FORM AN ACTION TEAM



AUTHENTICALLY ENGAGE THE COMMUNITY



While the Framework is outlined in a linear manner, we recognize that all schools are unique, and will come into the framework in different ways. For example, some schools have strong community connections and have already formed an action team and are ready to jump into the development of their action plan.



1. FORM AN ACTION TEAM

Create a student-led committee with diverse abilities and perspectives to drive environmental-based education and actions for the school community.



2. AUTHENTICALLY ENGAGE THE COMMUNITY Foster genuine connections and share transformative stories from working at the nexus of environment, community, and economy.



3. DEVELOP AN ACTION PLAN

Annually create an action plan that aligns with the committee's values, focusing on nature-based solutions for the community's health and wellbeing.



4. TAKE ACTION, COLLECT DATA, MEASURE IMPACT, AND SHARE STORIES Explore community and nature-based solutions for the team's action plan, measure the school's impact, and share accessible, fact-based stories to raise awareness and promote collaboration.



5. MONITOR AND EVALUATE PROGRESS

Collect data before and after taking action to evaluate how well the plan is working and keep the school community informed about the progress and results.



6. IDENTIFY CURRICULUM CONNECTIONS

The team's nature and community-based actions will connect to what students are learning in classrooms.



7. CELEBRATE, REFLECT, AND CREATE AN ECOCODE

Celebrate successes big and small, reflect on how to improve for the future, and creatively display the school's commitment to nature-based solutions in an EcoCode.
