Hollie Raynor, PhD, RD, LDN: Hollie is the Executive Associate Dean of Research and Operations in the College of Education, Health, and Human Sciences at the University of Tennessee. She holds a MS in Public Health Nutrition and a PhD in Clinical Psychology. She conducts lifestyle intervention research in pediatric/adult obesity care, has published >150 peer-reviewed articles, and has received funding from the National Institutes of Health and others. She served as a member of several guideline development committees for obesity care (American Psychological Association, Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics) and was a member of the Dietary Guidelines Advisory Committee.



Michelle Shippy, MS, RDN: Michelle is a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN) who has worked in public health nutrition for over 16 years. Her current role is the Food is Medicine Director at the Indiana Department of Health's Division of Nutrition and Physical Activity. Michelle is a subject matter expert in food is medicine program management and implementation including securing grants, creating and executing project work plans, braiding and weaving diverse funding streams, and evaluation and quality improvement. Sustaining authentic relationships and good communication is her foundation in creating better policies and systems for access to nutritious food.



Dr. Wen You: Dr. Wen You is a health economist and applied econometrician, serving as a Professor in the Department of Public Health Sciences at the University of Virginia, where she also directs the Population Health and Cancer Outcomes Core at the UVA Comprehensive Cancer Center. Her research focuses on addressing health disparities through the integration of economics and other disciplines, with extensive expertise in randomized control trials (designs and analysis), economic program evaluation, and incentive design, contributing to over 100 peer–reviewed publications and over 20 multiple interdisciplinary projects funded by organizations such as NIH, ACS, USDA and PCORI.

Automatic Milking Systems: Labor-Savings Route or Costly Gamble for Dairy Farmers?

Alejandro Gutiérrez-Li, Grace Melo, Shaheer Burney, Cesar Escalante, and Shree Ram Acharya Automatic milking systems (AMS) can greatly impact labor dynamics on U.S. dairy farms. Survey results reveal that AMS adopters require fewer full-time workers, rely more on part-time labor, and face higher wages, highlighting labor cost variability and adoption barriers. Our findings have implications for policies addressing labor shortages and supporting mechanization.

AAEA at 2026 ASSA Annual Meeting

Call for submissions: AAEA invited paper sessions at the 2026 ASSA Annual Meeting

President-Elect Brian Roe is soliciting proposals and suggestions for AAEA invited paper sessions at the 2026 Allied Social Sciences Association (ASSA) Annual Meeting in Philadelphia, PA, January 3-5, 2026.

The objective of AAEA sessions at the ASSA Annual Meeting is to share new knowledge of interest to economists. The AAEA encourages sessions that will draw widely from ASSA attendees, including sessions jointly sponsored with other ASSA member associations.

A subcommittee of the AAEA Board will review all proposals. Preference will be given to proposals that

- 1. Cover issues of national and international importance,
- 2. Expand capabilities and tools for economic research,
- 3. Promise a high-quality collection of papers suitable for publication.

Papers in approved Invited Paper sessions are eligible to be peer reviewed for publication in the proceedings issue of the *Applied Economic Perspectives and Policies*. Authors will be contacted by the *AEPP* editors with manuscript submission details.

Proposed formats for the 2-hour sessions may include either three papers with one discussant or else four papers with no discussant. All proposals must include a plan for fostering participant interaction.

Proposals should include the session title and paper titles, as well as the names, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses of the session organizer, moderator, paper presenters, and discussants. Proposal text should begin with a short justification of the session, followed by one paragraph abstracts describing the objective and contributions of each paper. The organizer is responsible for ensuring that all individuals identified in the proposal are willing to participate.

All speakers and discussants must be members of AAEA, although the proposal may request a membership waiver under special circumstances. Participants must register for the ASSA meeting.

Agricultural History Society Award for Public Engagement

The Award Winner(s) will demonstrate:

- Depth of historical understanding and the ability to communicate historical context to non-specialists while preserving essential details and complexity
- Creativity in approach appropriate to the intended audience
- Evidence of effectiveness appropriate to the activity
- If the nomination is for a body of work, evidence of professionalism and leadership in promoting public engagement in the fields of agricultural and rural history

The application package, prepared as a single PDF file, 12-point font, 1-inch margins, will include:

- Nominator's letter (not to exceed 750 words) self-nominations encouraged. The letter should describe the nature of the work undertaken, evidence of public engagement, and the work's distinctive contribution to furthering public understanding of agricultural and /rural history
- CV of applicant, limited to 2 pages (single spaced).
- Additional supporting materials (limited to 2 pages), which may include webpage links, photographs of
 exhibitions or public programs, record of engagement with farmers or rural communities, archival
 collection/oral history repository created, historic structure reports, policy publications, etc.
