Dear Mr. Tucker,

The National Archives and Records Administration is in receipt of an email from your agency dated January 3, 2022, that documents an allegation of unauthorized disposition of legal documents received by your agency from ICE contractors.

In accordance with 36 C.F. R. 1230.14(a), NARA requests that ICE respond within 30 calendar days to these allegations. If it is determined that an unauthorized disposition of records has occurred, the response should include the following information:

- A complete description of the records with volume and dates if known;
- The office maintaining the records;
- A statement of the exact circumstances surrounding the removal, defacing, alteration, or destruction of records;
- A statement of the safeguards established to prevent further loss of documentation; and
- Details of the actions taken to salvage, retrieve, or reconstruct the records.

If it is determined that there has been no unauthorized disposition, please provide us with sufficient documentation to support that finding.
