### EXAMPLE PROJECT

In FY2023, EDA awarded **\$1,712,580 in Public Works funds to support the Ozarks Technical Community College** with constructing a new workforce training facility on the Richwood Valley Campus in Christian County, Missouri. The training facility will provide space to expand the college's current agricultural industry training program and provide dedicated instructional space for an expanded lineworker training program. The project will help trained workers from this program be placed in high quality jobs and increase economic opportunities for the community.
