PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Jo'el Emanuel, FDU

6-6, 196 LBS

So, F, Suffern, N.Y./Suffern/Millbrook

FDU men's basketball sophomore Jo'el Emanuel got off to a blazing start as the Suffern, N.Y. product led FDU to a 2-1 start to the 75th season in program history, earning the second-year Knight his first Northeast Conference Player of the Week honor. Emanuel shot 64.3 percent from the field in three starts in week one, sinking 18-of-28 of his field goal tries. The 6-foot-6 forward hit 50 percent of his three points tries, combining for five, over three games at Buffalo, home against Penn State Brandywine and at Seton Hall to close out the start of the campaign. In the season opener, Emanuel had 18 points in the first 18 minutes of the first half alone, double his previous game-high. He would go on to finish the game with a career-best 24 points. His double-double against Buffalo on Nov. 6 was the first of his career.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Adam "Budd" Clark, Merrimack

Clark began his collegiate career with three double-digit scoring performances in his first three career games for the Merrimack College Warriors. Highlighted by a 19-point performance against Maine, the freshman is second in scoring for the Warriors, averaging 13.3 points per game on a 48.1% shooting clip. He is also leading Merrimack with 4.0 steals per game, swiping at least three steals in each of the first three contests this season, including six in a win against Worcester State.

THE GAME

Kentucky and Stonehill have never met in the history of its programs. This is also the first time the Skyhawks have played an SEC opponent, after playing two Atlantic-10 teams (Saint Joe's, GW), one Patriot League team (Army), and a Big East team (UConn) to begin the season. This is the second ranked team Stonehill will have played this season after taking on No. 6 UConn on Saturday. The Skyhawks enter the game with a 1-3 record, its lone win coming against Army West Point last Thursday at Merkert Gymnasium. The Skyhawks have lost consecutive games, falling to No. 6 UConn and Saint Joseph's in the first two matchups of a five-game road trip. This meeting will be the second contest of the Wildcat Challenge hosted by Kentucky for Stonehill, with the Saint Joe's game this past Tuesday being the first and an eventual meeting with Texas A&M-Commerce on Monday, Nov. 20 concluding the three-game Challenge for Stonehill.

Friday night's game will be broadcasted digitally on SECN+ with **DARREN HEADRICK** (play-by-play) and **CAMERON MILLS** (analyst) calling the action for Kentucky.

LAST TIME OUT

PHILADELPHIA, Pa. (November 14, 2023) - Saint Joseph's University took down Stonehill men's basketball in both teams' first matchup as part of the Wildcat Challenge hosted by the University of Kentucky. The Hawks hosted the Skyhawks at Hagan Arena Tuesday night, winning the first meeting between the two teams, 100-56. Junior Shane O'Dell (Schenectady, N.Y.) led the Skyhawks in both scoring and rebounding with 16 points and four rebounds. He also tied freshman Louie Semona (Cincinnati, Ohio) for a team-high two assists. The Skyhawks are now 0-2 against Atlantic-10 teams this year, dropping their opening night matchup at George Washington to begin the season.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

Stonehill was picked to finish ninth in its first Northeast Conference season by the league's head coaches before they finished in a tie for second place as they went 10-6. This season, they were voted to finish in sixth place, three spots higher after their strong debut to the NEC in 2022-23.

TOUGH SLATE

Stonehill has picked up where it left off last season when it comes to assembling a tough non-conference slate, featuring three pre-season ranked opponents and two of the NCAA Final Four teams from this past March. They'll take on teams from the Big East (1 - #5 UConn), ACC (1 - #12 Miami), SEC (1 - #17 Kentucky), Big Ten (1 - Rutgers), A-10 (2 - Saint Joseph's (Pa.), George Washington), Patriot League (1 - Army), America East (3 - UMass Lowell, Binghamton, New Hampshire), and the MAAC (2 - Quinnipiac, Rider) leading up to their second season of NEC play. 11 of the Skyhawks 15 non-conference games will be played on the road.

RANKED RIGOR

Stonehill enters the season with three nationally ranked opponents from the AP/Coaches Preseason Poll, No. 6 UConn, No. 13 Miami, and No. 16 Kentucky. Entering the 2023-24 season, the Skyhawks had never faced a nationally ranked Division I opponent in its programs history.

TAKING ATTENDANCE

Stonehill ranked third in the Northeast Conference's attendance charts, averaging 797.0 fans per game in its 11 home games last season. The Skyhawks averaged a Conference-best 884.0 fans per game in their eight NEC games at Merkert Gym.

MAD MAX

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI** (South Hamilton, Mass.) ranked second in the NEC by shooting 41.8-percent (70-167) from three-point distance this season, ranking third in the Conference with his 2.3 three-point field goals per game. His 197 three-pointers over the course of his career, including his time at Lynn and Franklin Pierce, would be good for seventh on Stonehill's all-time list. He has canned four-plus threes in 19 career games, with six last season, including six in the wins over Eastern Nazarene and LIU.

MILESTONE MAX

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI** (South Hamilton, Mass.) reached a personal milestone at St. Francis Brooklyn on February 4, 2023 with his layup to close out the first half scoring giving him 1,000 points in 86 career games played, including his time at Lynn and Franklin Pierce. Zegarowski scored eight points in five games at Lynn University in 2018-19, before playing 55 games over three seasons at former NE10 divisional foe Franklin Pierce University from 2019-22, where he scored 677 points, including 431 points in 2021-22 to help the Ravens to an NCAA Tournament bid. He has totaled 421 points in 34 games at Stonehill to give him 1,106 points in 94 career games.

250 FOR COACH KRAUS

Stonehill's win at LIU on January 20 marked the 250th game in charge for head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06**. In his tenth year at the helm of his alma mater, Kraus has posted a 145-118 (.553) career record and participated in his 450th game associated with the College (student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach) against Wagner on January 5. Kraus' now 260 games as a head coach at Stonehill ranks third all-time in program history behind Ray Pepin (312) and David McLaughlin (288).

FOREVER A SKYHAWK!

Stonehill's game against Wagner on January 5, 2023 marked the 450th game Stonehill head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06** had a role with the program including his time as a student-athlete (114) from 2002-06, assistant coach (90) between 2010-13, and head coach (260) since 2013. Kraus has now had a role with his alma mater in 23.9-percent of the men's basketball games in the program's 74-year history. Stonehill has posted a 264-200 (.569) record over his combined 17-years at the College.

NEC DEBUT WINS

Stonehill is the sixth new Northeast Conference member to record a win in its NEC debut game after its 74-67 triumph at Sacred Heart on November 29, 2022. The Skyhawks join Merrimack (vs. Sacred Heart in 2020), Quinnipiac (at Monmouth, 1998), Maryland Baltimore County (vs Mount Saint Mary's, 1998), Rider (vs. St. Francis-Brooklyn, 1993) and Monmouth (vs LIU, 1986) in posting NEC debut wins.

LET'S MAKE IT TWO!

Stonehill is one of just four NEC newcomers to win their debut games on both the men's and women's side after the Stonehill women notched a 73-66 victory in their Conference opener at Central Connecticut State on January 5, 2023. Stonehill is the first since Quinnipiac won both openers in 1998, also joining Rider (1992-93) and Monmouth (1985-86).

NEC COACHING DEBUT

Stonehill's **CHRIS KRAUS '06** was among three head coaches a season ago to earn wins in their NEC debuts. The Skyhawks made their mark with a 74-67 victory at Sacred Heart.

NEW YORK STATE OF MIND

Stonehill posted its first three NCAA Division I wins in the State of New York, with its victories at Army West Point (11/12), against Holy Cross (at Fordham, 11/19) and at Binghamton (12/3). The Skyhawks have posted a 5-2 mark in the Empire State overall, including a 4-1 mark in true road games in the State after wins at St. Francis Brooklyn to complete the Brooklyn sweep with LIU.

NOT SO PATRIOTIC

Stonehill's first two wins in its inaugural NCAA Division I season were against Patriot League members with its 82-77 decision at Army West Point on November 12, 2022 and 81-79 victory over Holy Cross a week later on November 19, 2022 at Fordham's Tom Konchalski Classic.

#1900

Stonehill's 81-79 triumph over fellow Commonwealth program Holy Cross on November 19, 2022 marked the 1,900th game in the history of the Stonehill men's basketball team. Stonehill's first men's basketball season was in 1948 and the program has posted a 1,085-842 (.563) record over its 74-year history.

HISTORY MADE AT HISTORIC PLACE

Stonehill couldn't have picked a more historic location for the first win in its NCAA Division I era, an 82-77 triumph over Army in West Point on November 12, 2022. The Skyhawks accomplished the historic win in just its third game since starting its transition to Division I status on July 1, 2022.

PROUD HISTORY

Stonehill won the Northeast-10 Presidents' Cup six times, finishing in the top three in the final standings 15 of the last 17 years. Stonehill was one of just ten institutions nationwide to receive the NCAA Division II Presidents' Award for Academic Achievement, recognizing athletic departments with an Academic Success rating of 90-percent or better, each of the first ten years of the program's existence. The College ranks No. 98 in the category of National Liberal Arts Schools by U.S. News & World Report and No. 94 for the Best Value category.

HOOP HISTORY

Stonehill men's basketball earned 15 NCAA Division II Tournament bids over its history, the last was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. Stonehill were charter members of the Northeast-10 Conference, winning the first two tournament championships in 1981 and '82, finishing its time in the Conference with four postseason titles and six regular season championships.

TRUE TO HIS SCHOOL

Stonehill head coach **CHRIS KRAUS '06** is one of 52 Division I head coaches in charge of his alma mater. Kraus has held a role for Stonehill for 460 games since 2002, which includes 114 as a student-athlete from 2002-06, 90 as assistant coach and

now 260 as head coach. Kraus owns the distinction of having been part of NCAA Division II Elite Eight teams as a student-athlete (2006), assistant coach (2021) and head coach (2016).

TBT COACH

Stonehill men's basketball assistant coach, **JASON KARYS** and alum, **IVAN ALMEIDA'11** participated in The Basketball Tournament (TBT) over the 2022 summer. Karys was head coach of "The CRU", a team that while featured Almeida as a team member, comprised of former Valparaiso University men's basketball alumni including current Houston Rockets Summer League member, Eron Gordon (brother of Phoenix Suns shooting guard, Eric Gordon). Last year's appearance in the tournament marked the first ever for The CRU who were an eight seed took on number one seed, Gutter Cats as members in the Omaha Region.

A FEIN JOB

Former Stonehill men's basketball All-American **SHAUN FEIN** is currently serving as player development coach with the Los Angeles Clippers. Fein played two seasons at Stonehill from 1996-98 before transferring to Georgia Tech. The Barnstable, Mass., native is tied for ninth in program history with 156 three-pointers, finishing with 967 points in 56 games over his two seasons at Stonehill, helping the team reach the NCAA regional championship game in 1998.

FAMILY BIG EAST TIES

Postgrad **MAX ZEGAROWSKI'S** (South Hamilton, Mass.) twin brother, Marcus was a first team All-Big East selection at Creighton. The 2020-21 Big East Preseason Player of the Year currently plays for the Long Island Nets of the NBA G League. Max's older half-brother, Michael Carter-Williams is a former NBA first round draft pick.

PRIDE OF STONEHILL

Stonehill College takes great pride in the coaching career of Georgetown head coach **Ed Cooley**, Class of 1994. Cooley was a three-year captain at Stonehill, finishing with 795 points, 594 rebounds and over 100 assists in 107 career games played. He helped Stonehill to four NE10 Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals his senior year, when he ranked seventh among NE10 rebounding leaders with 7.0 per game.

- Announced The Edward and Nurys Cooley Scholarship Fund, named after his parents, at Stonehill at the 2019 HOF induction ceremony to be awarded annually to give financially needy students, who might otherwise be unable to afford higher education, an opportunity to do so through scholarship assistance.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

Stonehill closed out its NCAA Division II era being recognized for its academic performance, with regard to graduation rate, by receiving the NCAA Division II Presidents' Award for Academic Achievement for the tenth-straight year, having earned a 92-percent Academic Success Rating (ASR) as released by the NCAA. Stonehill was among 43 Division II institutions recognized by the NCAA in the award's tenth year of existence, honoring athletic programs with four-year Academic Success Rates of 90-percent or more. ASR considers the academic success rate of the institution based on the graduation rate of student-athletes while also giving credit for any student-athletes that transferred from the institution while in good academic standing. Stonehill is one of ten institutions to receive the NCAA Presidents' Award for Academic Excellence all ten years of its existence for having an ASR of 90-percent or better. The Skyhawks' 92-percent ASR for the cohort period of 2011-2014 ranks 20th nationally among 303 NCAA Division II member institutions.

**HEAD COACH (STONEHILL, '06)
TENTH SEASON - 145-119 (.553)**



Chris Kraus, Stonehill College Class of 2006 and a native of Toronto, Ontario, was named the 14th head coach of

the Stonehill men's basketball program in July, 2013. He is the first alumnus to direct the Skyhawks and is the first Canadian-born coach to take the helm of an NCAA men's basketball program.

Kraus, who will be the lone Canadian head coach at the NCAA Division I level as Stonehill begins its second year in transition as a member of the Northeast Conference, has maintained Stonehill's winning tradition over his tenure, leading his alma mater to a 145-119 (.553) record through nine seasons. In the Skyhawks first season in the NEC, Stonehill finished 10-6, coming in a tie for second place in the regular season standings. Kraus was named the NEC's Jim Phelan Coach of the Year Award by the Conference's nine head coaches in the teams first year as a member.

In eight years as a member of the the highly competitive Northeast-10 Conference, Kraus recorded an 87-77 (.531) clip with three NCAA Division II Tournament bids. The Skyhawks captured their third NCAA East Regional Championship in program history in 2016, advancing to the Elite Eight for the third time in the last ten years.

Kraus has played a part in each of the three Elite Eight appearances in Stonehill history, guiding the Skyhawks as a senior point guard in 2006, as an assistant coach under current Dartmouth College mentor David McLaughlin in 2012 and then full circle as a head coach in 2016. He is the only coach in NCAA Division II East Region history to guide a program to a regional title as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

Kraus' student-athletes earned 13 All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, including Will Moreton, '20, a three-time All-NE10 selection, who was named the NE10 Player of the Year following the 2019-20 season. Ryan Logan '17, the 2013-14 NE10 Rookie of the Year and is the first student-athlete under Kraus to collect NABC All-District honors with second team honors as junior and senior. Moreton added NABC All-District first team and D2ADA All-East Region first team honors during his senior year, when he became the program's first All-American in 22

seasons with his spot on the Division II Bulletin fourth team in 2020.

Moreton collected CoSIDA Academic All-District I first team honors, joining Pierce Cumpstone, '16 and Monty Urmilevicius, '21 in earning the recognition under Kraus' leadership. The group also earned NE10 Academic All-Conference honors during his tenure.

Kraus has regularly seen his graduates go on to enjoy professional careers overseas, with Logan now playing in Sweden and Moreton in Spain, the most notable.

Stonehill posted a 19-10 overall record in 2014-15, finishing tied for second in the NE10 Northeast Division standings with a 14-7 mark in Conference play. While the Skyhawks fell to eventual NE10 Tournament champions American International College in the quarterfinal round, Kraus guided the program to its 13th NCAA Tournament appearance, and first since reaching the National Semifinals in 2012.

That season spurred Stonehill entering the 2015-16 campaign that would see the Skyhawks post a 24-9 record overall, including 15-6 in the highly competitive NE10 Northeast Division that would send four teams to the NCAA Tournament. It was the NCAA East Regional in Philadelphia, where the Skyhawks hit their stride, led by senior point guard and future assistant coach Carter Smith, '16 who earned Regional Most Outstanding Player honors. Stonehill won its third regional championship in program history, and a spot in the NCAA II Elite Eight in Frisco, Texas, with a pair of thrilling overtime wins as the Skyhawks knocked off three NE10 divisional rivals on their way to the regional title.

Stonehill has enjoyed a winning season in six of the eight seasons Kraus has been in charge. The Skyhawks posted an 18-11 mark, including 13-6 in the NE10 to finish second in the division, reaching the semifinal round of the NE10 Tournament. Stonehill was again poised for a strong NCAA East Regional run, before the Skyhawks' 15th NCAA Tournament bid was halted before the regional started by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Kraus earned his first career win with a 75-58 triumph over Georgian Court University in his debut as head coach and picked up his first NE10 victory with a 61-56 decision over Assumption College on December 4, 2013. He reached the 100-win plateau with the Skyhawks 78-70 win over Saint Michael's College on November 23, 2019.

Kraus took over the helm at Stonehill after serving as former head coach David McLaughlin's top assistant coach for three seasons. Stonehill averaged 20 wins over those three years, reaching the NCAA Tournament twice, including the 2011-12 season when the Skyhawks posted 25 wins and captured both the NE10 Tournament and NCAA Division II East Regional crown on its way to the national semifinal round at the Elite Eight.



As a student-athlete within the program from 2002-2006, Kraus was a member of the 2005-06 squad that won a program-record 27 games and earned the program's first regional championship and trip to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight in Springfield, Massachusetts. Along with the team's national semifinal round run during his senior season, Kraus earned All-Northeast-10 Conference honors, was named to the NCAA Regional All-Tournament Team and with his play was amongst the nation's leaders in a number of statistical categories. He trained with the Canadian Senior Men's National Team from 2002-2005, and won a silver medal playing for Canada at the World Junior Championships in France in 1999.

After graduating from Stonehill in 2006, Kraus played professionally in England for London United before returning home to begin his coaching career. He was an assistant at Acadia University in Nova Scotia, Canada, where he assisted the team in capturing the AUS Conference championship and a berth in the national tournament. He then spent two seasons as the top assistant at Brandon University in Manitoba, Canada, helping the team earn back-to-back GPAC conference titles.

In addition to his Bachelor of Science degree in business administration from Stonehill, Kraus was admitted to the Faculty of Education program at Brandon University and earned his Master's Degree in athletic administration from Endicott College in 2012.

Kraus and his wife, Ashley, also a 2006 Stonehill graduate and former women's tennis student-athlete, reside in West Bridgewater, Massachusetts, with son, Tanner (4), and daughter, Josephine (2).

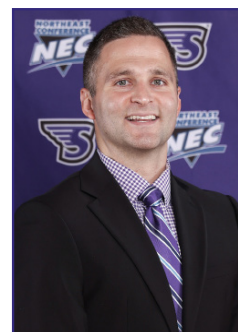
