





ABSN TRACK DETAILS

Regardless of entry option, all ABSN students participate in the same curriculum together:

- 16 months, includes summer term
 - 54-55 credits total
- Graduates eligible to take the RN licensure exam (NCLEX)

SYNCHRONOUS VS. ASYNCHRONOUS

All didactic (lecture-related) content will be online/distance learning.

- Some courses will have a weekly synchronous lecture (all meet remotely at a certain time)
 - lecture times will be made available well ahead of each block
- Other courses will be entirely asynchronous (work completed independently on own time)



TYPICAL WEEK

You should plan to spend about 26-30 hours per week in class and clinical, lab &/or simulation.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS

- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale for second-degree and MedVet applicants; cumulative GPA of 2.5 on 4.0 scale for LPN applicants
- Science GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale for second-degree and MedVet applicants; science GPA of 2.5 on 4.0 scale for LPN applicants.
 - All applicants must have a minimum grade of "C" in each of the following natural science courses :
 - Human Anatomy (three credits)
 - Human Physiology (three credits)
 - General Biology (three credits)
 - General Chemistry course equivalent to CHE 103 at UK or one year/two semesters of General Chemistry
- General Psychology (three credits) or Developmental Psychology equivalent to PSY 223 at UK with a minimum grade of "C"
- Composition and Communication courses equivalent to CIS 110 and 111 or CIS 112 at UK with a minimum grade of "C"



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS (CONT.)

The following courses are <u>not required for admission</u> to the program, <u>but must be completed before</u> an applicant's <u>first semester</u> of nursing:

- General Microbiology course equivalent to BIO 208 at UK with a minimum grade of "C"
- Nutrition course equivalent to DHN 212 at UK with a minimum grade of "C"
- Statistics course equivalent to STA 210, STA 296, or BST 230 at UK with minimum grade of "C"

Please note: Repeated grades are averaged together; we do not use only the best grade for courses that have been repeated



STATE REGISTERED NURSING ASSISTANT

- Second Degree applicants must complete a SRNA course prior to taking their first nursing course in the program
- LPN applicants are not required to do this by virtue of their license
- MedVet applicants have two options: Take a SRNA course OR complete a skills check with nursing faculty

Additional requirements are dependent on the applicant's background...





LPN-BSN Applicants

- Completion of LPN from a regionally accredited institution and a current active license to practice
- Completion of all UK Core requirements





MED-VET APPLICANTS



- Completion of Army Medical Specialist (68W), Navy Corpsman or Air Force Medical Specialist training
- Completion of all UK Core requirements
- Review of JST and CLEP for academic transfer credit with UK's Veterans Resource Center and the Transfer Equivalency Office

SECOND DEGREE APPLICANTS

- Completion of a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree
- Completion of all UK Core requirements; *Seconddegree students meet this requirement by virtue of the first degree

HOW TO APPLY

Currently enrolled at UK for Spring 2022:

You must apply to the ABSN track through an online application that will be available January 10 - March 1, 2022. (Link currently posted uky.edu/nursing)

Currently NOT enrolled at UK:

All transfer and readmit applicants must apply to the ABSN track through the University of Kentucky Office of Admissions. If you are new to UK, select "Transfer Admission" application. If you are returning to UK, select "Readmission" application.

To apply for Fall 2022, go to admission.uky.edu/apply.

To begin the program in Fall 2022

Application is currently open!
 Deadline is March 1, 2022

To begin the program in Spring 2023

• Deadline is August 15, 2022



AFTER YOU APPLY

- Applicants will receive an email invitation to complete the interview after their initial screening for course and GPA requirements.
 - Interviews are conducted via an online platform.
 - Please note: Applicants not selected for an interview will also be notified that they will not be considered further.
- Final decisions will be sent via email.





COST OF ATTENDANCE

- Tuition: \$582.00 per credit hour
- Nursing Fee: \$614.00 per semester
- Book package: ~\$2,000 (cost split over 2 semesters and charged on myUK)
 - Includes books, reviews, etc.
- Out-of-pocket expenses: Scrubs, supplies, etc.
