of concern for the Wildcats last year, which contributed to the team's ability to score just 11 goals all season, but the coaching staff feels it will be greatly improved in 2010.

"We really struggled with possession," Lipsitz said. "When you struggle with possession, you don't score a lot of goals and you defend a whole bunch because you don't have the ball. I like to play a style which is really based upon possession. Our staff is committed to possessing the ball and to knocking the ball around. We weren't able to do that last season because of our struggles with holding onto the ball and with the rhythm of the

midfield."

Much of the improvement in the midfield will be based on the impact of two sophomore transfers who sat out last season, Natalie Horner and Kelsey Hunyadi. Sophomore Alyssa Telang, who improved greatly in the spring, will also be a key contributor.

"Alyssa has probably developed more since last fall than any player on our team, both on and off the field," Lipsitz said. "It really showed during the spring; with Natalie and Kelsey in the midfield, we'll be able to possess the ball well."

Of the 16 newcomers, five are midfielders, which the coaching staff feels will assist with this season's turnaround at the position.

"Now rather than worrying about who will play in the midfield, we know we have the players and we will sort it out in the preseason. It's nice to start looking at it as a position of strength."

FORWARDS

Last season, Kentucky was unable to score consistently and much of that fell on the play at the forward position, which was not something Lipsitz is used to.

"That was a shock to my system," Lipsitz said when discussing the lack of offense. "I believe in attacking soccer. I believe in playing three up top. I believe in trying to score as many goals as you can by creating as many opportunities as possible and we simply were not able to do that. Some of that comes from the midfield and a lack of possession, but it also can be a lack of personality up top."

The Wildcats lost their two top scoring forwards, Giuleana Lopez and Stefani Kildare, and return just four goals from last season, two of which came from defender Jenna Goblirsch. Senior Laura Novikoff will be looked to for leadership and production, as will sophomore Kirsten Robinson. Kentucky will also rely heavily on its incoming freshmen to contribute up top.

"We have some tremendous pace coming in with our freshmen," Lipsitz said. "Last season, we ranked pretty close to the bottom of the SEC in terms of team speed. We won't be last this season, which will give us opportunities to get in behind the other team and get some easier goals."

Kentucky will play a much more pressing style this season, due to the influx of speed and athleticism, which should allow for more opportunities on goal.

HEAD COACH JON LIPSITZ • SECOND SEASON



Now in his second season, UK head women's soccer coach Jon Lipsitz has the lay of the land and will continue to develop the culture it takes to build a championship program from the ground up.

"I definitely came this team (his second at UK) with a different level of demands and different types of demands than they had ever been asked before; especially off the field, in terms of their commitment to the culture of success and excellence we're trying to instill," Lipsitz said. "I think by both changing our roster and then getting to know every individual that was still here, I think we were incredibly successful in changing our culture and we'll see that from the first day of pre-season this fall."

Lipsitz put his stamp on the program midway through his inaugural season when the Wildcats upset No. 13 LSU, 1-0.

On Dec. 16, 2008, Lipsitz became the second head women's soccer coach in University of Kentucky history. Lipsitz, who owns a career record of 106-43-12 (.696) in eight seasons, came to Lexington after spending four seasons as the head coach at Charlotte where he guided the 49ers to a 58-23-4 (.706) record including three straight Atlantic 10 titles in 2006, '07 and '08. Each season, Charlotte increased their win total, going from 11 in 2005, to 13 in 2006, to 16 in 2007, to a school record 18 in 2008.

In his four seasons at Charlotte, he guided the 49ers to 34 A-10 wins with a Carolinas' Cup title, three A-10 regular season titles, two A-10 Tournament titles and two NCAA Tournament appearances. The 49ers' success on the field during Lipsitz's tenure translated into recruiting success, as well.

The two springs prior to his arrival in Lexington, he signed two of the highest-ranked recruiting classes in the program's history including the 19th ranked class in the nation according to Soccer Buzz in 2007.

While in Charlotte, he also coached seven Academic All-Americans and two athletic All-Americans. In 2007, Lipsitz was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year after leading the 49ers to 16 wins and a school-record nine Atlantic 10 wins en route to the program's third-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament. The 49ers captured their second straight A-10 regular season title which was the fourth regular season championship in the program's history. Charlotte also won their first A-10 Tournament Championship when they captured the title with a victory over Fordham. Lipsitz and the 49ers continued their momentum through the 2008 season where they finished with a school record 18-4-1 mark including a perfect 11-0 mark in conference play. The team won their

second straight A-10 tournament title and capped the magical season with an NCAA second round appearance, defeating the Tennessee Lady Vols 2-0 in the first round. The 49ers finished the 2008 campaign ranked fifth nationally in scoring (3.00) and 19th in shutout percentage (56.5).

Before taking over the 49ers women's soccer program, Lipsitz spent four seasons (2001-04) as an assistant coach for national-power Ohio State. During his four seasons with the Buckeyes, he was the chief recruiter for a program that won 52 games, two Big Ten Tournament titles and made three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. In 2004, Ohio State won a school-record 19 games en route to an NCAA Tournament Elite Eight appearance. His efforts produced nationally-ranked recruiting classes, including players that earned freshman All-America honors in each of his last two seasons in Columbus.

Prior to his time at Ohio State, Lipsitz spent three seasons at NCAA Division III Denison University where he tallied a 43-10-4 record in three seasons.

No stranger to the UK women's soccer program, Lipsitz served as the Director of Coaching and Player Development for the Ohio Premier Girls' Soccer Club from 1993 to 2005, which produced former Kentucky standouts Annie Gage and Elizabeth Ramsey, as well as 2008 seniors Tara Herold and Kristin Kover.

Lipsitz has also served as a Regional Staff Coach for Region II and III Olympic Development Program, as well as the 1991 North Carolina ODP Head Coach. He holds the United States Soccer Federation "A" license.

ASST. COACH MICHELLE RAYNER • SECOND SEASON

Assistant coach Michelle Rayner is in the second year of her second stint with the UK women's soccer program.

Rayner served as an assistant in the program from 2001-04. During her time in Lexington, Rayner helped coach five Wildcats to seven All-SEC honors.

"Coaching here at UK is a process – what we do here every day has value in and of itself and the journey and path that we're on is extremely tough, but very satisfying knowing that we're helping build a program that we can all be proud of. It takes time to implement our own culture, however, our current players here at UK have done a tremendous job in believing what we're doing and caring enough to focus on this every day. We're very excited moving forward and cannot wait for our new incoming players to join us so we can continue to work hard at getting better in every aspect."

Rayner returned to Lexington after serving as head coach at High Point for the last four seasons where she led the Panthers to a 33-38-12 record, including a 19-13-11 mark in her last two seasons. In 2007, Rayner guided High Point to the Big South Tournament Championship

and made the school's second appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Along the way the team matched the program's Division I record for season wins with 11. In 2008, she equaled the all-time program record for fewest losses in a season with five.

During her time at High Point, she produced 14 All-Big South performers and recruited and developed three Big South All-Freshman selections. Rayner's insistence on excellence in the classroom showed results as well, producing two Big South Women's Soccer Scholar Athletes of the Year and four CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honorees.

Prior to her coaching tenure at UK, Rayner began her collegiate coaching career as the top assistant for the men's and women's soccer programs at Lincoln Memorial University in Harrogate, Tenn. She earned her bachelor's degree in physical education with a minor in coaching from Lincoln Memorial in 2001.

In addition to her collegiate coaching experience, Rayner served as the Director of Coaching for the Knoxville (Tenn.) United Stars Girls club, where two of her teams won Tennessee State Championships and other squads captured

titles in numerous tournaments around the region.

Rayner, who played professionally in Australia and England for several years before coming to the United States to pursue a college education, was a member of the New Zealand National Team that competed in the first Women's World Soccer Championships in China in 1991.

ASST. COACH AARON RODGERS • SECOND SEASON

Second year assistant coach at Kentucky, Aaron Rodgers is no stranger to the Southeastern Conference. Rodgers is in his third stop within the SEC, having previously coached at Florida and Alabama.

Under his tutelage, current UK goalie Sydney Hiance posted seven shutouts, the third most in a season in school history. Hiance enters her senior campaign with 13 career clean sheets, fourth most in UK history.

"Syd has had a wonderful career to this point leading in to her senior year and can really put a mark on the goalkeeping records," said Rodgers.

In addition to Hiance, Rodgers has a full arsenal of keepers to turn to this season.

"Laura Burton played in a couple of big games last year and can compete for some playing time," Rodgers said. "Kayla King and Carylynne Hudson will provide some great depth and will have the opportunity to work and help team get better."

Prior to coming to Lexington, Rodgers spent a year as a volunteer coach with the University of Florida soccer team, serving as the goalkeeper coach. During his time in Gainesville, the Gators captured the 2008 SEC championship, while reaching the NCAA Sweet 16 as well.

His other SEC stop in Tuscaloosa occurred in

the 1998 season. The Crimson Tide won the Southeastern Conference's Western Division and earned a NCAA Championship berth that season. Rodgers coached 1998 All-SEC first team selection Rachel Brown, who is currently the goalkeeper for the England National Team.

Rodgers brings knowledge from the collegiate and club coaching ranks as well as experience as a player to the Wildcat program.

He began his coaching career as an assistant coach for the women's team at his alma mater, the University of North Texas. After a year with the Mean Green, Rodgers became the South Alabama assistant women's soccer coach for the 1996 and 1997 seasons. While at USA, the Jaguars went from a 2-17 record in 1996 to 18-3-1 in 1997, marking the biggest turnaround in women's collegiate history.

He went on to accept the associate director position at the nationally prominent Cardinal Soccer Club located in Cincinnati, Ohio. Rodgers spent almost two years with the program, working with players aged seven to 20.

A volunteer coaching position for the University of North Florida for the 2001 season followed, and the Ospreys finished the 2001 year nationally ranked. He spent the 2005, 2006 and 2007 seasons as an assistant coach for the Flager

College men's team.

Rodgers played collegiate soccer at both Arkansas-Little Rock (1991) and North Texas (1992-1993). He also played four seasons with various United Soccer League (USL) teams in the southeast - Texas Toros (1993-1994), Dallas Rockets (1995) and Mobile Revelers (1997).

A University of North Texas graduate, he received his bachelor's degree in political science in 1996.

Rodgers and his wife, Mandi, have a three-year old son, Luke, and celebrated the birth of their first daughter, Reese, in September of '09.

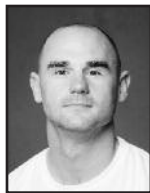

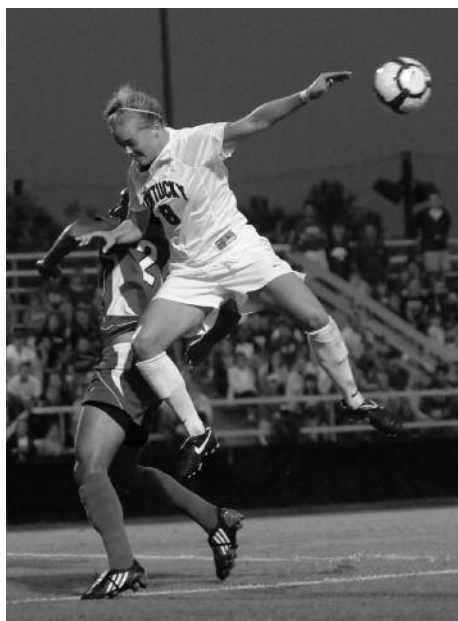
